Interviews to Take Year

Survey First Step In Renewal Project

About 20 town officials and townspeople last night heard planning consultant Nathaniel Parish outline the first step the town will take-starting next week-

first step the town will take—starting next week—toward renewal of the downtown business district.

Parish represented Raymonde May Associates, the consultants the Manchester Redevelopment Agency (MRA) has hired to study the renewal area, at a meeting called by Director Theodore Powell to consider the proposed downtown project.

And the first step that Parish described is a series of interviews and surveys that will begin next week, designed to find out what kind of people live and work in the downtown area now, and what kind of stores and homes they occupy. The survey will include not only the business blocks but the many residences between Main and Sprucer Sts., which are included in the renewal area. On the basis of the surveys, the consultants and the town renewal agency will decide how each property in the renewal area will be affected by the proposed downtown project.

According to Parish, rehabilitation would be up to the owner of the property to accomplishmuch as the town would "rehabilitate" the rest of the area by installing new storm drains, or new roads, or sidewalks.

Some of the things the consultants take into account when they consider whether to recommend rehabilitation for a property, Parish said, are:

The Rumor Welcome

Just before Premier Khrushchev arrived in Budapest, with the supposed purpose of using that satellite capital as he site for launching some kind of coexistential Communist unity against the supposedly more rabid brand of Communist ideology being preached from Peiping-just before Khrushchev was to arrive in Hungary there was a flood of rumors about the possibility of some new kind of revolt in Hungary against

These may have been rumors and aothing more. It certainly seems, for the moment at least, as if Khrushchev and his friends were still on top of the situation Russian tanks reestablished when they moved back into Budapest in 1956. Still, it is instructive to consider these rumors, and the nature of the revolu-

don they were talking about. They were talking about a possible revolution against Premier Kadar and als alignment with Khrushchev. It would be a revolution to take Hungary away from them and turn it over to the leadership of the Stalinists and the Chinese It would, then, be a revolution headed

toward a more severe brand of Communist dictatorship than that which now exists in either Russia or Hungary. It would be a revolution which aimed at taking away from the people of Hungary the small degree of privilege and iom they now boar

Talk of this kind of revolution places Khrushchev and Kadar, his supposed man in Hungary, in the role of defenders of some degree of liberation and liberty. Yet these are also the same two men who, back in 1956, were the symbols of the restoration of tyranny over Hungary at the very moment Hungary thought it was almost free again.

The Hungarian revolution then was the revolution of heroes, and Khrushehev and Kadar were the villains. The new Hungarian revolution being rumored these days, perhaps as a kind of psychological warfare welcome to Khrushchev on his visit, would be a revolution run by villains against Khrushchev and Kadar who, believe it or not, would at least be advanced to the status of non-villains.

Retro-Rockets Fired Nicely

Our melancholy chronicling of Astronaut John Glenn and His Brief Adventure Into Politics has to conclude, for this season at least, with the notation that his statement of withdrawal was somehow much finer than his original statement of entry. "No man," said Astronaut Glenn last

Monday, "has a right to ask for a seat in either branch of the Congress merely because of a specific event such as orbiting the earth in a spacecraft." Conceivably, of course, Glenn could

have remained in the race for the senstorial nomination in Ohio, and conceivably he could have won, even from a hospital bed. In fact, some of the prediction as to what he would say in his press conference Monday had it that he was going to announce that he was in the race to stay.

But that was not Glenn's idea of how to run or win. "I did not want," he said, "to run as

just a well-known name. . . . "I believe every candidate should be judged on the basis of what he stands for or what he proposes to do, on his basic character, and, on whether the voters trust that he will give every consideration to all phases of every problem before making his decisions. Those decisions should be made on the basis of conscience and the known feelings of the people he represents.

"These things I had hoped I would be able to discuss with the voters of Ohio before the elections in May and November, but this will not now be possible. I will not run just asking the people of Ohio to vote for a name."

This is creditable sentiment, and a nice way to approach the question of very high office.

All those who thought it somewhat presumptuous for Glenn to choose such a high target for his first quest in the poitical arena may now put down on their score cards a notation of one defeat ad-

ministered by the fates, absorbed modestly and graciously, with a little down to earth wisdom included. Such a notation may well encourage us all to a little more tolerance if, some time in the future, Glenn starts another count down with the object of trying to launch himself again.

