If there is one musical group native to the United States, it is the drum corps. Not the blaring, gaudily-garbed bugle and drum aggregations now marching and maneuvering up and down New England, but the smaller, less pretentious five and six drum corps that go back (in a direct line sometimes) to the 1770s.

Hosting deep, rope-tensioned drums, usually in great number, along with wood, occasionally muffled fife, these units are garbed in the tricorn hats, hessian and frothy shirts, common to the Minute Men who prevented us from growing up with a British accent. Until now, this type of music has been pretty much confined to New England with Connecticut the center of its activity.

 with regulation oil-wall type of equipment, but it has limits. U.S. Army Engineers now are experimenting in Greenland with a tube-shaped drill that burns its way down but preserves intact inside a core of snow and ice with its history to tell. It's hoped this can go down 2,000 meters or more, said Dr. Bader, a specialist in analyzing the snow samples brought to the surface.

A deep hole at Byrd Station in Antarctica, cored three history books 13,000 years, and one of the South Pole itself might turn the pages back 75,000 years, he said. Ice corings so far indicate a "deep freeze" in the last half century and a decrease in snowfall in the last few decades, Dr. Bader added.

THE TALENT OF A HIGH PRIEST
 It is the formidable forensic talent of Dr. Edward Teller, nuclear weapons scientist, that has enabled him to speak smoothly of a desire for peace while he neatly inserts the hand-drawn diagram of the hydrogen bomb which would inflame and fester war, that he sees a man of soul while he asks us to put on ourselves the mark of the beast; that he preaches gently and pleasantly of a world of law even while he counsels taking the law into our own hands.

It was character, then, that he should appear before the Senate Committee at Washington, on the nuclear test ban treaty, and proclaim, at the opening and at the end of his testimony, that he was limiting himself to the "technical and military aspects of the question," but that, in actuality, his testimony should serve mainly as a vehicle for those deep-seated emotions which impel him to his role as high priest of the cult of ceaseless and unlimited preparation for inevitable war.

In the course of his discussion of the "technical and military aspects" of a nuclear test ban treaty, Dr. Teller found that in the "field of big weapons Russian lead has been demonstrated before the eyes of the world. In this category Russian tests decisively outnumber United States tests."

In the category of smaller weapons, Dr. Teller found that "the known Russian tests are somewhat fewer in number than the American tests," but added, "It is possible, however, that we may have missed quite a few Russian tests in this range."

He added: "There is one field of particularly great importance where we have reason to believe that the Russians have acquired a decisive lead. This is the investigation of the effects of nuclear weapons."

As for the underground explosion of the nuclear test ban treaty which the preparations necessary for such explosions "can be carried out in Russia in an inconspicuous manner."

Going from underground to far outer space, Dr. Teller found that "the treaty will permit the Russians to retain their advantage in multistage rockets. With the help of space testing the Russians may even increase this advantage. At the present time," he declared, "we cannot detect Russian tests in distant space at a hundred million miles."

From his fear of "small clandestine explosions in the atmosphere," Dr. Teller turned to the possibility that the Russians would use "big, shallowly buried, literally illegal, underground experiments."

Apparently, Dr. Teller meant that a few shovels of dirt might give a legal standing to any kind of test, and, even while he warned us that the Russians might try this, he suggested definitely and strongly that we ought to be busy at it ourselves.

"The above discussion," he said, "shows that Russian violation of the treaty in the sublimation range may endanger United States security. It further shows that this danger will be greatly exaggerated if we fail to carry out shallow underground experiments which are permitted by the wording of the treaty."

In other words, expecting the Russians to cheat, we should cheat first. Not to cheat first would seem, in this discussion of the treaty from the technical and military aspects of the question, to come out as something rather suspicious.

"Receptive caution in interpreting the treaty in the United States may lead," said Dr. Teller, "to severe inhibition of our underground testing program."

"There are," he added, "with ominous and dark inferences not quite technical or military," precedents

Must Be The Overtime
 One of those individuals responsible for those 1963 statements about mosquitoes has been identified at last. He is Neely Turner, state entomologist, at the State Agricultural Experiment Station in New Haven, and his verdict is that, because of the rainfall pattern this year, Connecticut has only one-fourth as many mosquitoes as usual.

This being his proclaimed statistic, and one we have no authority to dispute, we find ourselves driven into a series of secondary questions. This decreased mosquito population being so, what factor is responsible for the fact that this decreased state population has concentrated itself in those particular areas of the state most thickly inhabited by human beings?

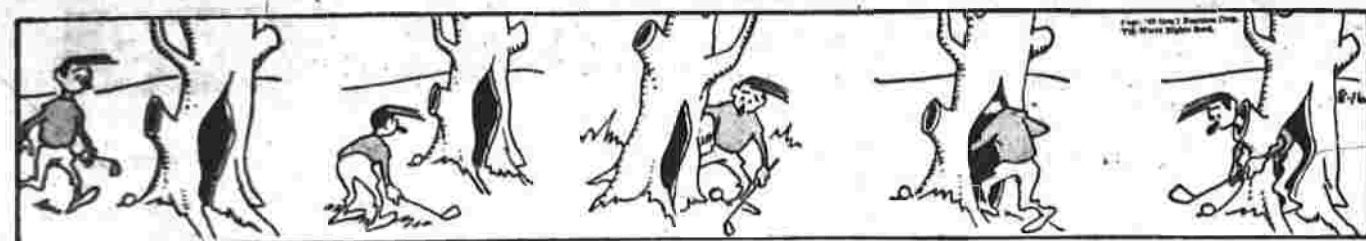
