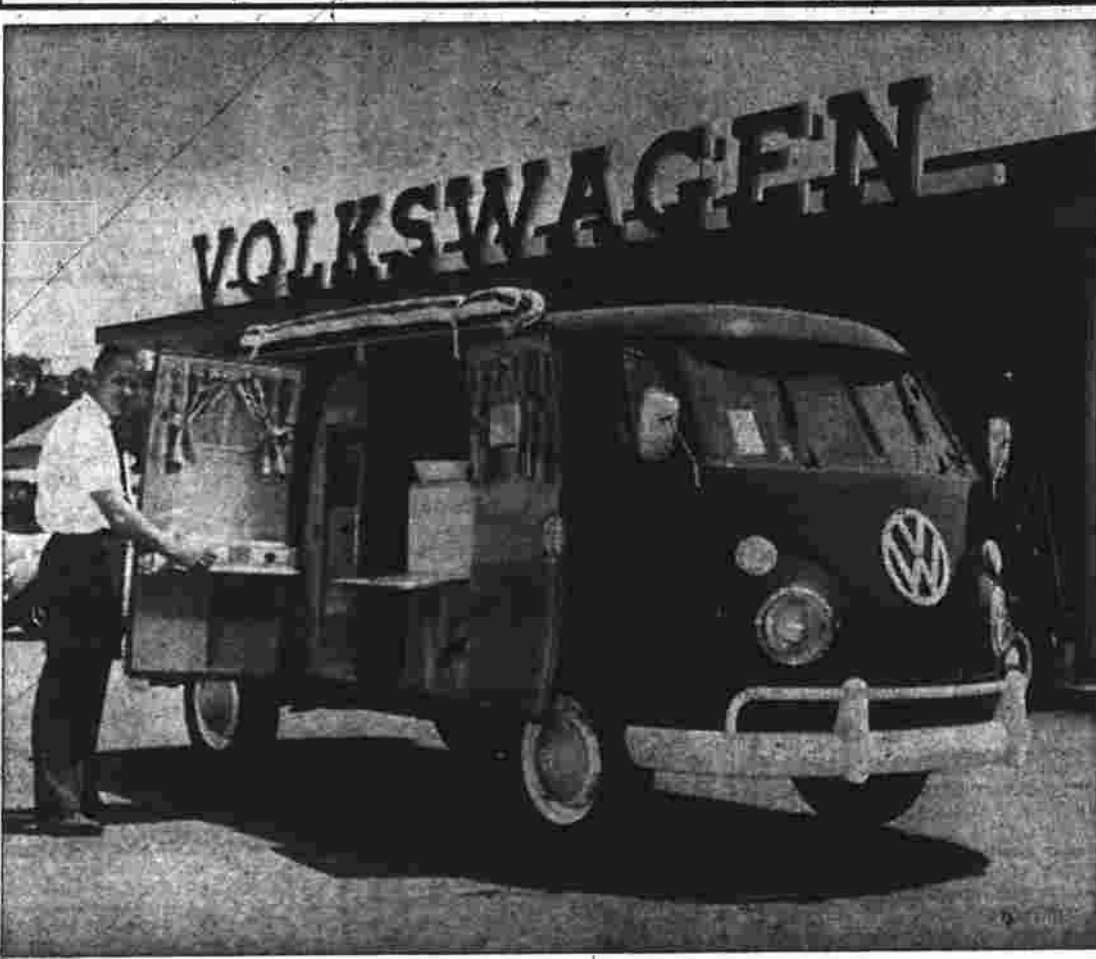

New Series Grounds Jose The Astronaut

New filming in Hollywood for NBC's Sunday night fall lineup is the "Bill Dana Show" which—quite probably—will center on the doings of Jose Jimenez, the wistful Latin-American who a fair share of the time outwits the wily and much of the time charms just about everybody.

Jose, created accidentally for a one-shot gag when Bill Dana was a writer on the old Steve Allen Show, has risen to unbelievable heights in comedy, becoming, among other things, the astronaut's favorite astronaut.

