Teen-ager Bruised, Shoe Off The body of 17-year-old

Hope Fern Rothwell of Bolton was discovered about 4:15 yesterday, lying between two mounds of dirt in a secluded lovers' lane off Dockerel Rd., Tolland

According to police an autopsy ford Hospital by Dr. George Mc-Adams, pathologist, disclosed that the girl was strangled. There were no indications of sexual molestation, the report said.

Major Leslie Williams of the state police said this afternoon that cause of death is believed to be mechanical strangulation as opgators now believe the girl was strangled with the strap of herandbag since it fits the pattern of a bruise on her throat.

When discovered, the body bore narks of violence including a bruise on the right side of her nead and neck. One sneaker was off her foot. Her open pockethook was found near the body, some of its contents spilled on the ground. There were small, superficial rounds on other parts of her body and additional bruises on he thigh, it is reported.

Her body was found by Robert Jsher, 47, of 31 King St., Rockville: He is assistant building in-spector of Glastonbury and the son of Rockville building inspector Roland Usher. At the time, he was conducting a routine inspection of ne property, owned by relatives Because trash was often discarded in the area, various members of the family have conducted inspections of the area about once a month. The checks had been going on for about 20 years.

State police disclosed that they had sent a patrol car into the area late Friday night but they had been looking for a car with the Rothwell girl in it, and it had been raining heavily. According to Maj Williams, State Police execuive officer, there was no way of inowing yesterday if the girl's

BARRY VOTED DOWN WASHINGTON (AP)-The Sen ate rejected today a proposal by Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., to require Soviet removal of nuclear weapons and military per-sonnel from Cuba as the price for U.S. ratification of the limited nuclear test ban treaty. The 75 against. The reservation offered by Goldwater, a possible 1964 Republican presidential nominee, was regarded as the biggest hurdle for the treaty banning nuclear testing except underground.

ROCKY ABROAD NEW YORK (AP)—Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and his wife took off from New York today, with the governor saying he would not be critical of President Kennedy's administration during a 12-day tour of European capi-tals. At Idlewild Airport, Rockefeller told newsmen, "The role of a citizen abroad is to support the administration. Therefore, I will not hold any press conferences nor make any speeches."

CALIFORNIA QUAKE PASADENA, Calif. (AP) - An earthquake shook millions of Southern Californians today but surprisingly little damage was reported. Only injury reported was in Coronado, where Jeff Giberson, 16, was cut by flying glass when a light fixture fell and shattered on a breakfast table. Residents of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Imperial and San Diego counties felt the shock. Many said windows and dishes rattled. Residents of Fallbrook, near the center, heard a runbling noise.

BIGGEST AIRLIFT WASHINGTON (AP) -The Defense Department announced today that 240 Air Force transport planes will airlift a 15,000man armored division to Germany late next month in the greatest such long-range training operation ever undertaken. The 2nd Armored Division, 13,-500 men strong, will be flown from Texas to Germany along with 1,500 men in supporting truck and artillery units from bases in five states. The massive airlift, expected to take days, will be supported by a composite air strike force of 116 jet fighters, reconnsist planes and other aircraft,