None of this post-withdrawal kindness for Glenn, however, has yet been authorized for transfer to Pierre Salinger, the gentleman who has rediscovered his own home state just in time to offer to become its United States Sens-

Maybe "Jack Sprat Nature Beef?" Almost as quickly as we became aware of the fact that Chet Huntley was appearing on the national scene in double image, the image was brutally singlified again. It is just as well.

The prospective confusion for the loyalties of the American news viewers could have been psychotic. On March 20, it was revealed that Huntley, already famous as the author of the deathless phrase, "Goodnight David," was bidding for new fame as the proprietor of the ranch in Stockton. N. J., which produced and marketed

"Chet Huntley's Nature Fed Beef." This, it developed, was beef fed lean not artificially obese the way some fancy feeding ranches turn it out, and the emphasis in the sales pitch was on the high presence of protein, the low ele-

Ten days later, however, Chet Huntley and the National Broadcasting Co. had agreed that the Huntley name would be withdrawn from its association with "Nature Fed Beef."

Various considerations, all apparently of the conflict of interest variety, apparently entered into this decision. The day the new brand had appeared on the market, Huntley in his role as a commentator had discussed the price structure of the beef industry. One meat packing house objected on the ground that Huntley had a "patently biased view." There was a question whether other meat packers or distributors might be reluctant to advertise with a fellow

Primarily, one supposes, the network may have been reluctant to have a news program star so closely identified with any purely commercial product. So Huntley will continue to feed his beef, perhaps, and maybe get his \$150,000 investment out of his New Jersey ranch, but depend upon excellence of the product and word of mouth advertising.

As we said at the beginning, this is just as well. One must always look beyond such beginnings to the potential iltimate conclusions, and from Huntley's Nature Fed Beef it would have been a matter of inevitability and equal time toward Brinkley's Bonzaied Bouffant, Cronkite's Crankless Crankcase, Sevareid's Segregated Saccharin, McGee's fellifluous Macaroni, Reasoner's Reasonable Reamers, or Smith's Smog Smocks. It wouldn't have been long before we would have been unable to tell one network brand of news from another, and wouldn't have cared, either.

The Dogma of Realism


A twilight time has come upon us and men of affairs are urging Americans to look at the world about them with new vision. As they see it, the world has changed dramatically and our countr must view these changes realistically in order to act realistically abroad. In one way or another, the dogma o political realism was preached last week President Johnson, by Ambassador Stevenson at the United Nations, by Defense Secretary McNamara, and by Senator Fulbright, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee. What they had to say-and why they said it at this time deserves thoughtful attention, for the doctrine they preach may well shape th foreign policy this country will be com-It is a policy, essentially, of no war

and no peace, of conflict and casualties but no victories. The dogma of realism holds that the world has changed so that, as President Johnson puts it, "general war is impossible." What he implies is that reasonable men could not reasonably engage in an atomic war with its potential of vast destruction. . . .

Senator Fulbright went well beyond the other realists in Washington in his wide-ranging assault on the "myths" in United States foreign policy. He had the temerity to get specific. On Cuba, he said out loud what has been obvious for months: Our policy of economic and political boycott is a fail-ure. On South Viet Nam, he came to essentially the same conclusion as the administration: We're stuck there; we can't pull out and we can't successfully expand the war there. On Communist China: He's against recognition "under present circumstances." On Panama, he says we ought to stop quibbling and give the natives a better deal. Nobody can fault Senator Fulbright for speaking out, though we suspect the man in the White House does not appreciate that kind of critical talk from the Hill. It is, after all, the Republicans

who are supposed to be attacking the Administration's foreign policies, not But Senator Fulbright's point that there are limitations on what the United States can do in this world is a good one. We can declare a boycott against Cuba, but we can't make our allies abide by it. We can offer Latin Americans \$20 sillion in aid but we can't compel them to help themselves if they won't. We can rail against that cagey old realist de ulle, but we can't make him do our

So the senator says let's be realistic. Like others of this persuasion, he is impressed by the "drawing back" of the Soviet Union and he's tickled by the bickering between Moscow and Peking and Washington and Paris.
