





### Bolton Senteio Declines Post As School Principal

At the meeting of the board of education last night it was made known that Vice Principal John Senteio had been approved in executive session recently for the position of principal of the elementary school. However, the board was told Senteio regrets that he will not be able to accept the offer.

It was therefore decided to advertise for candidates. According to Supt. Liguori five persons have shown an interest in the position already. Although it was moved to establish a salary of \$8-9,000 depending on experience and qualifications, it was not voted on. Other business discussed during the evening included the terms of the leasing agreement for trailer classrooms. These leases must be approved by Town Council and signed by Supt. Liguori before being returned to the company leasing the trailers.

Senteio and Mrs. R. Roworth presented the report of the administrative council. The best change in the program, they said, was the five-year policy in textbooks beginning this year. The new reading program has greatly stimulated reading in the library. Also the library was able to extend its services to Grade 1. However, the encyclopedias need to be brought up to date and Mrs. Roworth thought a policy in regard to this would be helpful.

Math and reading workshops were helpful to the teachers. It was reported. Colleges which had placed student teachers in the Bolton system reported they were pleased with what the student teachers had learned here during the year. There were five teachers taking courses during the year: Margaret Anderson, Elizabeth Potter, John Fairbro, William Maher, and John O'Rourke. Supt. Liguori remarked that staff morale and cooperation is exceptionally good. He extended his personal commendation to the staff.

Some changes in the marking system were suggested and an open discussion was held with a few parents who wanted a clarification of the basis on which grades are figured and how these may be interpreted by teachers and parents according to uniform standards. In summary Supt. Liguori said any system needs constant evaluation and revision to be improved.

In other business Supt. Liguori said he feels there is a need for four sessions of kindergarten this coming year, morning and afternoon sessions at both the Methodist and Congregational churches. Proposed budget drafts were passed out to board members to be studied before the board meeting tomorrow night.

