Street Singer Rose to Fame: **Edith Piaf Dies**

By DAVID MASON PARIS (AP)-Edith Piat, who sang her way from Paris street corners to international fame, fied today after a long series of grave illnesses.

Miss Piaf, who was 47, was brought to Paris by ambulance from her Riviera home Thursday and died shortly after dawn today of an internal hemorrhage. Her husband of just over a year, Theo Sarapo, 27, was at her side. A frail brunette with a strong and haunting voice, Miss Piar soared to fame just before World War II. She became a national idol and by the 1950s was widely known abroad.

She had planned to return to
New York this year to sing her
sentimental repertoire, including
her own "La Vie en Rose." Born in poverty, the daughter of a roving acrobat, Miss Piaf sang for coins on Paris streets when ahe was 15. In 1935, a well-dressed stranger invited her to his night club and soon Edith Giovana Gassion had top billing under the name Piaf, after the sparrows on Paris streets.

The great love of her life was Marcel Cerdan, world middleweight boxing champion. Cerdan was killed in a 1949 plane crash and Miss Piaf said: "I thought I could never again be happy, never again laugh. My universe fell in."
