



### Coverity Board Weighs School Budget Of \$846,736

Requests totaling \$846,736 or an increase of \$112,500 over last year's budget, have been proposed by school administrators to the board of education.

The board at its meeting Tuesday night at Country High School will study the requests in an effort to determine if the proposed budget can be reduced. Board Chairman Alvin Heckler said.

The main increase of \$72,474 is a request for an extra 10 teachers at the high school in addition to the 25 already on the staff. The figure of 10 includes a new art teacher for the elementary school, as well as salary increases for teachers, principals and the superintendent. The total salary figure proposed is \$27,424, as compared to \$44,148 last year.

The next large increase of \$33,881 is the capital outlay for

\$12,000 and teaching supplies in excess of \$2,000 in total proposed figure of \$28,000.

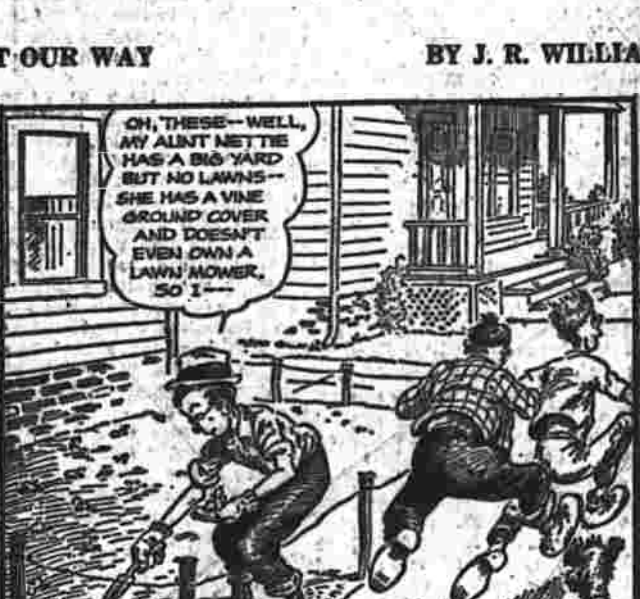
