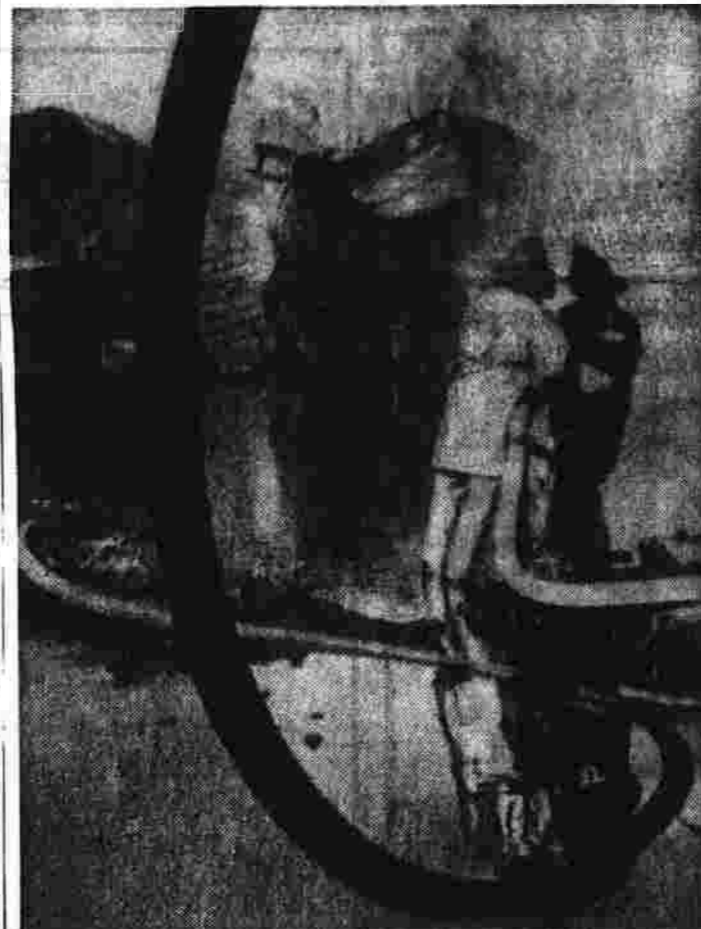

Rail Damage Amid Strike Starts Probe

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Investigators sought today to track down saboteurs who dynamited a 91-car freight train and a work train derick of the strike-harassed Florida East Coast Railway.

No one was injured in the blasts Sunday—10 miles apart—which caused damage estimated by W. L. Thornton, the carrier's chief operating officer, at more than \$250,000.

"It was definitely sabotage," Thornton said. "I am not implying the unions are to blame. No one knows at this time who did this."

George Leighty, chief negotiator for the 11 striking unions, said, "We know absolutely nothing about it." He said union members had been warned not to resort to violence.

The sabotage was the worst directed against the 577-mile railroad, which operates between Jacksonville and Florida City, south of Miami, since the nonoperating unions struck Jan. 28, 1963. Railroad officials said there have been 146 incidents.

About 1,200 union employees struck, idling about 800 others. They demanded the 10.28 cent-an-hour pay raise agreed to by nearly all Class One railroads on a national level. The Florida East Coast line, which was not a party to the negotiations, said it couldn't afford the raise, and sought to bargain separately.

There has been no passenger service since the strike. Freight service has been built up to four trains each way daily, using supervisory personnel and union workers. The railroad now has a work force of about 700.

FBI agents, city, county and railroad detectives launched an investigation of the dynamite blasts.

The first blast occurred at 1:37 a.m. Sunday as the south-bound freight train crossed a 15-foot high wood and steel trestle over Oleta River near U.S. 1 in North Miami Beach.

The 500,000-pound locomotive cleared the bridge, then plowed up track for 200 feet. Four cars plunged across Dixie Highway and smashed through a coral rock wall into a park. Freight cars tumbled crazily into the river. Thirty-three piled up behind the locomotive. One was a tank car carrying 20,000 gallons of volatile methane gas. Firemen said the methane tank apparently ruptured and sparks touched off leaking gas, starting a fire that destroyed most of the 33 cars.

Other cars contained tarred roofing paper, paper napkins, hay, canned goods and a shipment of Easter candy.

LIBJ URGES MEDICARE WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson, declaring that Americans need, want and can afford "the best of health," urged Congress today to vote medical insurance for the aged this year. In a special message to Congress on health problems, Johnson also announced he is creating a Commission on Heart Disease, Cancer and Strokes to find ways by the end of this year to reduce the hazards of those diseases by developing new knowledge and better using existing knowledge.

AGREE ON TAX CUT WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate-House conferees on the tax cut bill agreed today to President Johnson's request for a speedy cut in the wage and salary withholding rate of 14 per cent. The present withholding level is 15 per cent. The Senate had amended the bill to establish a 14 per cent rate for this year, instead of the 15 per cent voted by the House, and House conferees agreed at today's initial conference to go along.

RIGHTS DEBATE HALTED WASHINGTON (AP) — The House voted today to cut off debate on the civil rights bill in an effort to bring it to a final vote this afternoon. Using their heavy majority to stifle Southern talk against the bill, the civil rights forces managed through a 211-78 vote, a motion setting 1 p.m. for the end of all debate on the controversial job equality section.

