Modern Age **Mottoes** Are Wry, Uneasy

NEW YORK (AP)—The robust wisdom of a people is expressed in folk sayings—in proverbs and motions. mottoes.
"Know thyself," counseled the ancient Greeks, and thereby said Since then we have become a great deal more verbose.

Through most of human history, folk wisdom has been expressed in direct sayings and forthright advice.

Thus said Benjamin Franklin, an American wellspring of this form of knowledge:

"Penny wise, pound footish."

"If a man could have half his wishes, he would double his troubles."

"He that teaches himself heth a fool for a master."

"Love your neighbor, but don't pull down your hedge."

"If you would know the value of money, try to borrow some."

Sometimes the advice is contradictory, as is demonstrated by the old English proverbs, "Look before you leap," and "He who hesitates is lost."

As recently as a generation ago, children learned to write by scribbing over and over again the uneasy and disturbing copybook maxim; "What you are to be you are now becoming."

maxim; "What you are to be you are now becoming."

Many a living room then bloomed with samplers that said, "God Blass Our Happy Home." Simpler times were exampled by simpler sayings.

Now we live in a complex and cor fusing time, and our folk wisdom is expressed in complex sayings with a reverse twist. Our mottoes have become as schizophrenic as our thoughts, and reflect the double talk that has become our normal language. eome our normal language. We communicate by speaking backwards.

Go into any office or factory in the land and you'll see on wall and desk the clouded counsel of our day. I have at hand a small book of these sad wittleisms enti-tled "Signs of Our Times."

Here are a few examples of what the book calls "the choices most hilarious contemporary signs "If you don't understand it, op-"It's better to give than to re-

ceive, so what have you brought "There's no reason for it-it's just our policy."
"You can fool some of the peo-ple some of the time—and that's usually good enough."
"The difficult we do promptly. The simple is beyond our com-prehension."
"Look alive. Remember you ean be replaced by a button."
"I'd like to help you out. Which way did you come in?"
"If I weren't so busy, I'd take time off to join in the confusion."

That seems to be the key word to our attitude today—confusion. Such mixed-up counsels of despair we give each other, and spair we give each other, and seek thereby a consolation more wry than ribald.

If a people can be judged by their mottoes, then we dwell in a time of hollow laughter that echoes an inner despair.

Sanders for Georgia Jail Improvement

By O. P. HANES ATLANTA, Ga. (AP)-"It is not ight to shut a man like a mad log in a cage, whip him with a subber hose and work him as a rubber hose and work min a brutal drayman might work sick horse."
Georgia has come a long way along the road to reforms since former Gov. Ellis Arnall, then 35, in September 1943 gave a special session of the legislature that de-scription of conditions in the state prison system. The chains, the caging in sweat-boxes, the whipping and sadistic brutality by guards officially are

no more.
"The function of a prison system," arnall said, "is to rehabilitem," arnall said, "is to rehabilitem," tate and provide iseful training for the inmates."

A nationally known penologist, pressed into service by Gov. Carl E Sanders, again has reported that there virtually is no rehabilitation or education for the 10,000 convicts in Georgia.


Sanders, 38, moved quickly after receiving the service in Jenny Jen er receiving the report from Jo-seph E. Ragen, director of the Il-linois penal system and for many years warden of Joliet, Ill., penitentiary.

A shakeup in the State Department of Corrections shunted the \$17,600-a-year director to a minor job in state government. His chief assistant plans to retire. Sanders dug into the state sur-plus to make \$2.5 million available prison reform. He will ask the 1964 legislature to appropriate mil-lions more. He hired Fred Hallord, a retired Federal Bureau o Investigation official with 23 years service, as prison chief. The prison situation has raged off and on as a controversy for more than 30 years. In 1931 Robert Elliott Burns wrote a book, "I Am a Fugitive From a Georgia Chain Gang" which was made into a movie the accompanied a flophouse acquain-tance to the robbery of a grocery

Gov. Eugene Talmadege, called Burns' story untrue. But in 1937, Gov. E. D. Rivers ordered chain Arnall went further shortly aftr becoming governor in January 1943.
