How Foolish Can Manchester Look

Trying to decipher the nonsense that is now going on up at the Municipal Building is an impossible task. Herald reports have labored conscientiously in the effort to make events

up there seem rational. It is no go. There is no interpretation for it all except to say that the whole mixture, including whatever good and sincere intentions may be in it somewhere, adds

up to nonsense. There are involved in it, however, three elements of Manchester life which ought somehow to be lifted out of this nightmarish brand of public perform-

There ought to be condolences for General Manager Richard Martin, who now finds the efficiency expert whose employment he himself recommended to make a study of the town highway department turning his energies into a

vendetta with the General Manager. There ought to be a psychiatrist for the political majority on the board, which ought to be told that, if it is determined to find quarrel with the General Manager, it should beware what kind of instrument it employs.

And there should be an exemption and praise for the political minority on the board, which stands quite alone in preserving sanity of public attitude, of sublic utterance, of public responsibility. But all three elements ought to agree together to call a halt to the public display of official gullibility and tolerance for infinite, self-renewing nonsense which has been the Municipal Building story for the past few weeks. Let the fantasy be voted to an imme-

Then let the questions the fantasy was supposed to be trying to resolve and answer be approached with more sobriety and responsibility. Manchester is tired of looking this

Holiday Breach In The Wall

foolish to ttself.

When, after a final session of bargaining which had lasted some 35 hours. two individuals signed a protocol under the terms of which the people of West Berlin will be allowed to pay a Christmas visit to friends and relatives in East Berlin, these two signers were very carefully stipulated to be agents of somebody or other, but not full representatives of governments they were

committing. This was the elaborate but necessary -considering the way the Communists habitually grab beyond every legal inch which is tendered them-precaution designed to keep a piece of human and Christian cheerfulness from being converted into an engagement in the power politics war being waged through the middle of the continent of Europe.

What the agreement will mean to people was well and movingly stated by Mayor Willy Brandt of West Berlin. "We have all," he said "waited long for this moment. Christmas for hundreds of thousands of Berliners will now be more beautiful, it will be a real family

So, for such human and seasonal objective, and amid such precise legalistic precautions, the infamous Berlin Wall is now to be breached.

That is good news. It is also certain to illustrate and emphasize, by the very Christmas season shadow of freedom it permits, the complete unspeakability, the mute horror, of the thing known as the Berlin Wall. To have this sensed and realized again will not do too much good if such sentiment merely channels itself into one more automatic condemnation of the Communists, as villains who constructed the Wall. Their real sin was not the Wall itself, but the contrast in conditions between life in the East and life in the West which made the Wall become necessary. When the Wall itself was built, even the West was actually relieved, as well as horrified, because not even the West knew what it would

have done had the growing flow of exiles

from one half of Germany into the other half been allowed to continue. The problem is not to tear down certain hunks of masonry. Not even the West, for all its hatred of the Wall, would welcome what could be the consequences of just tearing the Wall down.

The problem is to bring about those conditions which would allow the Wall to come down without creating any great rushing stream of humanity heading in one direction or the other. The problem is to make the German people one people again, and give them the living conditions, the political conditions, of one people.

Eventually this has to happen, And part of it eventually happening has to be the development, on each side, of some ability to deal with and treat with the other side, always in some direction toward more common standards. The East Germans have to come up to enough political freedom and economic progress to enable them to fit into the future of a united Germany. But the West Germans have to make up their own economic and political minds that the East Germans are welcome in such a united Germany, even though they may trim some of the economic fat from the West, even though they may alter the political balance of power which has controlled West Germany since the war.

Each side, then, has some distance to go, perhaps one of President Johnson's great distances. But this Christmas visiting agreement is at least one step.

A Bitter Residual Reality

There seems some business of mixed accusation and denial in reports that a United States Information Agency film about President Johnson had one of its planned carly sequences abandoned beause it was calculated that the presence of a rabbi along with other representatives of the American clergy would cause the firm to be refused even a showing in Arab countries.

Whether or not there was a change in the making of the film for which such a consideration was the only reason, one does not need such an incident to prove that the pettiness of the Arab world can indeed show itself in such a

We had, just a year or two ago, the elaborate mockery of reality in which an Arab and a Jewish delegate to the United Nations could appear on the same television interview program only after the Arab had been guaranteed a screen which would enable him to pretend that he Jew did not exist.

And there was similar news from London recently, where one of Britain's great insurance companies apparently decided it would do better getting business in the Near East if it removed Lord Mancroft, a Jew, from its board It would be a grave injustice to

credit all such high Idiocy, or even such bitterness, to all Arabs. Some of the events which seem to illustrate it, in fact, very may well arise from the fact that somebody else is trying to do the thinking and feeling and trading for the Arabs, and makes ugly concessions to them they themselves might not think But there is always a bitter residual

reality, which amounts to an Arab effort to continue to live in an unreality. How the Arab peoples and nations must be brought, in their official outlook and in their emotions, to the realization that must be in their heads—that Israel is a permanent free nation-is another of those aching problems which seem to defy any immediate solution, and for which a prolonged referee's time-out must be asked. But, in the meantime the less glowering there is across the floor, and the less members of the spectator world themselves act as if the feuding had to be humored and catered to, the better.


Judge Clark knew his law as did few