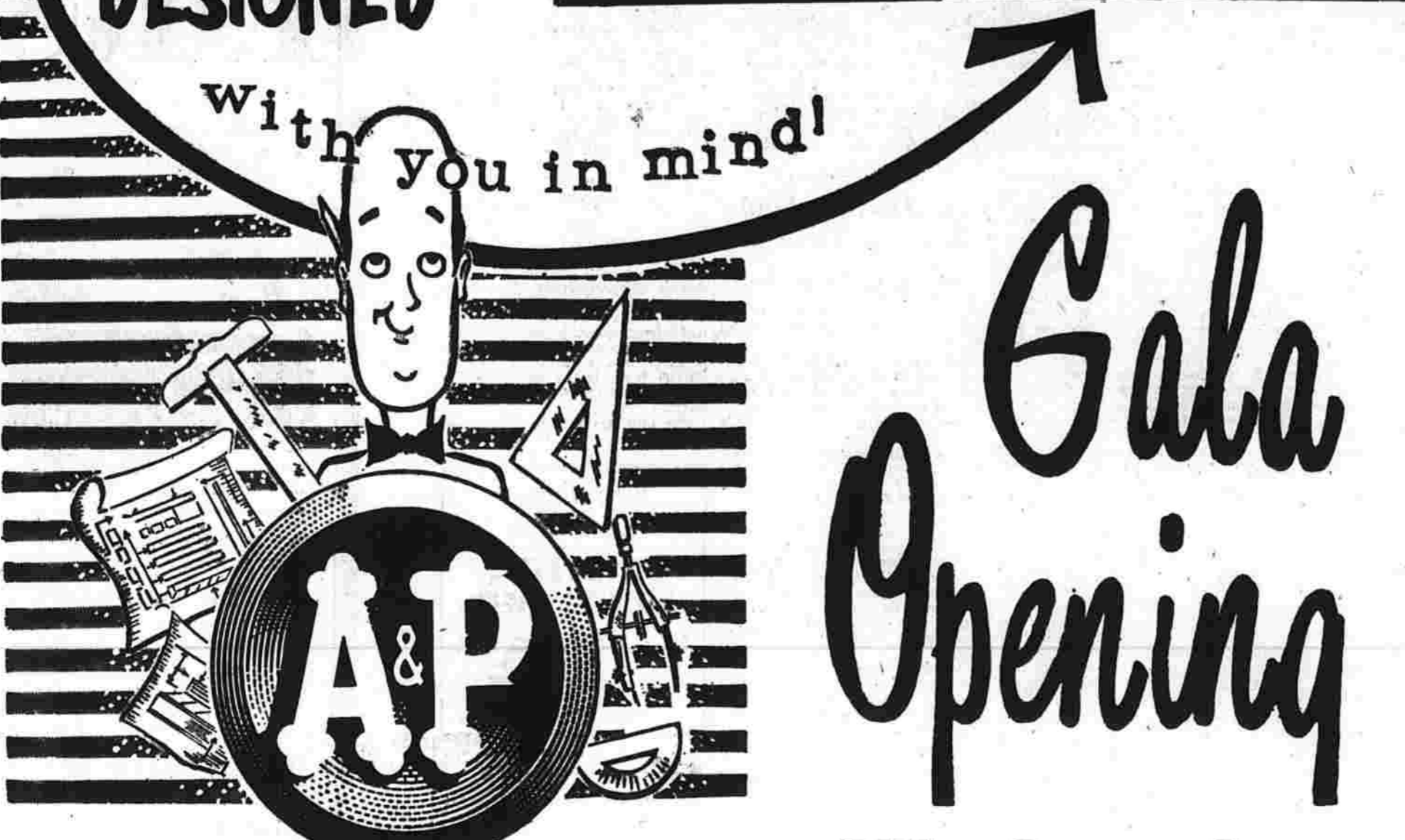

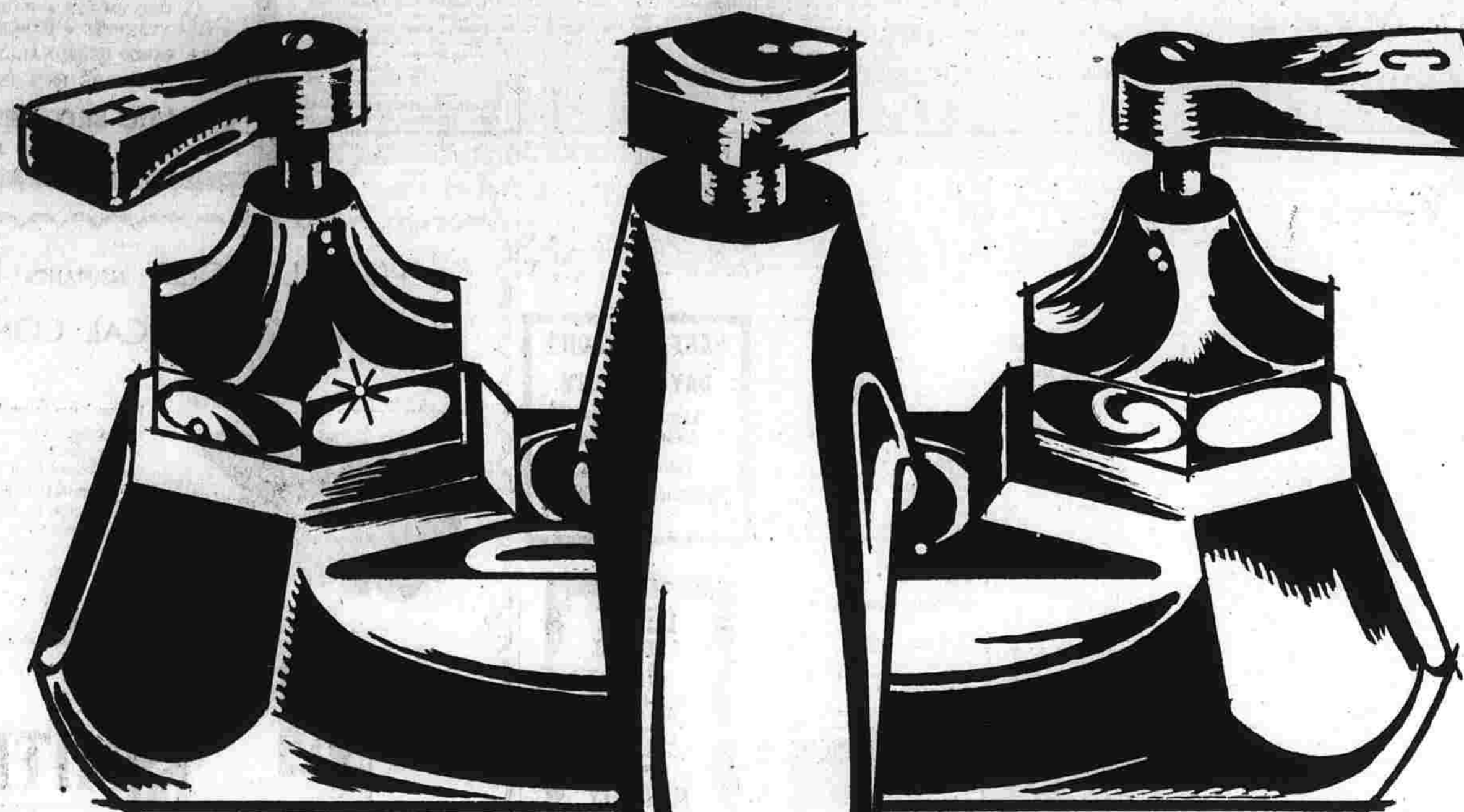

The announcement of Khrushchev's trip to