A Monstrous Equation

The actual trial of those Cuban fishermen, as conducted by the state of Florida Wednesday, turned into a perfunctory matter.

The four Cuban captains were convicted of having violated Florida waters. They were fined \$500 apiece, the four of them, and given sentences of six months in jail, to be served, however, only if the fines were not paid.

The fines were paid almost immediately by the Czechoslovakian embassy, which handles Cuban affairs in this country, and the Cuban fishermen were free to return to Castro, with their fishing boats. Charges against the 25 members of their crews were dismissed. The fish they had caught, some 2,000 pounds of it, was ordered confiscated.

All this is a very far cry from anything so major and full of alarm and escalating reprisal and counter-reprisal as the incident of the Cuban fishermen seemed to be when it first came into the news three weeks ago. This has been disposed of as another

fishing incident, not as another chapter But it would be a misunderstanding of the nature of the times in which we live if we were to assume that some-

thing that has had a sane ending could also have been easily guaranteed a sane well as among certain facts. In that atmosphere, every instinctive appraisal of the presence of the Cuban fishing boats whether that appraisal was that of the arresting force, the federal or state

authorities, the people of Florida, the newspaper, television and radio correspondents, or the politicians in Conother people's business? gress, was almost certain to be an original instinctive appraisal which was dominated by a sense of alarm, a recognition of some kind of challenge, a twitch of muscles aching to get tough. wielding the knife on another who was yelling for help-that on the spot decision was all one way.

All this did take place for the first few days of the discovery of the Cuban fishing boats. All of this did create, in this country, and even in its highest policy circles, that kind of reaction and build-up which would be quite certain to tempt that irresponsible, prank-oriented juvenile, Castro, into some gesture like turning off the water for

In summary, the atmosphere in which we live and which will not be easily cleared away-made it almost inevitable that we should pass through two or three days in which the presence of four unarmed Cuban fishing boats near some islands off the coast of Florida constituted a sputtering fuse leading toward some kind of explosion.

How much of an explosion that might be, a hand grenade or a hydrogen bomb, what area it might cover, a small patch of Caribbean or a whole clutch of continents, and whether there might somehow be some damp put on the sputter before it reached the end of its fateful ourney-none of these things, were really known by anybody.

This was our state for two or three days, until somebody somewhere sudfenly seemed to realize that this in itself was an intolerable state of affairs, which must somehow be cooled down and ended before it did carry out some of its potential threats.

So, on Wednesday, four fishing boat captains were fined a total of \$2,000, and that was the final alternative chosen in place of World War III. What a monstrous equation—to have two such things ever even for a single

But that is not really the point, not such a question to, and such apparent an-/ swers from, people we don't even know. The horrible thing is, isn't it, that not even we ourselves know what our own answer would have been, in such a situation, or will be, the next time the eternal question presents itself to us. On this question, no man can ever be sure of himself, and no man who is not certain of his own answer can, obviously enough, still volunteer officiously to be the keeper of his brother's conscience.

The Canadian government should con sider a proper way to memorialize John F. Kennedy. And we hope the memoria will be something more meaningful and Ottawa or a new name to some georraphical feature. President Kennedy's death has already

An uncounted number of cities all ove he globe have renamed streets and, plazas in his honor Canada, too, has its share of geograph-ical monuments to Mr. Kennedy. There is a Kennedy Highway in Quebec and a Kennedy Ave. in Montreal. Fredericton, N. B., is building a memorial in recog-Mr. Kennedy received his only Canadian honorary degree.
The Banff Chamber of Commerce has

suggested that the federal government select a peak in the Rockies for a Mount Cennedy. Rewriting the map, of course, is a harmless and inexpensive way to set up memorials. But there has been so much renaming since Nov. 22 that it has become a rather routine gesture.

Canada has close: ties with the United States than any other nation, and our people bore John F. Kennedy a special esteem and affection.

A suitable memorial would be a John F. Kennedy chair of North American studies at a leading Candian university. It should be given sufficient endowment to attract an eminent scholar from either country.

There is room for a professorship that would bring fresh research as well as would bring fream research as well as historical perspective to bear on American-Canadian problems. President Kennedy himself was both an analytical thinker and a doer, a great respecter of knowledge and understanding as guides to practical action. He could hardly be better honored. — TORONTO DATE.

LONDON (AP) — A soviet marshal whose sarines stored of the property of the control of the pro

"It was we the Soviet forces, who captured Berlin and therefore we had an opportunity to see and learn much more than any outside observers who were far from the scene during the storming of Berlin.

"When soldiers of the 8th Guards Army forced their way into the imperial chancellory on the morning of May 2, 1945 they saw a still smoldering rug and in it, Hitler's charred corpse. This is first-hand information."

The article as relayed from Tass in its English-language service received in London did not say what the Russians did with the body.

Survivors of the Berlin bunker holocaust, including Hitler's driver, his valet, and an aide, have testified over the years in various courts and in publications that the bodies of Hitler and Eva Braun were burned in the open air and the ashes scattered.
