

The final selection before intermission, the "Suite Purcel-lians," by Henry Purcell, was coeptionally enjoyable for this eviewer. Purcell is one of England's truly great composers. Though he lived only thirty-six years, he was very productive, and his music conveys an infectious spirit of positiveness. The beautiful opening by the woodwinds was superlatively played. As the work progressed, the interplay between soloists and ensemble was excelent. It was difficult for me to believe nat this is a civic orchestra, which has been in existence which has been in existence such a relatively short time. The audience warmly applauded the fine performances of the four young players of solo passages, who were given special recognition by Mr. Mari-

josius.

I think it should be men-tioned here that Mr. Mari-josius obviously understands of the civic orchestra move-ment. Civic orchestras should ment. This was certainly the case last night, insenuch as the only paid member of the orchestra was the capable and highly talented concertmaster, Mr. Phillip Ruder, All the other members of the orchestra are residents of Manchester and surrounding communities, playing for the satisfaction gained, rather than for monetary remuneration. for monetary remuneration.
(Some members do, of course, make their living by performing and/or teaching music, but contribute their talents to the orchestra.) As a public school music teacher, I was simply delighted by the degree of participation of students in the orchestra.

It is beautiful in its utter simplicity and clarity of expression. The balance between soloists and ensemble was good most of the time. The third and final movement demonstrated the ingenious knack for variation which Mosart so often displayed. This was a thoroughly enjoyable reading of an impressive work.




