





He says part of the difficulty in preparing the case stemmed from the early postwar period when the allied victors held war crimes trials and then shipped Nazi archives to Washington, London or Moscow.

Since this country is organized on a federal basis, coordinated work was difficult. Persons lacking enthusiasm for further exposes of the Nazi era found it possible to hamper investigation and pass the buck from state to state.

Many West German police of-

Many West German police of-ficials are old colleagues or friends of persons suspected of crimes against humanity.

A defendant Bauer never ex-pected to put on the stand is Emil Bednarek, 56, tracked down by chance.

Bednarek, a former Auschwitz inmate who ingratiated himself with his guards was selling sausages in a German railroad station. Three Polish professors, former Auschwitz prisoners, spotted him as they were returning to Warsaw after making depositions to Bauer.

Other defendants were located largely through patient detective work.

The trial, expected to run about a year, took four years for Bauer to prepare. During this time, 1,300 people were heard in pretrial investigations. About 390 witnesses from 15 countries are expected to testify.

Top ranker among the defendants is Robert Mulka—68, a former 88 captain who was adjutant to Auschwitz' first commandant, Rudolf Hoess. The Poles hanged Hoess in 1947.

## A Gentle Editing

That nice, favorable impression President Johnson made in that Sunday night nterview with the chosen representatives of the three television networks was due, in the main, to his own qualities. As Pundit Walter Lippmann reviewed the President's performance favorably, "he was never at a loss for words or facts, or for grammar and syntax, and he was immediately and shrewdly aware not only of the meaning of the questions put to him but of how his answers would be taken by the great

Pundit Lippmann summed him up as "a very formidable political man," and went on to pay him further compliment for his ability to recognize and begin to give description to the kind of world in which we are now beginning to live a world, in short, in which we may be leaders, but not bosses. In all this we concur.

And, in fact, the compliment the President deserves for his part of the performance increases when we go on to fault the three networks for their editorial handling of their own roles in the telecast.

For those who wondered whether, with the conversation recorded in advance, there has been editing and tampering with it, the answer has now been revealed to be yes.

Apparently, the conversation itse originally filled about 80 minutes so that, when it was edited down to 60 minutes, the network producers involved took out some portions of the original conversation. There would be any number of good grounds for leaving passages out. The most important and elemental was, of course, the necessity for getting the telecast down to an hour.

But the producers of the program were also concerned with its artistic excellence. Accordingly, in a nervous underestimation of the poise their subject himself was going to bring to the occasion, they deliberately arranged it to have the sharpest, most embarrassing question that was to be put to the Presidentthat involving his own supposed original sponsorship for Bobby Baker-held back until the end of the program. They were afraid if they got the President angry with this question he might not answer other questions gracefully. But when, in the event, President Johnson handled the Baker question blandly, the producers then moved that section of the conversation up toward the middle of the program, where it fitted in better with other questions similarly of a critical

By a similar piece of gentle editing, which involved nothing more serious than the decision to bring the hour with the President to an end with his rather fine passage about free enterprise and where the strength of our own way of life lies. This passage hadn't, in the real event, been the passage the interview ended with. But it made a fine and very natural and very eloquent ending after it had been placed there, at the end of the tape, and there was obviously no major harm in that.

And all such editing was done in New York, away from the White House, and the White House neither saw nor approved the final version before it was

telecast Sunday night. Why, then, do we dwell upon the details of it at such length?

Because, simply enough, a Republican might think this treatment too kind, and a Democrat still think it not kind enough. Because, simply enough, the incumbent of the White House himself would be hard put to it not to feel either gratitude or displeasure, according to how he viewed the editing job.

And because, simply enough, even network producers are human as well as artistic, and could not always be relied upon to show exactly as much courtesy and consideration to one public figure as to another.

Would these same producers have been equally artistic in devising the sequences for a conversation with that engaging personality, Richard Nixon? Would they have snipped the same por-

The answer to such questions is that, if the Presidential interview is to become a custom, it had better be a thing run add exactly as it happens or not at all.

## "In-Country Mapping'

We had no particular compunction, under President Elsenhower, in flying our U-2 plans over the territory of Russia, a nation whose existence we formally recognized and with whom we frequently conducted negotiations and exchanges of various kinds. One assumes, then, that we have ever

less respect for the sovereignty of Comnunist China, a nation we do not recognize diplomatically, and a nation which we frequently classify as an enemy. So it is likely that when a United States military spokesman in South Vietnam acknowledges that we have U-2 planes stationed in that country, operating from an air base which has been closed to newsmen for several years, and explains that these U-2 planes "are in South Vietnam for the purpose of incountry mapping"—It is likely we take this statement with some qualification. There is every likelihood that South Vietnam itself has been mapped many times over, by planes much less fancy

than the U-2. There is every likelihood that the U-2 planes taking off in South Vietnam have not been wasting their height and mileage capacities.

It will not be very long, of course, before all nations, those which recognize each other and those which do not, will have to adjust to a world in which such a thing as sovereignty is going to be very difficult to define, limit, or defend in its air and space dimension. It is still a matter of great sensitivity

whether somebody flies a manned plane over somebody's territory. It has already become a matter of much less moment when some human being strapped into a space capsule or-

tures as he orbits. It is already, we presume, a matter of accepted military practice that both the United States and Russia have observer satellites taking all kinds of pictures

bits over anybody's territory, taking pic-

What sovereignty there can be in the sky, in space, is going to take some figuring. We have an idea that the day is close when the legal experts, the national sovereignty experts, are going to have to give up on the job, concede that everybody has space everywhere, that all space is international, that there is no way to keep it from being full of fliers and cameras of all nationalities, and that the only thing we can really try to do about space is adopt some international law which forbids anybody, but anybody, to put weapons of any kind up there.

With that day so close, when the American U-2 and even the A-11 could retire in favor of satellites for everybody, it can perhaps be hoped that nobody, on either side, will henceforth be making too much of "in-country mapping" like that reported from South Viet-

## Bad For Nylons And Even Lungs

A damp heavy air clamped down on New York City the other day. In one section of the city, down on the Lower East Side, some blasting was going on. That same day, woman after woman in that area found that she had sudden-

y developed runs in her nylon stockings. This happened to so many stockings on so many people that quite a public fuss developed about it, and the city's official Department of Air Pollution Control did some laboratory work on some of the stockings and came up with the

The blasting process had been releasing nitrogen dioxide gas which, in that kind of damp, heavy air, stayed down near the ground. When a little pocket of this gas, collected in the air, happened to touch a nylon stocking, it dissolved some of the chemical elements, and the run could come into a stocking while its wearer remained motionless.

As a result, from now on, there will begin to be some kind of watch over blasting in the big city, to see to it that any extensive blasting is done on fine, clear days, with a good wind blowing That will not only give a longer life to a lot of nylons, but also may add to the comfort and life of human lungs.

The same day which produced runs for nylons because of nitrogen dioxide released by blasting was also a bad day for human beings because that kind of air kept the sulphur dioxide gas released from automobiles, burners, and furnaces down where people would be breathing more of it than was good for


