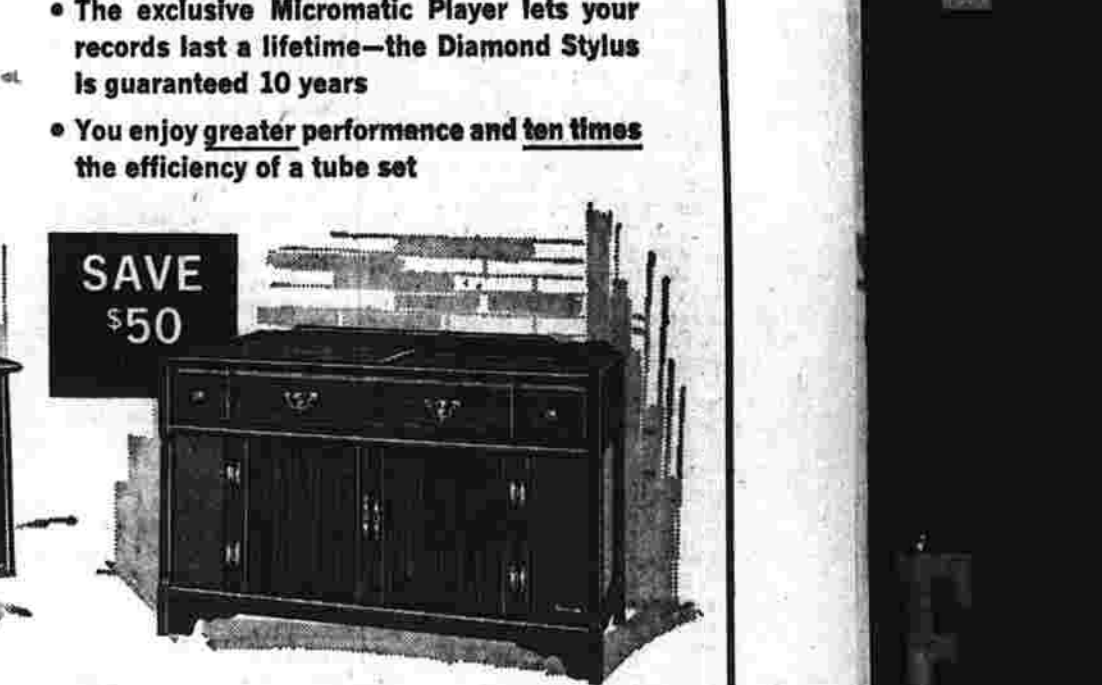

Coventry Canvass Set In North End By Firemen

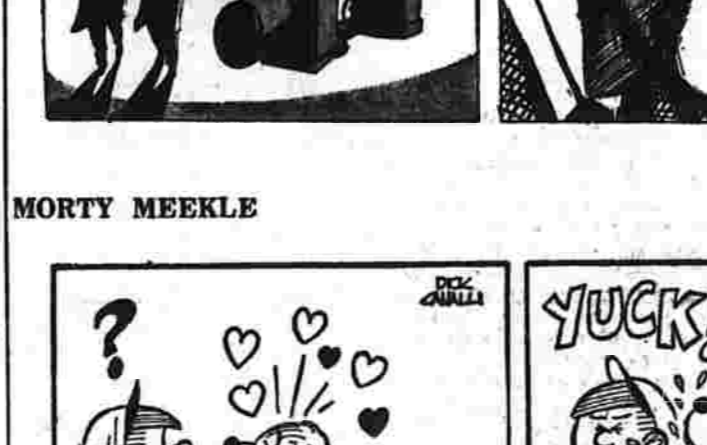
