

Delaying Recalcitrance?

For five years now it has been legally stablished that the nation's railroads have the right to run their business in a way which at least begins the elimination of featherbedding.

In this period, every court and arbitration board decision has been for the railroads and against the unions. Every time the railroads try to put into effect the privilege they have been awarded by court and arbitration, however, the unions disregard the legal or arbitration processes which have been involved and threaten to strike. They accept law, and they accept arbi-

tration, only when they win. Last summer, one of these strike threats led to the passage of an emergency law by Congress, requiring the unions to submit their case to a new arbitration board. Last November this arbitration board ruled that the railroads had the right to begin the elimination of unnecessary jobs, doing it by not filling natural vacancies in these jobs as they occurred.

Yesterday, rather than accept the beginning of operation for this arbitration board ruling, the unions were threatening strike again. This strike was averted only when

railroad management, at the personal request of President Johnson in White House conferences last night, agreed to work rules for a period of 15 days. But if the unions persist in their

Canute-like attitude, the situation at the end of that 15 days will remain the same, and the 1964 choice may be merely a duplicate of what it was in 1963-either take a nation-wide strike, or pass a new law ordering the railroad unions to keep at work while some new process of arbitration is set up to produce results which the union, next year, may refuse to ac-

Some day in some way the unions have to come to accept what is inevitable, what has won in every court test, what has been established by every arbitration procedure.

While they are holding to their wistful yesterday line, the competition of the modern transportation marketplace is eliminating more railroad jobs each year than any elimination of featherbedding as gentle and gradual as has been authorized could possibly involve.

Sad Kind Of Victory

In Wisconsin, some of the voters last Tuesday were playing games with the issue of race relations and civil liberties in this broad land of liberty. Some of the quarter million votes Governor Wallace got were just as much interested in making trouble for the Democrats as they were in voting against progress toward solution of the nation's race

But in Kansas City, on the same day, voters were not playing. They were dead serious. They were setting specific, definite, every day conditions for the living of the people of that city. And what they did, voting in such

seriousness, and voting not for theory or for principle but for the code they wanted every day living in Kansas City to follow, was not a pleasant or encourag-

We say this even though the vote in Kansas City came out, count-wise, narrowly on the side of the angels. By a margin of 1,743 votes out of 89,209 votes cast, the people of Kansas City did vote to keep on the city books the present public accommodation ordinance which forbids racial discrimination in establishments, like bars, which trade

with the public. This was, on the surface then, at least technical victory for civil rights. In Kansas City, on the surface, there was good news from Tuesday's voting, as ompared to the shock from Wisconsin. But the real story in Kansas City was ot precisely the summary of the city's

oting. The real story was that of where particular votes came from. If, to put the truth naked, the voting ad been a voting of white people alone, the ordinance would have been repealed

All this shows how smart and hep and sophisticated these Khrushchev Russians are getting to be. And not the least of their shrewdness, in the opinion of those who have been watching the fact that the Russians seem to be getting ready to make their pitch to turn this into a kvass world just at the moment when two great American rivals seem to be at each other's bottlenecks
