### No Veto, No Gimmick

It is important-much more than any of the sequence of surface events will make it seem—that the Cyprus issue finally did go to the United Nations and that it made its way through the diplomatic gantlet there successfully.

And it has to be surmised that a lot of grief and headache, perhaps some porion of actual human life, and a lot of emonstrating against Americans i Greece could all have been avoided if he problem had been headed toward he United Nations as our first, instead of our second, thought.

What were the motivations, what were the objections, which made the United States act, at first, as if permiting the problem of Cyprus to go to the Inited Nations would be something of a

There were possible cold war reaons, which never were admitted openly. t could have been that Britain and the United States together welcomed an oportunity to set the military power of he West up on the island of Cyprus gain, not only to be sure to keep Cyorus itself under their own wing, but also to retain an island aircraft carrier t the castern end of the Mediterranean.

But the only open reason ever given for trying to steer the problem of Cyprus away from the United Nations was the ear that, if the problem did ever get use its presence there, its threat of a seto, and its membership in the United Nations itself to try to wangle its way into some role in the resultant process of keeping peace and order in Cyprus. In other words, we said we didn't want to give Russia any chance to infiltrate its way into any United Nations activfty in Cyprus. And we didn't want to give Russia the chance to block action which Russia couldn't play such a

Against such fears the argument was made, in these columns, that it was about time everybody, including Russia. tiself, be called upon to acknowledge responsibility to the United Nations and acceptance of its processes and decisions with just as much routine and phiosophy and, it could be, occasionally stormy controversy as the individual states of the American federal union scoopt their role in the Congress. Let both the United States and Russia realine, we argued, that their own survival and that of everybody else is what is really at stake every time the United Nations is used or is not used, every time use of the United Nations succeeds

For the fact that the problem of Cyprus did finally come to the United Nadons one must credit, we suppose, the sheer obstinacy of President Makarios, who kept on refusing approval of other

But the problem did get to the Securty Council.

In the Security Council, the final adoption of the resolution by which the United Nations takes responsibility for the future maintenance of order in Cyprus and the mediation toward some more permanent solution, came by a vote of 11 to 0.

Russia did not win any role for itself in the mission to Cyprus. There was no communist gimmick written in the UN

Both Russia and the United States, in the result, will stay out of Cyprus. That is a good thing, for neither of them has the alightest right to be there, as a

What will go to Cyprus is a multinadonal, international force, under the di-rection of an international civil servant, scretary General Thant. It will serve no world faction or idealogy. Its job will be peace, a peace for now while the sants for a peace more leating can be arched for. There may seem to be a mit to the number of such jobs the nited Nations can take on, with callable chance of success. But that limit has not yet been reached. The limit to the number of such situations which can a resolved by purely national or purely national bloc action was reached long.

### Living It Cool

just published a conjecture, by Stalin Prize winner Prof. Boris E. Porshnev, that the "abominable snowmen" occasionally reported in the Eurasian mountains are actually surviving remnants of the historically recorded Neanderthal man, who seemed to have bossed civilization from about 75,000 years ago to. about 25,000 years ago.

At about that time, presumably, the Neanderthal man began to glimpse what civilization was about to become, in the hot valleys of the earth, and delegated one particular Neanderthal family to begin accustoming itself to the business of living in conditions of extreme cold. And sure enough, just as a twentieth century Russian biologist named Lysenko was to demonstrate with plants, you can pass on acquired characteristics. and, in the course of 10,000 or 20,000 years there was a Neanderthal creature who could live on Mt. Everest, without wearing clothes, and who, if brought down to more temperate climates, as the Russians did with one they captured during World War II, would immediately perspire helplessly. And so, except for an occasional footprint not blown away quickly enough by mountain gusts and swirls of snow, the abominable snowmen live in lonely grandeur, self-sufficiency. and perfect peace. We are afraid that, in the rarefied at

mosphere of this discussion, we have mixed a few ideas and surmises of our own with those advanced by Professor Porshney. We brought in Lysenko because we thought Professor Porshnev's mowmen might be the right creatures to exist on the kind of climate-resisting regetables Lysenko has been developing. We assume, rather than guarantee, that the mowmen, wherever they are, are peaceful in character, and successful in their efforts to avoid all the complicated svils their ancestors saw building up in more temperate civilizations.

But in one respect, we wish to yield clear title to the Russians. We of the West have long made the mistake of considering their culture something grim and humorless; we credit them with always taking themselves seriously; we would be afraid to try jokes with them. But the only real difference between us is that sometimes they can tell a taller tale with a straighter face than

States does is never just his own business, so this seems the opportune moment to suggest that he has now been provided with a logical, graceful, and alnost urgent set of reasons for abandoning his wonderfully nice gesture of serving as chief mourner at the funeral of various people he has known and liked in the course of his public career.

His attendance at the funeral of Mrs. such a touching gesture. It meant only the sentimental and friendly best. One can be sure that the fact that the resident of the United States took it upon himself to be present had a great sentimental value, too, for those who had known and loved Mrs. Wagner more

# Body of General MacArthur Reposes in New York Chapel

# To Lie in State In U.S. Capitol

NEW YORK (AP)-Flags flew at half staff today as the body of General of the Army MacArthur reposed in a funeral chapel attired in a simple khaki tropical uniform without any of the medals and ribbons earned in his military lifetime.

At the general's coffin was an honor guard of all the military services. Twenty policemen stood outside while many men and women, on their way to work, paused briefly in front of the funeral home where they knew the body of the Old Soldier reposed.

