#### Two Candidacies

Over the holiday season there were two especially interesting and significant developments in the business of candidates for the 1964 presidential election.

One of them was perhaps of major proportions, yet almost to be expected. This was the appearance of a concentrated kind of boom for Governor William W. Scranton of Pennsylvania as an entrant into the Republican presidential nomination sweepstakes.

This may be a thing of major importance. It was not, however, unexpected, Former President Eisenhower is busying himself getting people to get into the arena. Sooner or later that group which one news story described as "financially potent Eastern Republicans" had to begin to form itself behind some particular candidate. And that group invariably ranges itself behind some relatively liberal or moderate candidate, not only because a good deal of its own membership has intelligent and moderate views, but even more importantly because it wants the Republican party to play its own best chances to win.

Governor Scranton, as the New York Herald Tribune observed when, in a special endorsement editorial the other day, it made him its choice to enter the field, if not its final choice for the nomination itself, has had a short but succeasful career which has exposed some success and no apparent vulnerabilities. Unquestionably, with the routine pub-Heity build-up, he might begin to seem quite a figure.

As for Governor Scranton himself, he seems to be following the same game he has always played—that of not seeking but of being eventually willing to consider accepting. But he is now playing it, one would say, with a little more alertness, in the new atmosphere created by tragedy in Dallas.

Such developments on the Republican mide, and even the possibility that Governor Scranton would become somebody's favorite were quite predictable. Many of us. on the other hand, must have been surprised when, on a television program the other night, Adlai Stevenson, ambassador to the United Nations, former Governor of Illinois, and twice Democratic candidate for the Presidency itself, disclosed that, yes, in the remote possibility President Lyndon Johnson asked him to do so he would consent to run for vice president on the

party ticket for 1964. At first glance, at least, this willingness would seem to present President Johnson with an unusual opportunity to back himself up with a vice presidential candidate who would seem, in public experience and stature, to outrank any vice presidential candidate ever named after the procedure of nomination by political parties took over. But one also wonders if, while the Stevenson willingness in the event of such a "remote" possibility provides President Johnson with a choice which might easily resolve so many questions for him, it does

What does President Johnson say now, if he does not proceed to reach for such a running mate? Isn't the situation really one in which

Ambassador Stevenson has come close to drafting himself? Well, if President Johnson wants him. the President is then a lucky man. If he

doesn't want him, it will be interesting to see how he escapes being an embarreased party leader.

#### Confusing The Confuser

If one could separate the business of armed forces moving about the vast expanses of central Asia from the diplomatic and propaganda strategy with which Peiping has apparently begun to torment Moscow, one could enjoy the spectacle of one Communist master of. the process of deliberate confusion being victimized by another Communist practitloner of the same occult art. Not to make sense, where sense is

expected, not to say yes when yes seems stomatic, not to seek what you must want but to pretend to be after something else entirely, and always, above everything else, to keep your strategy rival off balance by refusing to let any logic except the logic of the illogicalgovern your own behavior-all this is traditional Communist operation, which we of the West have learned rather well through our coexistence with Soviet

While we have been learning about Communism from Russia, however, we have frequently suffered the torments and the embarrassments of the naive character who finds himself taken in or whipsawed in front of a world wide audience.

That is the background which lends a certain perhaps irresponsible pleasure to the business of watching Peiping whipsaw and confuse Moscow, which is trying, for its own part, to be elusive about the business of its wanting Peiping in the United Nations. The last audit we took; it seemed

that Russia was still clinging to its own pretense that it wanted Communist China in the United Nations, but that Communist China itself was pulling at least part of the rug from under Moscow by a strange exhibition of prospective softness toward the Afro-Asian plan for enlarging the Security Council. As we get it, while Moscow was insisting no such enlargement could come until Peiping itself was admitted. Peiping was volunteering the possibility it might not mind at all if the plan suggested by its good friends in Asia and Africa were put into effect without waiting for the admission of Communist China, This would seem to be something of a double-cross of the double-crosser, and we find shadow in it only when we remember that, to some people, to some na tions, to some statesmen, war itself is merely an extension of such diplomacy.

#### Tragedies That Can't Happen, Do

One of the saddest aftermaths of a tragedy like that which came to the liner Lakonia and its cruise holiday passengers is the appearance of criticism which alleges that human neglects or deficiencies in heroism may have made the disaster worse than need be.

So, among the surviving passengers, there are more stories of lifeboats which didn't launch propertly, or of crew members who created more confusion than they resolved, than there are stories dwelling upon the fact that nearly 900 people were saved.

Later, there will be official investigations, perhaps some condemnation, and some resolve, everywhere, for improved preparation, on all ships, for such emer-But our emergencies still continue to

be emergencies because they present patterns of events never really antici-Our disasters love fire-proofed buildings, unsinkable ships, safetyguaranteed landings, collision - proof trains, and explosion-proof mines, all of them usually manned and operated by ordinary people who, thanks to all such guarantees, have never before experienced the realities of the unexpected. After each dramatic visitation of the unexpected, we try to increase our future safeguards in order to diminish the amount of future risk. But the only way to eliminate all degrees of risk is to eliminate living.

#### Baccarat The Computer Can Have

In some things, being a creature of flesh and blood and sometimes embarrassing, sometimes pleasurable imperfections, we would resent the intrusion of a computer. n other things we would vacate the

field, willingly, to the officious efficiency of the computer.

So to that computer over in England which has come up with the guaranteed assurance that the game of baccarat is one gambling game in which anybody has "almost" an equal chance, we say, Go ahead computer, put your own money on the line, and gamble to your electronic impulse's content. We couldn't care less who played

baccarat. Baccarat, we are told-our own first hand acquaintance with playing cards having remained strictly according to the Puritans, from youth on-is a simple game in which a banker tosses out cards to those playing against him, their object being to take as many cards as they can without exceeding a total count of nine, with face cards and tens counting nothing. The banker in baccarat usually plays one chemin-de-fer hand against two opponents, and this seems to be the circumstance which restricts

We would hate, for instance, to have a computer try to muscle in on any honest game of poker or gin rummy. But baccarat is all right. 

Before the day was over, more violence crupted nd two more persons were dead and three injured. Six white persons were shot and several hite-operated stores burned in ghts of disorder in Cambridge,

and nonviolence. Negroes staged sit-ins, wade-ins and picket lines, North and South, to dramatize their demand for equal treatment.
