





The proposed budget is approximately \$370,000 higher than the one under which the board of education is now operating, slightly higher than average budget increases for the past four years.

What Difference, NATO Or UN

make to Archbishop Makarios, president of Cyprus, whether the troops that may have to come to his country to protect internal order there come under the jurisdiction of NATO or UN?

One answer is that NATO is a partisan organization in world power politics; the UN supposedly non-partisan, or, to be more realistic, bi-partisan. If his young country has to be occupied, the president of Cyprus undoubtedly prefers, with a view toward regaining his country's own control of itself for itself some day, the sponsorship of the larger

President Makarios whose motiva tions one may attempt to explain without condoning the internal policies which led to the present unrest of his own Turkish minorities could also be seriously concerned over the possibility that the proposed NATO move into his country could some day turn out to have been a move for something beyond internal peace in Cyprus.

The last real international role Cyprus played was as a sort of floating air base for the British-French bomber attacks on Suez in 1956,

subsequently, the success of Archbishop Makarios in winning independence for Cyprus led to the end of that role of British base for Cyprus. To have banner of the NATO might be something like making Cyprus a military base again, this time for Britain and

The simple elemental political fact for President Makarios has to be that the less involvement he has in any partisan world politics, the safer he will feel in

his island's independence. From his point of view, and from what should be the intelligent point of view of those who think they must see to it, one way or another, that internal order is preserved in Cyprus, it is the same issue being raised so frequently with regard to economic foreign aid programs. Such programs, when administered by the United Nations, can be administered without special interest and can be accepted without any special strings.

But beyond the special considerations which are obviously in the mind of Archbishop Makarios, as he shrinks from letting a partisan power politics alliance take over the policing of his country, and apart from the special hesitations which ought to be in the policy of outside nations trying to help, there is the even larger point of view which ought to weigh heavily with thinking world

citizens everywhere. Every time we can solve an interhational problem through using the United Nations, we tend to unite the world, at least toward some possibility of its own survival.

Every time we try to solve an international problem by shouldering the United Nations out of the way and attempting some unilateral big power solution or by invoking some regional jurisdiction, we increase the fundamental peril in which our world is living.

We knew better than to allow any one world faction to go into the Congo to restore order. That was because we wanted to make sure some faction not our own didn't get in there and monopolize the situation. The same logic, the same principle, have to apply in another situation, even if, this time, we happen to see an opportunity for our own faction to move in alone.

### Too Good To Pass

Considering the fact that Connectieut's Senator Ribicoff was careless enough - or broadminded enough - to find the Oregon maverick, Senator Wayne Morse, a pleasant ally in the area of foreign aid economies late last year, It probably served him right to have the same Morse turn on him and accuse him, in the matter of the proposed tax bill amendment giving parents income tax credit for college tuition bills, of trying to sheak in, by his amendment, some back door solution of the problem of federal ald to education across re-

But, although there is always a certain poetic pleasure in seeing those who consort with Morse being spattered by him, the verdict in this instance has to come up still in favor of Ribicoff and his amendment. If there was in his proposal any element of giving federal aid to education by a system which did not involve the question of any federal involvement in the support of religiously affiliated institutions, so much the better, and so much more praise for Ribi-

The Morse argument against the Ribicoff amendment seemed, however, no worse than most of the other arguments. Somehow it seemed to excite and alarm all kinds of specialists in giving away government money in one form or another to come face to face with an honest proposition in which people, ordinary people, would be given the precise kind of a break they need when they encounter the tremendous burden of tryng to finance college for their children.

Such a simple common sense proposition, which could do a world of good directly, with no fol-de-rol, no complications, and apportion its good directly to those families which needed it most, must be very offensive indeed to all the masters of governmental and professional bureaucracy, all the thinkers of gobble-de-gook, all the brokers among pressure groups, all who can't stand having a simple good thing happening unless they can devise some way of hooking themselves into it.

There were, of course, some sound and troubled reasons why the Johnson administration would not find room for this roposal in the bill it has to try to drive

But the feeling and response and opinion of many Americans will be-if any members of Congress ever really listen -that this is the exact kind of proposition which ought to have room made for
