Compromise of House, Senate Ahead for Mental Health Bill

Indications were that a renewed effort to get the staff funds included in the bill would come when a House-Senate conference committee considers the measure.

The House version authorizes \$115 million for the two years beginning July 1, 1968, for grants that would pay one-third to two-thirds of the cost of building community mental health centers.

\$20 million during the next three fiscal years to pay up to 75 per cent of the cost of building research centers to learn more about mental retardation. \$22.5 million during the same period to finance up to 75 per cent of construction expenses for program facilities associated with colleges or universities. \$27.5 million for the two years beginning fiscal 1968 for grants to the states to pay between one-third and two-thirds of the cost of building facilities for care of the mentally retarded. \$23 million during the next three years to expand programs for training of teachers of mentally retarded, deaf and other handicapped children.

Not Free, But Better Off

Beating always in mind that there is really no such thing as a little tyranny, or a little totalitarianism, or a little lack of freedom, so far as all the spiritual realities are concerned, it must still be noted that there is continuing and heartening report of superficial surface changes inside the nation of Hungary.

What these reports add up to is a rather amazing impression that the moderate Polish revolution of 1966, which succeeded because its leaders knew where to stop, and the Hungarian revolution of 1966, which failed then because, after it got going, it began to entertain dreams of going all the way, may now be coming out even again.

In this strange equation, Gomulka, who led the mild Polish revolt in 1966, and thereby established himself as a national leader, and János Kadar, who was put into power in Hungary in 1966 by Russian tanks are both, despite the different origins of their original claims to office, coming out about the same kind of function—that of spreading over a gradual liberalization of ideological and political rule, and a gradual improvement in general living conditions.

In any case, some of the reports from Hungary make pleasant reading, once we assume there can be some circumstantial variations in the under absolute authority.

New York Times correspondent Max Frankel quotes one citizen of Budapest in the following way: "The intellectuals and students who led us into the streets in 1966 did not want to overturn Socialism. They wanted a Hungarian and humane Socialism, a decent standard of living, an end of the police terror, greater freedom of expression and travel. They wanted what we are now getting, and what we want to continue to get more of."

The Hungarians to whom Correspondent Frankel talked are still cautious, even while they are grateful for their new freedom of travel across their country's borders, and for the new cultural contacts now possible with the outside world. But one thing they cannot quite decide for themselves, and this is perhaps the measure of how far they still are from real freedom. They can't quite be sure just why they are getting the better life—they are getting—whether Khrushchev himself is benevolently responsible, whether Russia and its Hungarian puppets found they had to let up on the reins if they wanted the Hungarian economy to work, or whether what is happening is almost an inevitable phase of evolution in the attempted rule of one country by another, proving that evolution can sometimes substitute for revolution. But so long as they can't explain their own possession of privileges, so long as they don't know just why they can do what they can do, they are still, obviously, not free, but merely better off.

No Rights For Maples?

So far as any relationship between the use of salt on winter highways and the early coloration of maples this September is concerned, we would appreciate it if the agriculture scientists of New Hampshire and Connecticut would wait until they have findings for some year not distinguished by a low water table all summer long, undernourished, too, by a long summer-spring span of no rain of any kind.

There may indeed be a relationship between the use of salt on winter highways and the general well being of maple trees whose root systems get too heavy a taste of the salt. That seems quite logical and inescapable. In fact, one can pose a strong probability that, if this salting process continues long enough and heavily enough, it will gradually turn all roadside soil, and all drainage channels and areas quite sterile and incapable of supporting growth of any kind.

But, from a layman's ignorance and observation, we would hazard the guess that roadside maples would be likely to be prematurely scarlet this year a few days ahead of normal schedule, just as other trees far from highways or salt seem, this year, in something of a hurry to turn in their dirty and tattered and desiccated foliage for that clean, bare winter look.

As for the philosophy expressed by the experiment station scientists who report the injury to tree health building up from the use of salt on the highways, we are not sure we accept that without some hesitance, either.

What they say, according to the New York Times, is that human safety on icy streets and highways is more important than trees, and that, if there is anything to be done about their discovery, it must be the development of some neutralizing agent which might protect the trees from the salt.

Thus, we suggest, some point beyond which we would not want to keep sacrificing the lives of trees, simply because man himself might not do so well in a treeless world. Furthermore, trees are not the only victims of road salt and chemicals. The roads themselves, the understructure of the cars themselves, and, in any long range proportion, the quality of the nation's water supplies are all vulnerable to the things salt does after it gets through melting ice.

Some of the maples along the Connecticut highway which may be being injured by the road-conditioning practice of the past few years were planted more than 100 years ago and should perhaps be conceded certain roadside rights, such as being guaranteed against sudden death at the agency of
