





Tax Cut Talk Stirs Hopes Of Investors

By SAM DAWSON AP Business News Analyst NEW YORK (AP)—Corporaprospect of a tax cut can stir hope and wishful planning in their breasts as well as in yours.
So the news that Congress in its on-again-off-again tactics is now apparently giving the green light again to a tax cut. even though it will be next year instead of this, has pepped corporate man agement up in the dragging days of late summer. The stock market has taken note. And business planners are talking of better days to come. The corporate stake in tax cut-ting is in three parts. First is the chance of getting the 52 per cent levy on corporate earnings down to 48 per cent in two years. Second is the hope that top and middle individual income rates will be lowered enough to make more money available for investment.
And third is their belief—and this they share with top union leaders -that personal incomes after tax-es will be expanded enough to make more purchasing power for the consumer goods that many corporations turn out directly and others indirectly by furnishing the materials or distributing and re-Many business and financial leaders have stressed their fears of tax cutting ment spending

enough to trigger new inflation or undermine either the value of the dollar or its reputation in in-ternational money markets. But even these agree that cuts in corporate taxes should be an immediate help to business providing economic growth. Gov-ernment economists stress this as necessary to lick unemployment and make the United States stronger competitively in foreign ing that recent official moves to tighten credit and raise interest rates should offset to a consider able extent any inflationary threats posed by tax cutting. They

consider such moves as a brake on speculative trends that their more conservative colleagues fear would be encouraged by tax cutal deficit.
In urging a "significant /reduction of corporate income tax rates," economists of the First National City Bank of New York sum up much business thinking A corporate tax cut now would "provide additional capital needed for faster growth, encourage cost-reducing modernization of our plant and equipment needed to make American exports

more competitive with the rest of the world, and help restore full employment by stimulating pri-Moving into more controversial ground, these bank economists also see a lower levy on corporate product prices in many industries where present corporate taxes are, at least in part, passed on to Consumers. They further argue that if corporations could keep more of their gross earnings by paying lower income taxes on them this would "help reverse the present large net outflow of long-term invest-ment from the United States by

improving investment yields is country."

These are the arguments of men who have the interests of business and industry at heart But most other ideas of hom taxes should be cut are advanced by those who have individual inter-






