"You ean't be against education." You can't be against as much education as possible for as many people as ossible for as long a time as possible. To hurry up and register on the right de, Amen, Amen, Amen. But being for education and swallow-

Elliott, who teaches sociology sut at San Diego State College, and who has been in charge of a survey of the
