Plans Drawn On Restoring Ford Theater

 WASHINGTON (AP)—Ninety-nine years ago Tuesday, the curtain went down at Ford's Theatre with an awful finality. That was the night it became the most famous—or most infamous—theater in America. The curtain stayed down. The building was never again used as a theater. It was stained forever that night with the blood of President Abraham Lincoln, assassinated while he sat in its presidential box and watched his last play.

But now, there is a strong and possibly winning campaign well under way, with considerable support in Congress, to restore the building to what it was the night John Wilkes Booth shot Lincoln.

There is no hope that it can be restored by the time of the centennial of the assassination, April 14, 1865. That had been a target date until a few years ago.

But Col. Randall B. Truett, National Park Service historian, a dedicated and enthusiastic supporter of the restoration dream, says "We don't have the money—about \$2 million—but we will."

It's worth going and worth doing right.

"We're ready to go, once Congress gives us the money. Plans have been drawn. We now have a most detailed historical report on the theater."

"The restoration will be to a complete theater, not just the presidential box, but all the seats, in the orchestra, in the dress circles, everything. Even the box office."

There is some difference of opinion as to whether the building should be turned into an active playhouse, in view of the tragedy it symbolizes.

As Truett put it:

"We view it as a national memorial to Lincoln and as such, the use of it would call for a certain restraint."

A fantastically detailed and complete description of the theater has been put together in a book by Dr. George J. Oleszewski, park service historian.

The site was originally occupied by a Baptist church built in 1822. Its physical properties—it could accommodate musical concerts as well as sermons—attracted John T. Ford, a theater man from Baltimore, when he came here in the fall of 1861 seeking a location for theatrical purposes.

Ford leased the building for five years, beginning Dec. 10, 1861.

Lincoln first attended a concert at the theater May 26, 1862 when it was known as Ford's Amphitheater.

Just before 1862 ended, a disastrous fire left only the blackened walls standing. A more elaborate building was built, called "Ford's New Theatre," on the same spot, and opened for business Aug. 27, 1862.

Lincoln attended just once in 1862. It was the evening of Good Friday, the stars were Harry Hawk and Laura Keane and the show was "Our American Cousin," a trifle described in the handbooks as an eccentric comedy.

Shortly after 10 p.m. Booth climbed the stairs to the dress circle, walked through a passageway and slipped into the unguarded presidential box.

In the darkness, he moved behind the President who was sitting in a rocker. He fired the fatal shot, and in the excitement, leaped to the stage, ran out a back door, jumped on a horse and escaped. Booth was hunted down and shot dead 12 days later in a Virginia barn.

The theater was closed immediately after Lincoln's death, which came in a house across the street at 7:22 a.m., April 15, 1865.

After the hanging of three men and one woman convicted as Booth's conspirators, Ford received official permission to reopen his theater. He sold 200 tickets in advance. Ford also received anonymous threats advising him to stay closed.

The authorities took alarm and placed soldiers at the theater doors with orders to let no one in. Ford returned the ticket purchasers' money. He never tried again.

Soon, the government took over the building, first by lease and then by purchase.

Tragedy came again in 1893 when a 40-foot section of the third floor front collapsed, killing 22 Quartermaster Corps clerks and injuring 65 others. The building was never again used for much more than storage purposes.

In 1931 it was turned over to the Department of the Interior and in 1932 the Lincoln Museum was opened on the first floor.

