

Fourth Called 'Ringin' Event'

From all reports, Manchester's holiday was a resounding success. The weather was ideal, the fireworks were reasonably good, and most of all, the police charts recorded an accident-free Fourth with "no unusual occurrences."

The day began under a bright sky, but by 10:30 a.m. heavy clouds parading in stately procession, threatened the summer morning punctuated only now and then by the crack of an occasional firecracker or cap pistol.

Cuba Lacking Doctor, Intern at MMH Says

A former Cuban resident, who began a one-year rotating internship at Manchester Memorial Hospital this week, said today Cuba is facing a doctor shortage and an acute shortage of medical supplies. To offset the number of doctors who have left the island, Castro's government has shortened the period of medical study and training from seven years to four, he stated.

Dr. Robert Flakoff, who left Cuba last October after a 13-month wait for a permit, believes some 1300 doctors left the island during 1962. "I think they would all have left if they could," he said. "They do not agree with the government and find it difficult to give the proper attention to their patients."

Professional and personal reasons are playing a part in encouraging doctors to leave, though they have relatively few freedoms there, he said.

The shortage in needed medical supplies is a result of the U.S. government's official break with Castro's Cuba. Medicine is now being shipped from Russia, Rumania, Hungary, and Czechoslovakia. But a big shortage remains in antibiotics and biological drugs, Dr. Flakoff said.

While doctors formerly served in a hospital only for half a day and then tended to their private practices, they are now working a full 8-hour day in the government-controlled private practice. Hospitals were formerly government controlled, semi-private or private, but are now completely under the control of the state. Castro has increased the

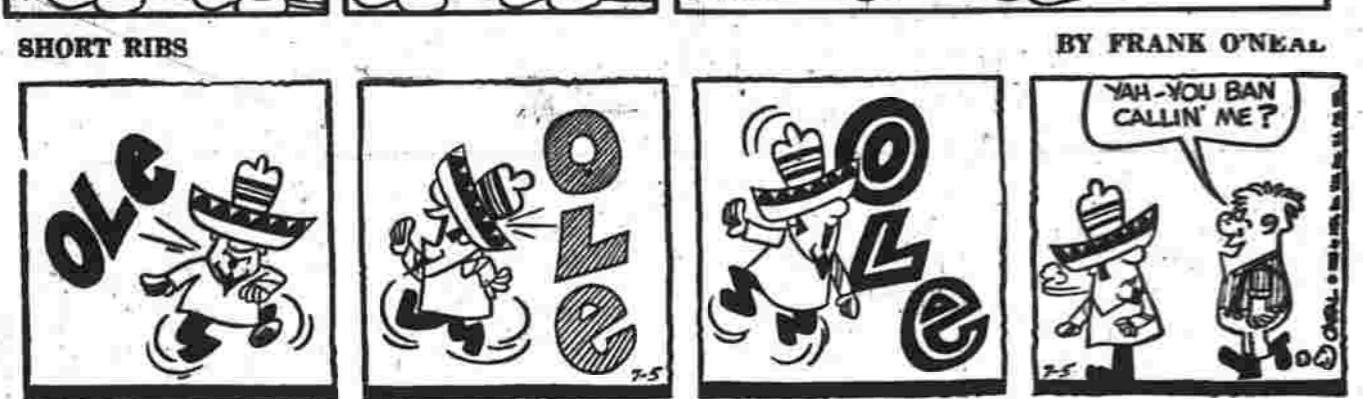

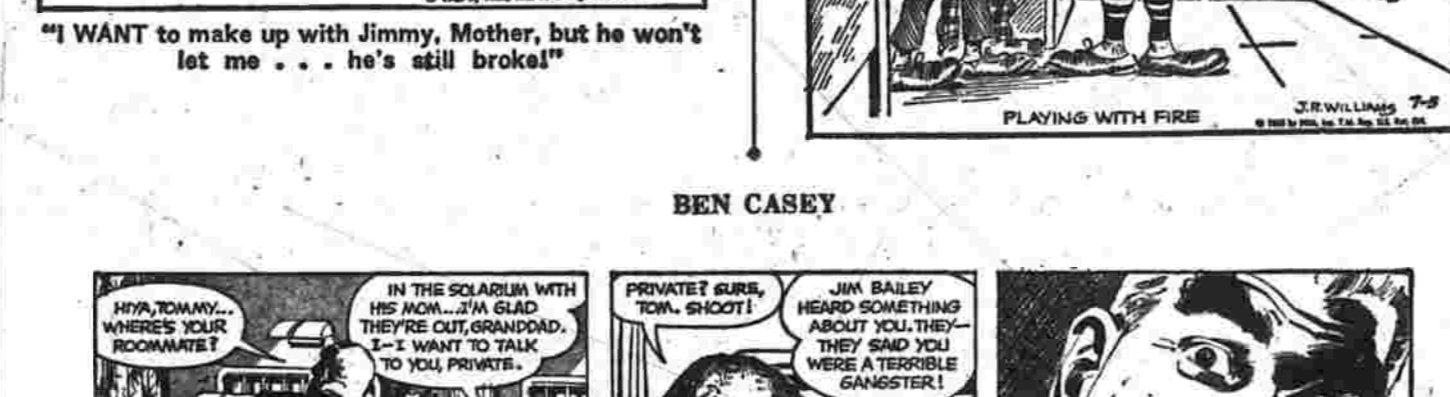