It was part of the nation's homage to the 84-year-old warrior who died Sunday at 2:39 p.m. at Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington, D.C., after a gallant struggle to survive three operations.

At the chapel today, only the family and close associates could view the body. The casket, the upper portion open half-way, rested on a black. draped catafalque. Tuesday, at the 7th Regiment

LODGE LEADS POLL NEW YORK (AP)-Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge has moved into first place in the preference of the nation's Republican voters, the Gallup Poll reports. In a nationwide survey completed before his victory in the New Hampshire primary, Lodge was first choice of only 16 per cent of the rank and file of his party. Today he polls 42 per cent of the vote of this group, na-tionally, George Gallup says.

CYPRUS STRIFE PAHYAMMOS, Cyprus (AP)—This small all-Greek Cypriot village hastily evac-unted all its inhabitants to-day as Turkish Cypriots be-gan pounding it with mortar and machine gun fire from commanding positions on an adjacent mountain ridge. A small group of the Greek Cypriot National Guard supported by a homemade ar-mored car and an armored mored car and an armored bulldozer fought to keep Turkish Cypriots from coming down the mountain and over-running the village. This development came on the fourth day of continuous fighting between Greek and Turkish Cypriots in northwest Cyprus. U.N. ### Poet Of War And Peace

General Douglas MacArthur's personal talents would have been likely to bring him distinction in almost any field; they were a special embellishment to the military profession. As to his excellence in the science of battle, that will be appraised, by military experts and in war colleges, for years to come. But what the layman always knew about General MacArthur was that there would be the inspirational bearing of the soldier, the properly dramatic word for the proper historical moment, the stirring gesture to be caught by the camera so it could eatch the eye of history, the incomparable timing of the great actor and the great leader.

He was a man to sweep you off your feet, into unreserved admiration. Sooner or later, indeed, he would sweep you off your feet and under his own spell no matter who or what you

You could take, from his famous ad-

dress to Congress after his removal from command in Korea, his phrase about the old soldier, if you preferred melodrama. Or, if you were interested in the observation of a man who studied history to some point, you could take his much less frequently quoted remark, on the same occasion, about the geopolitical inevitability of a reappearance of open rivalry between Russia and China. You could take General MacArthur

saying this of the United Nations: It represents perhaps the noblest effort man has yet made to evolve a universal code based upon the highest of moral precepts. It became the keystone to an arch of universal hope."

You could take such words and sentiments about the United Nations and conclude that General MacArthur would be the ideal choice to become the first Unitd Nations field commander in history, as he did in Kores. And then, of course, you would be puzzled by his failure to fonduct himself as an international commander, or to visualize and conduct . United Nations type of aggressionalting action. You could take General MacArthur's

words handing post-war Japan its new constitution by which it forbade itself even to maintain an army, and hear sacArthur saying that this represented or Japan the kind of security we would all have to seek, and then you could hear him talk, later on, of inevitable conflict in which there could be no substitute for victory. Here was, in summary, a man who had

Therein lies the childlike faith in the future—a faith that, as in the past, the world can somehow manage to survive yet another universal conflict. In that irresponsible

faith lies civilization's gravest peril." He was, of course, the poet of war and the poet of peace, as well, and himself revived that faith in the practicability of war which he himself could call childlike. But he never really doubted, in either field, the dominating importance of the intangible, whether it was something as theatrical as flair, or something as ultimate as an ideal for civili-

"With Powers To Seek" It was really a beautiful piece of language which brought to a close the emparrassing three month era in which the United States and the Republic of Panama were not speaking to each other diplomatically.

There had, at various times since the trouble and deaths over flag-raising incidents early in January, been moments when the two countries were close to an agreement to put their diplomacy back toward some normalcy and begin to talk to each other about what give take might make it possible them to live together, in the future, in the same piece of territory, without

shedding blood. Each time an agreement was about to come into being, however, somebody blew it up. Panama wanted us to say. in advance, that we would "negotiate" a new treaty covering our presence in the Panama Canal Zone. We refused to say anything more than that we would agree to "discuss" the problem.

When some compromise word or phrase was used to try to describe what we would both promise to do, somebody on one side or the other would make an unofficial translation of it, so that it came out "negotiate" in Panama, or still just "discuss" in the United States, and then the other side would denounce the

whole agreement. What really got a new agreement through last Saturday was, we would think, its quite admirably evasive language. But, beyond that, the two parties had decided they were too tired to begin unilateral translations again, and they had to agree, as the two Presidents apparently did in telephone conversations, to have this agreement signed and put it out before anybody could begin taunting them into quarreling over it, and so it came out Saturday and still stands to-

masterful second point of the three point agreement reads as follows: "To designate without delay special mbassadors with sufficient powers to seek the prompt elimination of the causes of conflict between the two countries, without limitations or preconditions of

In other words, Panama can't insist that anything be taken up; we can't refuse to take anything up; but we both can do either, notwithstanding; in any case, the "special ambassadors" have "sufficient powers to seek" but what does "seek" mean?

The important thing is that we have stopped the war of words and moved on to that fascinating task of seeing just how it might be that two independent nations could find a way of sharing sovereignty over the same piece of territory permanently and peacefully.

. That, the central problem, looks more impossible of solution today than ever before in world history. It used to be that the smaller nation, being no match for the big one in the matter of force, would accept its unequal fate in some spirit of resignation. Nowadays, however, there is a stronger moral element in the relationship of nations, and this emboldens the small ones and restrains the big ones. There is not likely to be, so long as this rather touching and perhaps praiseworthy trend in the affairs of nations continues, any arrangement of any kind which makes Panama stop wanting us out, or avoids the likelihood that we will
