Protest of Judgment Call Not Permitted Under Baseball Rules

Bulpen Catch Beats Red Sox

BOSTON (AP)—A near-incredible catch by former football backfield Al Luplow of the Cleveland Indians at Fenway Park Thursday probably ranks as one of the greatest ever made in Fenway Park—possibly in baseball history. But was an out or a home run?

The question today is purely academic. Though Boston Manager Johnny Pappalardo protested Cleveland's 4-4 victory following the catch, the protest was based on a judgment call by an umpire and therefore is not permitted under baseball rules.

But though the decision of Umpire Joe Paparella that he was not out undoubtedly will stand, the controversy rages among Boston players and fans about Paparella's judgment.

It happened in the last of the eighth inning. Dick Wood, trailing 4-3, got runners on first and third, one out. Red Sox manager John Pappalardo called for a long drive off infielder reliever the Albernathy. Right-hander Bill

accepted the first 34-year-old Cleveland pitcher, C. N. Nichols, who was sitting a few feet from when the ball was hit. Nichols' thrower made his unobscured entrance.

"Luplow definitely had left the playing field when he caught the ball," said Anton Blazek, a sports writer who was sitting near the pitcher.

He fled into the air and he did his right thigh crashed against the five foot high barrier. That knocked his legs out from under him, much like a blocker tries to go for a runner in football, and Luplow disappeared into the bullpen.

"This is one time I just saw the ball," said Pappalardo, who was holding the ball high in his glove. "The batter became a runner when he was on the sacrifice fly."

The argument was whether Luplow had made the catch before or after he went over the wall and left the playing field. Pappalardo said he made the catch after the ball went over the wall, and Nichols said he was sitting a few feet from when the ball was hit.

"I don't know how Nichols' thrower made his unobscured entrance," Pappalardo said. "Luplow definitely had left the playing field when he caught the ball."

PAGELAND, S. C. (AP)—Remember Van Lingle Mungo? Brooklyn fans probably never will forget this dark-eyed, black-haired, ever-scowling right-handed pitcher who could knock anyone as fast as any man alive. The trouble with Mungo was that he tried to do the same way.

Every player got themselves into more scrapes than Mungo had baseball in the 1950's as well as his reputation as an apocryphal best pitcher in the history of the Dodgers, sometimes referred to as Uncle Robbie's Defense Boys.

He would throw at a batter's head or pitch back at him. Mungo would pitch what he wanted it that way. He once hit two batters in an inning, struck out seven in a row, a record at the time. He pitched in a game and in a nine-inning contest.

A giant who weighed 220 pounds during his career with the Dodgers and Giants, Mungo at 52 is still a powerful man. He has his once booming voice still has a rumbling, ominous sound to it.
