The British government said the
defector, a senior Soviet intelligence officer, was turned over to
Britain after weeks of interrogation by the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency in Washington. The
British said he was as important
as any defector in either side
since World War II.

His identity was kept secret. Offleials said he is being held at a
secret headquarters in Britain for
fear the Soviets might try to kidnap or kill him.

"His life is in positive danger,"
one official said.
