



"Please stop right there," said Rep. Melvin Price, D-Ill. "What's a 'nanocurie'?"

"Why," declared H. M. Parker, manager of the Atomic Energy Commission's Hanford Laboratories at Richland, Wash. "it's tento-the-minus ninth curies — the same as one thousand piccouries."

A gleam of recognition came into Price's eyes.