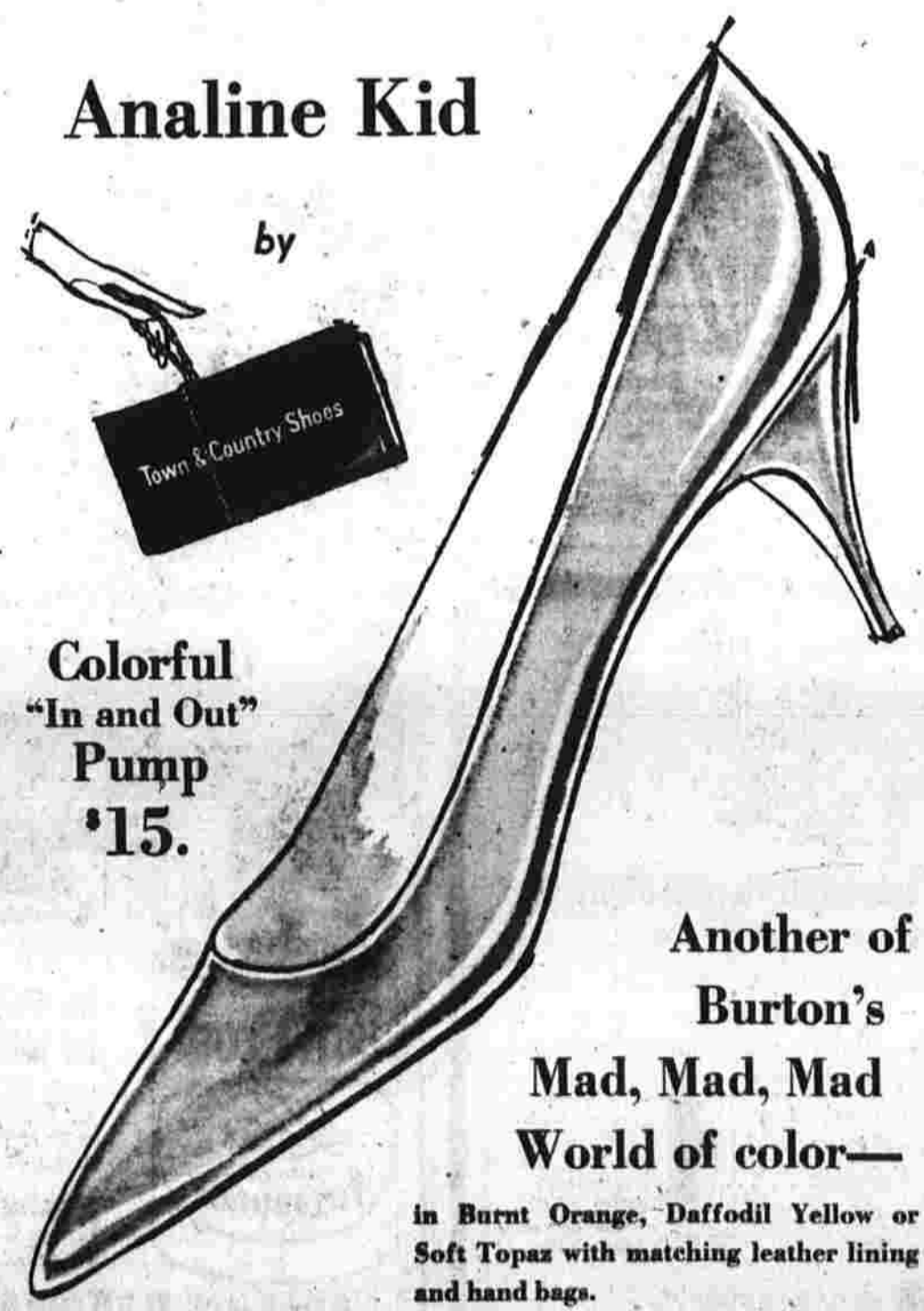

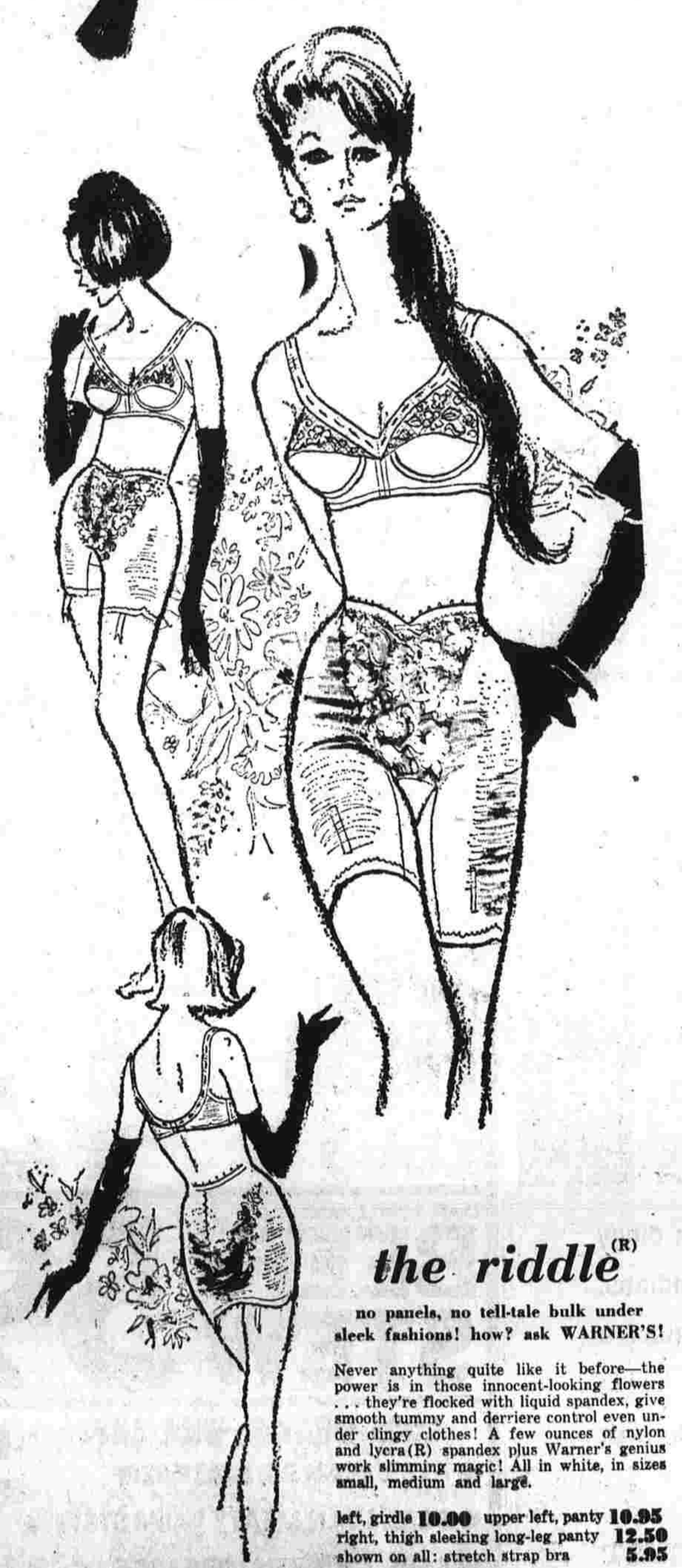

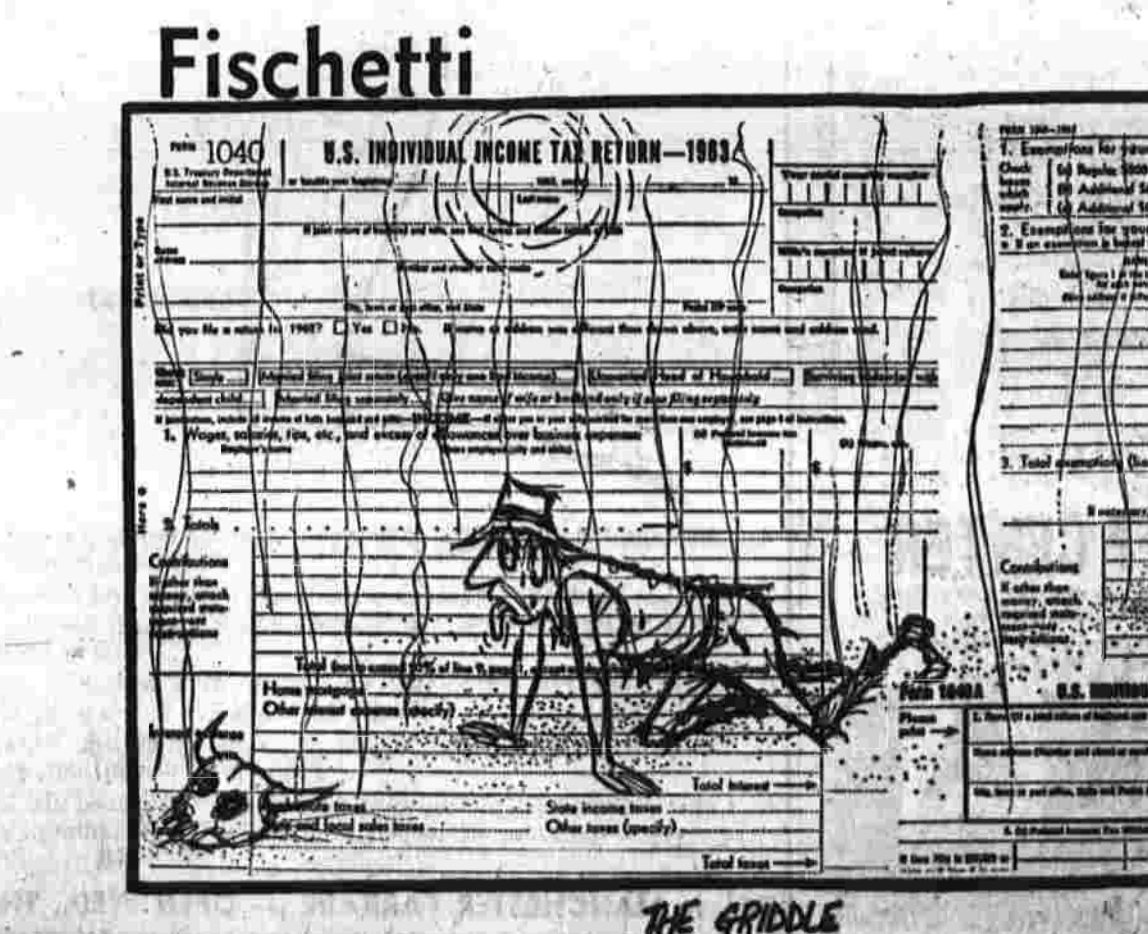

Deming Reviews His Stand On Montauk Dr. Dispute

New information uncovered by selection regarding the Montauk Dr. controversy has caused at least one town father to reevaluate his position. Robert Deming said today, "If there is anything wrong here, it is because town officials let them (Montauk Dr. residents) down."

The road problem has been a long smoldering issue. The recent victory by residents of the Rosedale section of Vernon to get their records accepted by the town resulted in an effort by Montauk Dr. residents to bring up their problem again. Only town accepted roads can be repaired, plowed, maintained or otherwise serviced. School buses do not travel on unaccepted roads.

