In other parts of the nation, rain and strong winds were reported Wednesday morning in parts of Arkansas, Oklahoma and northern Texas.

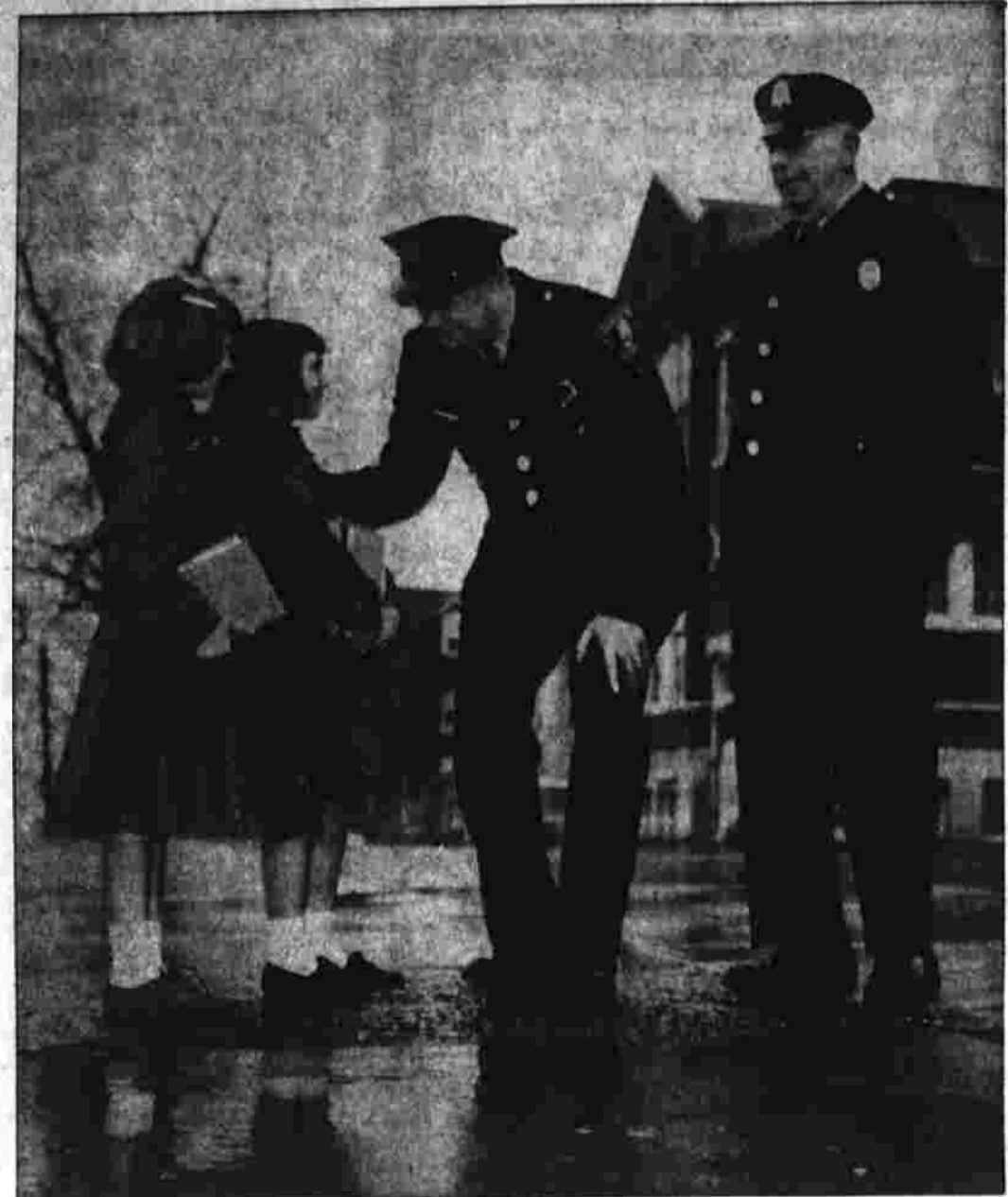

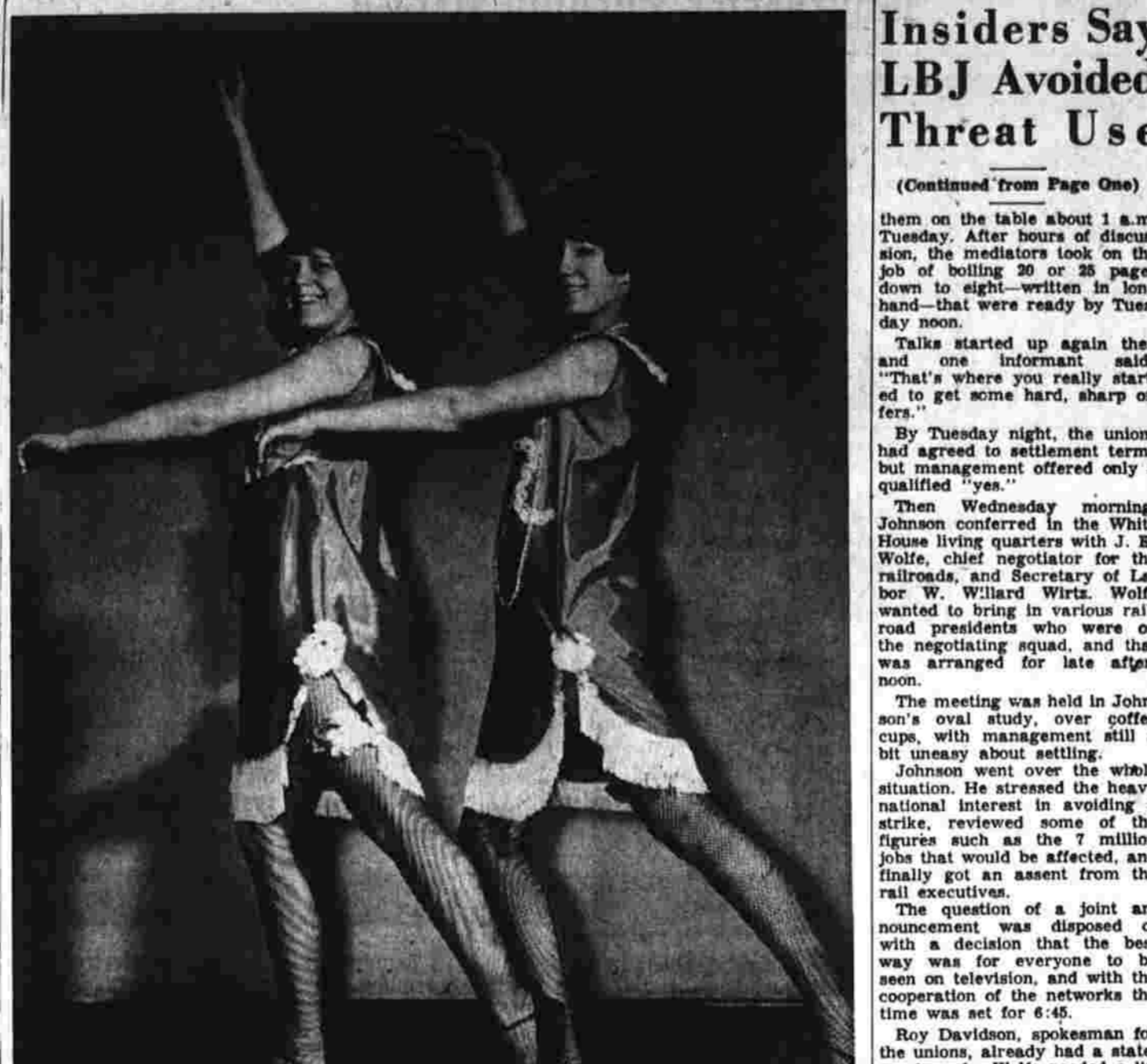

### Kennedy Memorials On Every Continent

**UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)**—The names of John F. Kennedy will go up in Fredrick, N.E.—assassinated five months ago—in a memorial project on every continent.

A survey by the Associated Press shows that schools, churches, streets, bridges and parks have been named in his honor abroad.

More than two dozen West German cities have acted. Three days after his assassination, a quarter of a million persons jammed a plaza in front of West Berlin's City Hall for its dedication as John F. Kennedy Square.

Britain is turning over an acre of Runnymede Meadow for a Kennedy memorial. On this cherished spot in 1215, King John signed the Magna Carta, concessions of English political and civil liberties.

Public subscriptions are under way for a scholarship fund to send British students to Harvard. Kennedy's alma mater, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and for a statue in London.

Nowhere abroad was the impact of Kennedy's death stronger than in Ireland, home of Kennedy's forebears. In Dublin, a concert hall will be named in his honor. A bridge will bear the Kennedy name in Eilbherren, County Cork, home of Kennedy's maternal grandmother. Irish-American organizations are raising \$100,000 for a memorial park in a wood near Roxbury, Conn. Westford, where he visited relatives on his trip to Ireland in June 1963.

