A New York University Professor Louis W. Koenig, who is an expert on the history of the American Presidency, was interviewed by the Christian Science Monitor the other day on the question of moral tone and corruption in our natural life, and made one rather sweeping recommendation with which we In the course of the interview, Profes-

sor Koenig traced the intermittent touch of high scandal in our history, from the charges against Alexander Hamilton through the corruption which flourished around President Grant to the Teapot Dome scandal of this century. But the professor feared that the in-

creased watchfulness the experience of our past has caused us to maintain has been more or less checkmated by the increased complication of governmental processes and by the increased number of fields in which government has lar-

gesse of one kind or another to bestow. The battle against corruption has to deal not only with the harder-to-detect opportunities now available, but also with some of the traditional instincts of American society.

"We are still," said Professor Koenig, "a society that puts a great premium on material success without asking too many questions as to how it is done. We admire the operator, the man who gets things done. This attitude has been chronic in our history."

Anyway, Professor Koenig confessed that he was bothered by the fact "that we have had these scandals in the last few administrations—in Truman's, Elenhower's, Kennedy's, and now Johnson's. The persistence is not good."



Licenses and Privacy

A new body of law is developing in this country built around the right privacy—the right to be left alone. Mod ern devices—from telescopic cameras to wire taps to sound detection apparatus -are sometimes used unlawfully to intrude into homes and lives.

We see a clear violation of privacy in the sale by the State Department of Mo-tor Vehicles of automobile registration-lists to the highest bidder. A small profit has been made by the state in selling the nformation to mailing-list companies. On the surface, the data on auto registrations do not seem overly confidential: yet names and addresses and the type and number of vehicles owned can be used by commercial list and advertising companies to bombard the owners with sales pitches in doorways and mailboxes and over the telephone. This intrusion can come from literally dozens of different persons and companies. The law permitting vehicle registration information to be sold commercially ought to be repealed.—NEW YORK TIMES.