Deming indicated that the new information he has received indicates that the town released a performance bond by the developer of the road. Selectmen had been told at a meeting earlier this month that the bond was canceled for non-payment of premiums because the developer went bankrupt.

Deming said that according to his material, plans for the road were accepted and the road built according to old specifications. Between the time the plans were approved and the road completed, town requirements were changed. Provisions were made, Deming said, to provide for situations such as this. "Any plans accepted before the new regulations were adopted were valid," Deming said.

Part of the road is inhabited and in use. A barrier constructed by the town separates the road in poor shape that is not used. "I don't feel it will cost us any money but for a few hundred dollars for oiling which we'd have to do anyhow if the road had been accepted," Deming said. He said he'd suggest oiling the road, just to keep it from getting worse.

An earlier selectmen's meeting, an investigation was prompted regarding the possibility of calling for the performance bond if the action were possible. Deming indicated that such action is not called for in this situation.

"We released the bond," Deming said. "No matter how we slice it, I think we are stuck."

Selectmen will further discuss the problem at their meeting on Monday. A delegation of Montauk Dr. residents are expected to be on hand with a petition calling for the road acceptance to be included on the call of the next town meeting.

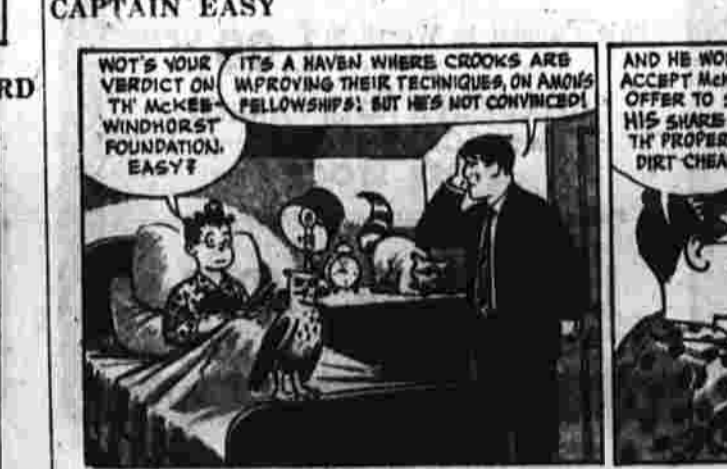

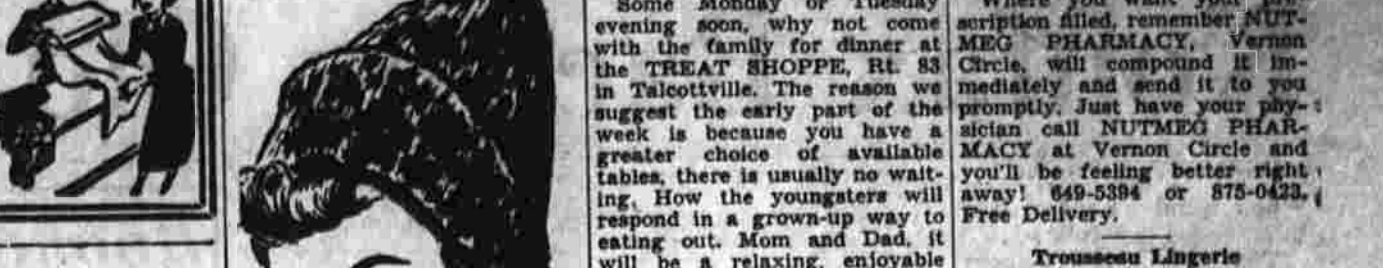