East Germany is a surprise, since he had been expected to visit only Moscow and Berlin. 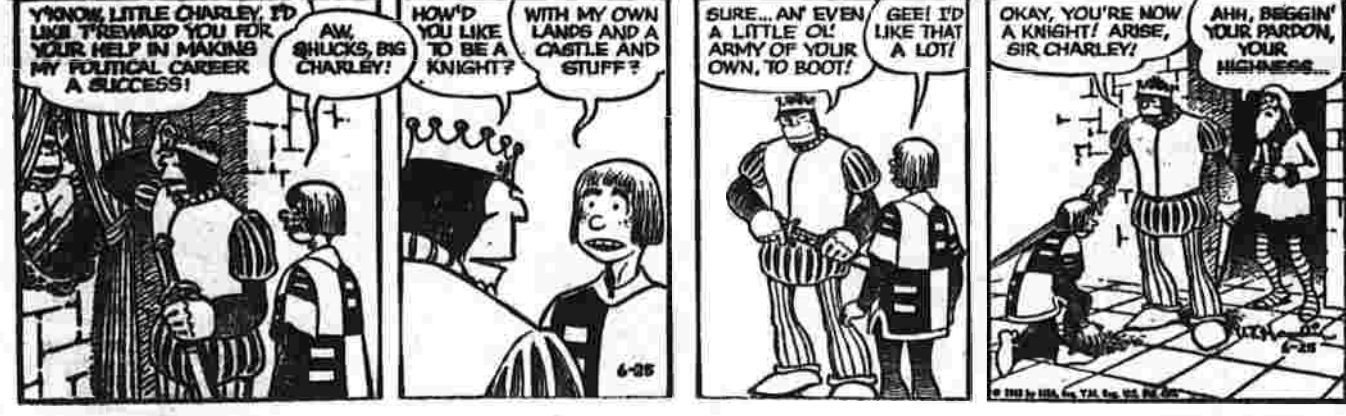

