





### Coventry Town Voters Total 2,888, Drop by 200

The preliminary list of registered voters just completed for the four municipalities of the town of Coventry shows a total of 2,888 voters in the town, a decrease by 200 over the list of 3,088 as reported last November election.

This total which will be changed with the voter-creating statute on Sept. 14 was decreased most outstanding by 187 persons moving out of town and 33 who were retained for the 1962 election only. 24 who died. Added to the list were 54 new voters and three returned voters to the list. During the year there were 11 voters transferring from one voting district within the town to another.

Siskara report the breakdown on their lists as follows: Total list at start 1,006 (eligible at Nov. 1962 election) to which were added one transferred, 24 newly made Aug. 24, nine transferred from the First District and deducted were 20 retained for the 1962 election only, seven who died, two transferred to the First District and the 45 who moved out of town.

A copy of the preliminary corrected lists will be filed on Saturday at the town clerk's office, in accordance with the law. Each voter is required by law to be on the list or be name as spelled correctly and be listed under the correct address.

The final lists will be printed and available by Sept. 27, according to law.

**\$2,378,514 Asked In Flood Suits**

NORWICH (AP)—A flood that swept Norwich Monday has left some \$2,378,514 in damage suits in its wake. Five of the six victims were employees of the Turner-Stanley Co. The government is seeking \$200,000 in damages. J. P. Martin Co. is seeking \$100,000. The suit against the state is seeking \$750,000.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Reliable sources report a government investigation of the controversial drug Krebiozin shows that it is a very common substance which is worthless in the treatment of cancer.