That "OK Jose" comment that first U.S. Spaceman Alan Shepard tossed into the intercom just before the first U.S. man shot was inspired by none other than Jimenez. In fact, Shepard had the "Jose the Astronaut" album piped to him while waiting for blastoff on that historic morning. And not only is Jose their official mascot, but Bill has become a personal friend not only of the original Mercury-7 group but of the second group as well. He thinks just about one of the nicest things ever to hit his ears was the comment of one of them, who said, "You were my idol before I even dreamed of joining the space program."

Jose is coming down to earth for the new NBC series, but he is in a spot where just about everything on earth could happen to him.... he's a bellhop in a luxury hotel (plenty of room for celebrity guests as well as everyday dilemmas). Of the hotel, Bill Dana—in his greater-writer guise—says, "It's so complete that if it had a cemetery on the roof you'd never have to leave the place."

In an age when the baby seat of get thrown out with the wash water when it comes to dialect comedy, Jose is a modern miracle. Nobody's yelling "stereotype." Instead, he's being commended widely (including by Latin American groups) as an example of good taste.

His national origin, though, is impossible to pin down exactly. Even Bill Dana—who should know if anybody does—pondered, and came up with no clear answer.

Bill himself is cooler, and even more fascinating to trace down. His interview was conducted in his penthouse suite in New York's Hampshire House (a luxury hotel but smallish). Bill was perfectly

willing to trace back and see what had led him to becoming what has more than once been characterized as "today's Chaplin." Bill says he's flattered by the comparison but that there are strong differences between the basically tragic Chaplin tramp and the wistful Jose. Though Jose can be touching (witness his famous "mail call" episode, also on an album), Jose is upbeat. He has, and causes, plenty of tribulations and complications, but it's his nature to triumph.

Bill was born in Quincy, Mass., one of the five sons of Joseph and Dana Szathmary. Bill traded in the Hungarian family name for a variation of his mother's given name when he went into show business.

The brothers have done pretty well for themselves, too. Arthur ("the genius of the family") is a professor of philosophy at Princeton University. Two of the brothers are in music, Sidney being a concert violinist and Irving being musical director for some of the Danny Thomas productions (of which the "Bill Dana Show" is the newest). Al is a rancher who also has a hand in the construction business.

Bill kids around so much, you can't always be sure it's gospel he's telling you, but the way he recalls it he was just a so-so student through high school.

It's on the record from there, though, that when he came back from his World War II military service he completed his studies at Emerson College in three years and was graduated with honors. His proud alma mater, incidentally, has since conferred an honorary degree on him.

After college Bill and his show business hopes migrated to California where he found himself "doing everything from selling Good Humors to working at Douglas Aircraft" until an Emerson College buddy, Gene Wood, wrote him to take the bus back to New York, and that the royal road started on the pages' staff of NBC. Fortunately, Bill took him seriously. When they weren't working as pages, Dana and Wood wrote a comedy hit, were auditioned the day after it was completed and went to work on a show called "Date in Manhattan."

They were off and running, "actually breaking in material on such live television programs as the Kate Smith Show, the Milton Berle Show," and many others. After a tandem go at top supper clubs, the act broke up and both went back to writing: Gene to "Captain Kangaroo" and Bill as writer for comedian Don Adams. Adams was a frequent Steve Allen guest and Steve got to admire the content as much as the delivery of Adams' act and snared Bill for his own writing staff.

Jose popped into being when "we were kicking around a Santa Claus idea and I said that in Spanish 'j' sounds like 'h' and we thought of a bit where Santa said 'jo, jo'. While we looked around for somebody to do it on the air,

Steve fingered me." It's been the big supper clubs, and appearances with such straight men as Garry Moore, Ed Sullivan, Jack Paar, and six big selling comedy albums, and success, success, success, ever since.

