



Pope Paul completed the outline of his program with the assurance he would support the policies of social justice outlined by his predecessors. The prepared message in Latin, less than 24 hours after his election as 262nd supreme pontiff of the world's half billion Roman Catholics, was in effect a keynote speech. The pontiff spoke as jubilant Catholics made ready for his inauguration June 30 in Christendom's most brilliant ceremony.

The papal speech was broadcast from the Sistine Chapel where the Sacred College of Cardinals Friday elected Glovanni Battista Montini, 65-year-old archbishop of Milan, as the new Pope.

"The pre-eminent part of our pontificate will be occupied with the continuation of the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, on which the eyes of all men of goodwill are focused," Pope Paul sald.
