U.S. Issues Licenses for Wheat Sales

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Commerce Department has issued conditional licenses for the sale of \$40.6 million worth of wheat to the Soviet Union but whether there will be a deal remains to be seen.

The two licenses—for \$20,300,000 each—were issued Thursday to two unnamed American firms.

The permits allow the sale of the U.S. grain provided various conditions are met. These conditions, under announced U.S. government policy, include stipulations on financial and shipping terms.

If the Soviet Union agrees to these terms, then the U.S. companies have permission to go through with the sale. U.S. Commerce Department spokesmen said.

Nearly three months ago, the late President John F. Kennedy gave the green light to proposals for private sales of U.S. wheat to the Soviet Union. Soviet negotiators, however, have been balking at the American terms.

They have objected particularly to the U.S. requirement that part of the grain be shipped on U.S. vessels, whose rates are higher than the world market price.

The U.S. traders who applied for the licenses were said to have indicated that the Soviets were proposing to pay cash. This would appear to remove complications over extending credit to them although the li-

U.S. Accepts Filipino Help On Cambodia

MANILA (AP)—The United States and neutral Cambodia have agreed to try to settle their dispute with the help of the Philippines.

Initial contacts have been made and will continue," Foreign Secretary Salvador E. Lopez of the Philippines said today. "So far the situation seems encouraging."

WASHINGTON (AP)—There is new evidence that the planet Mars is crossed by great yellow clouds of toxic smog.

It is so, it could mean that earth is neither too close to the sun, nor too far from it.

But a U.S. space probe that flew past Venus indicated surface temperatures there were too high to support any known kind of life.

The United States hopes to learn more about the mysteries of Mars by directing two Mariner space probes at it next November. The probes are planned to fly by the planet in March of 1969.

JOHNSON CITY, Tex. (AP)—President Johnson was briefed on the Cyprus crisis today and began intensive preparations for talks with Chancellor Ludwig Erhard of West Germany.

An intelligence briefing on Cyprus and other areas overseas was given by the President by Director John A. McCone of the Central Intelligence Agency.

McCone flew in the Johnson ranch shortly after midnight and was up early to join Johnson at breakfast.

Johnson set up a series of conferences to go over key points that will be involved in the two-day Erhard meeting that begins Saturday.

U.S. Issues Insurance Agent Describes Fake Claims by Cosa Nostra Hockey Team Locates Pond

CHICAGO (AP) — An insurance agent has given the Cook County state's attorney's office a step-by-step diagram of how the Cosa Nostra gangsters are operating a multimillion-dollar insurance fraud, the Chicago Sun-Times said today.

The Sun-Times quoted the state's attorney's investigators as saying Lewis C. Barbe, 32, the state's chief writer against Marshall Callano, reportedly said he had met Callano in a hotel room collecting more than \$500,000 in the last five years on fake claims resulting from phony burglaries, auto accidents and incendiary fires.

Barbe has been kept under protective custody by the state's attorney since the last two months. He is scheduled to testify against Callano, 32, an insurance fraud case. Callano is charged with conspiracy to defraud the insurance industry.

The Sun-Times said Callano and six others were indicted in a \$10 million insurance fraud case. The newspaper named John Frabotta, Philip Milwaukee, Philip Alderotti, Frabotta, Ross Prio and Jimmy "The Monk" Allegretti.

Barbe said he arranged two frauds in which the gangsters stole \$10 million from the insurance industry. The newspaper said Barbe also outlined other schemes.

Buffalo Coach Lou Saban said Burton was activated to give Boston an advantage.

"We've got to react to Burton," Saban said prior to Wilson's protest. "His return should affect our defensive thinking."

Burton gained 545 yards rushing last year and caught 40 passes for 461 yards.

The game will be nationally televised by ABC from snowbird stadium in Miami, Fla., at 8 p.m. EST. Starting time is 1 p.m. EST.

The winner moves on to the AFL championship showdown against the San Diego Chargers at San Diego, Ariz., on Dec. 29.

A sudden-death overtime will be used in the event of a tie at the end of regulation time. The Patriots and Bills will play two games during the season and finish with a total of only 15,000 of the sellout crowd of 32,555 shown in Buffalo last year.

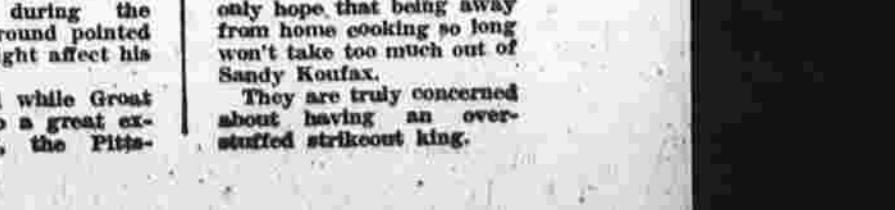