How can Bill both write and perform in the new series? He says, "Though I guard the appellation of writer jealously, aside from a hand in the early scripts my part will have to be pretty much advisory. There's a whole staff and a head writer." (I think Dana being himself looked almost as wistful as when he's being Jose.)

"Think of all the money you and Jose are to make," I tossed

in. That's when I found out Bill is as good a Jose fan as the best of them. After making it clear he certainly won't be going broke and having to mortgage the bachelor house "high in the hills over Sunset Boulevard," Bill explained, "Actually I won't be making as much money the first year as I would with concerts and guest spots. I'm even afraid I may not be able to work in another album." However, I guess one could say of Bill what he says of Jose, "He always triumphs." Furthermore, this year's Danny Thomas productions copped a shelf full of Emmy Awards, and that gives a fellow hope.

Danny Kaye Guest At Moscow Event

Danny Kaye has accepted the invitation—officially transmitted through the U.S. State Department—to be an honored guest of the third Moscow International Film Festival which begins July 7 and ends July 21.

Before departing, Kaye met in Washington with Edmund R. Murrow, United States Information Agency director, and George Stevens Jr., head of USIA's International Motion Picture Service, chairman of the U.S. delegation to the festival.

Kaye, who's become known as Ambassador-at-Large for UNICEF (Fund), went to the USSR a week early to tour children's orphanages, clinics and schools, as he has done all over the world. Language has never been a barrier between Danny Kaye and children. As proven in a documentary of his early worldwide visits to children (The Secret Life of Danny Kaye by CBS), they catch his sense of comedy regardless of words, and loud laughter is their standard reaction to his antics.

TV Personalities

Piers Anderton

Five years ago, most Germans spoke English in addition to their native tongue, says Piers Anderton, NCC News correspondent in Bonn. But now, most Germans speak only German, a symptom, Anderton feels, "of a Germany which no longer caters to its conquerors."

Instead, under a treaty of Franco-German cooperation, Anderton says French will soon be taught in all West German schools and German in French schools.

The demise of English spoken in West German circles will not handicap Anderton, who also speaks German. Anderton has been NBC News' correspondent in both Bonn and West Berlin since the summer of 1961.

Anderton's news career spans 25 years. Fresh out of Princeton University, he joined the San Francisco Chronicle in 1938. For the following 15 years he worked at various posts for the newspaper. He was telegraph editor in 1954 when he left to attend Harvard on a Nieman Fellowship. He studied history.

A year later he joined Collier's magazine as an associate editor. When the magazine ceased publication in 1957, Anderton joined NBC News. One of his first assignments was as writer for the

Chot Hestley news unit which produced the latter program when he undertook the Bonn assignment in May 1961.

Three months after he had arrived in Germany, the Communist constructed the Berlin Wall and Anderson found himself in the midst of one of the biggest European news breaks in years.

While the East Germans were building the Wall, Anderson was arrested while wandering about East Berlin. He was detained for several hours, then released.

The Wall was to play an important role in his career. The spring after the Wall was completed, Anderson came into contact with three young West Berlin students who were digging a tunnel under the Wall into East Berlin.

Under closest security, Anderson arranged to film the digging and the subsequent escape of 59 refugees from East Germany. The film was edited into a 90-minute documentary called "The Tunnel." The program was telecast over NBC-TV in December 1962, and later nominated for an Emmy Award as "Program of the Year."

Anderson also took part in a trans-Atlantic telecast communications satellite transmission in July 1962, that provided many American viewers with their first view of the Berlin Wall.

Anderson's news and feature films have won him four Emmys on NBC-TV. He is currently in San Francisco, Anderson was for four years a Naval intelligence and operations officer during World War II.

Anderson says his first name, "Pete," is a derivative of an Irish family name on his mother's side. "It was originally 'Pete' and how I got 'Pete' I don't know."

Anderson's wife, Bernita, is Swedish. Anderson has six children: Peter, 20, Christopher, 19, Douglas, 18, Mary, 16, John, 14, and Joan, 9.