Macmillan Bids Adieu To Politics

LONDON (AP) — Harold Macmillan, who served his country in war and peace, announced on his 70th birthday today he is saying farewell to politics.

After 40 years in the House of Commons, the former prime minister said in a letter, "I really cannot undertake the full duties of a conscientious member."

His letter, addressed to Conservative party officials at his constituency of Bromley, was formal word that he would not stand for Parliament again at the elections this year.

Since stepping down from a seven-year term as prime minister after a prostate operation four months ago, Macmillan has seldom been seen in Parliament. He has spoken only twice in the House of Commons—once in a final speech about Lord Denning's report on the Profumo scandal, once in a tribute to the late President John F. Kennedy.

Macmillan's career spanned the perilous days of World War II and the cold war. With Sir Winston Churchill, he opposed Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain's policy of seeking an accommodation with Adolf Hitler before World War II.

Rogers Counsel Bids To Curb Police Quiz

ROCKVILLE — An injunction to prohibit Connecticut State Police from further investigating Mrs. Nora Rogers, 29, accused of manslaughter, was presented in Tolland County Superior Court this morning by Atty. Robert J. Pigeon, Tolland County public defender.

The application, termed a "unique" by Judge Alva P. Loiselle, called for an immediate halt to the questioning of Mrs. Rogers unless Atty. Pigeon is present, a violation of the injunction would call for fine of \$1,000.

Mrs. Rogers was arrested on a coroner's warrant Jan. 30. Investigation has revealed that 6 of her 10 children have died, and that one child was taken from her custody in Maine and later adopted by a Maine family.

She was served with a bench warrant Thursday, formally charging her with manslaughter in the death of a daughter, Barbara Ann, 7 months, in Rockville, about four years ago.

Atty. Pigeon presented seven motions this morning, a request for a bill of particulars was granted. It calls for more specific information in the charge.

The court also approved a request to have two or three psychiatrists examine the defendant, and upon recommendation of Pigeon and Joel H. Reed II, state's attorney.

Some Principals Fear Students Will Smoke

High school principals at a national convention in Chicago were asked by The Associated Press if they believe the government report on cigarette smoking has tended to discourage student smoking. Here is the report.

CHICAGO (AP) — Many high school pupils are habitual smokers, and it's almost an even bet that the recent government report linking cigarettes and lung cancer won't discourage the habit.

That is the opinion of high school principals attending a national convention in Chicago, given in response to an Associated Press questionnaire.

Almost two-thirds of the principals surveyed said from 20 to 60 per cent of their pupils smoke regularly. More than one-quarter place the figure at 40 per cent or more.

Virtually all the principals reported their schools regularly provide classroom instruction about the dangers of smoking.

The rest said such instruction has been added since the surgeon general's report last month singled out smoking as a serious health hazard.

Such instruction usually is made a part of the classroom work in biology, general science, physical education or ninth grade health classes.

Some schools have scheduled lectures by local doctors and others have shown films provided by antismoking groups. Several principals described the films as gruesome and one said a teacher and three students fainted.

(Here in Manchester a campaign to discourage smoking among teen-agers got underway last fall when members of the advisory board of health urged more smoking education in town schools.

Lincoln's Hopes for the Negro In His Own Words

"What I would most desire would be the separation of the white and black races." (Speech at Springfield, Illinois, July 17, 1858). Abraham Lincoln Complete Works, edited by Nicolay and Hay, published by The Century Company, 1904, Volume 1, page 273.

"I will say, then, that I am not, nor ever have been, in favor of bringing about in any way the social and political equality of the white and black races—that I am not, nor ever have been, in favor of making voters or jurors of negroes, nor of qualifying them to hold office, nor to intermarry with white people; and I will say in addition to this that there is a physical difference between the white and black races which will ever forbid the two races living together on terms of social and political equality."

"Why... should the people of your race be colonized, and where? Why should they leave this country? This is, perhaps, the first question for proper consideration. You and we are different races. We have between us an impassable difference that exists between almost any other two races. Whether it is right or wrong I need not discuss, but this physical difference is a great disadvantage to us both, as I think your race suffer very greatly, many of them by living among us, while ours suffer from your presence. In a word we suffer on each side. If this be admitted, it affords a reason at least why we should be separated. It is better for both, therefore, to be separated."

Three Boards to Confer On Kindergarten Issue

The controversial kindergarten issue will be discussed before a special meeting called by the board of education with the board of finance and board of selectmen. The meeting will not be open to the public. Considerable opposition is anticipated from the finance board and selectmen. The meeting will also circulate papers seeking signatures of residents opposed to the proposed kindergarten program. These will be given to the selectmen before the meeting tonight.

First Selectman Richard M. Galinat said his board views the "breach of faith" in considering the kindergarten a part of the Coventry Grammar School's new addition by the town. He maintains the school board agreed that only the rooms needed in the 10-room addition now under construction would be used for classes in the fall. Since the building program began, the board of education has voted to reduce the class sizes at the school to 20 which will use 9 of the 10 rooms.