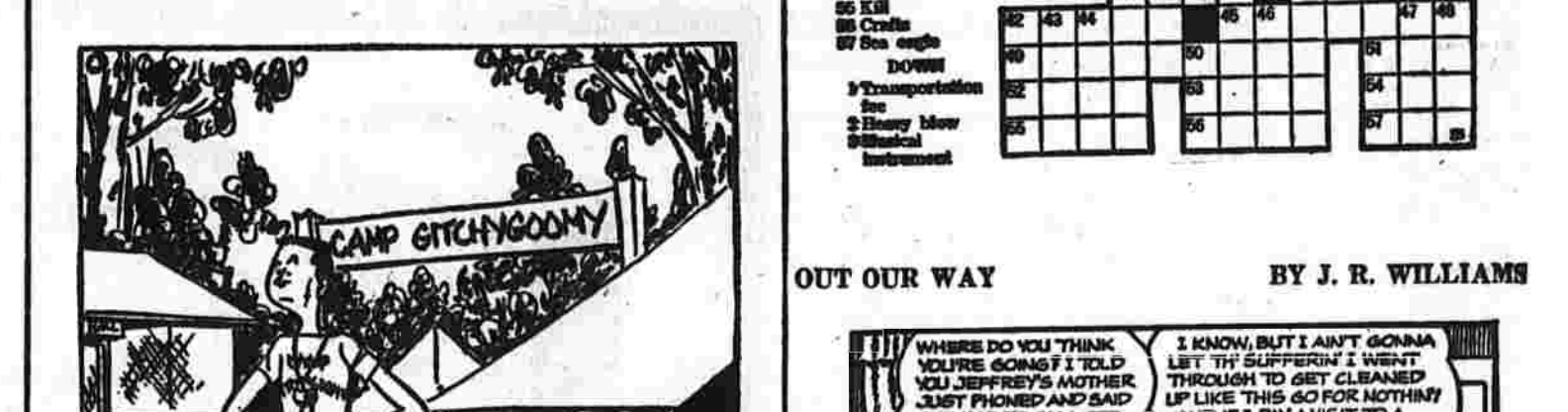

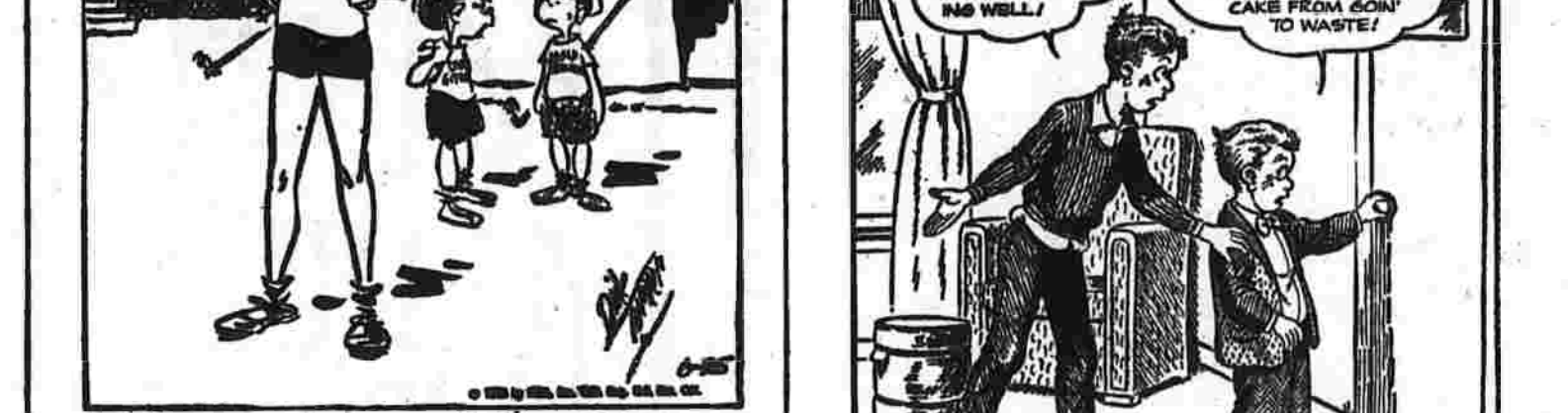