Another restricted group is the Vienna's Haidinger Bridge, which Kennedy crossed during his meetings with Soviet Premier Khrushchev in 1961.

Paris and nine other French cities remember Kennedy with streets and squares. Monte Carlo also has named an important avenue after Kennedy. Besides schools, streets and squares already renamed in Italy, the government is considering changing 4,000-foot Emma Aite Park in the Dolomites to Kennedy Peak.

The Netherlands has invited Mrs. Kennedy to unveil a bronze bust at the headquarters of the Kennedy Avenue next Nov. 22, anniversary of the assassination. The bust, which has raised \$45,000 for a Kennedy home for mentally retarded children.

Communist Yugoslavia has renamed a boulevard in Belgrade and a square in Zagreb in his honor. In Skopje, which received U.S. aid after a devastating earthquake last July, Canadians have contributed \$7,000 to a fund for retarded children. A Kennedy monument

**TO HEAT OR NOT TO HEAT? THAT'S THE QUESTION**

To heat or not to heat the baby's bottle? This is the question confronting mothers today.

For many years, mothers religiously warmed all bottles to body temperature for fear of chilling the baby's delicate stomach.

Since the baby does not swallow cold milk in a series of large quick gulps, there is little danger of chilling the stomach. The milk is warmed to body temperature as it passes the upper portion of the esophagus.

A few of our more daring baby doctors about four years ago urged not warming the bottle before feeding in a hospital nursery. They even tried it on the premature infants.

They found that the babies loved the cold milk, slept well after a cold feeding and gained weight at the expected rate. There was no difference in the body temperature of the babies before and after feeding. Furthermore, there was no difference in the amount of burping or spitting up.

Mothers who were brave enough to give their babies cold formula right out of the refrigerator—no doubt about it, these wasn't looking—were enthusiastic. It meant less work and there were no expensive medicines. Now some doctors are advancing the idea that allowing the milk is more likely to occur when the milk is given to babies without warming it. All the evidence isn't in yet, so your best bet is to follow your doctor's advice in what has become, for the moment at least, a controversial matter.

Q—My baby, 8 months old, hasn't a sign of a tooth. We use a water softener on the water intake. Could the baby's lateness in teething be due to the fact that I drank softened water throughout my pregnancy?

A—Although the lower front teeth usually appear at about 8 months of age, teething may be delayed until the baby is 1 year old. Such variations are completely normal, but are often a source of worry to parents.

Late teething, however, is part of the normal developmental pattern of your baby and has nothing to do with the hardness of the water or your baby's development in other respects.

If when your baby is a year old he still has no teeth, some abnormality should be sought as the cause. This might be a deficiency of vitamin D, iodine or thyroid function.

HARTFORD (AP)—It was a foul, rainy day, and a lot of the buildings were really not ready for visitors, but Gov. John Dempsey's glimpse of the New York World's Fair has convinced him it will be a solid success.

Dempsey attended the official opening of the fair yesterday, along with numerous other governors.

After viewing the parade in which the Governor's Foot Guard marched, he and the other dignitaries had a limited opportunity to visit some of the exhibits.

Dempsey estimated that the New England building, which now is receiving finishing touches, will be complete in every respect within two weeks. Asked if the threatened civil rights demonstration had hampered his movements, the governor replied: "We had no trouble getting in or out."

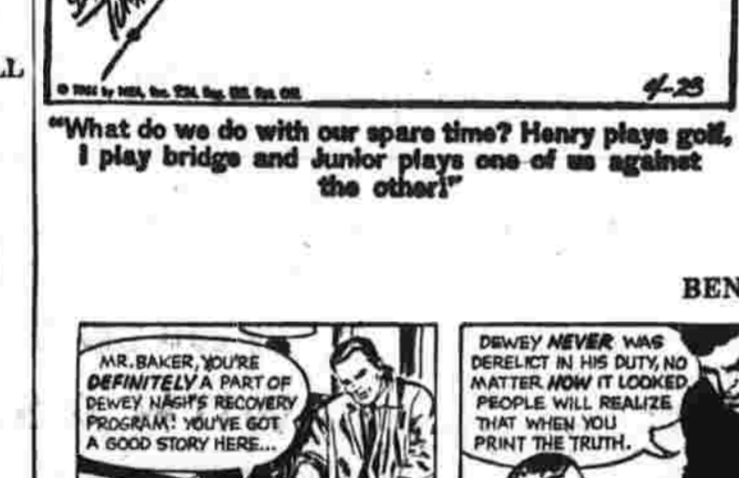
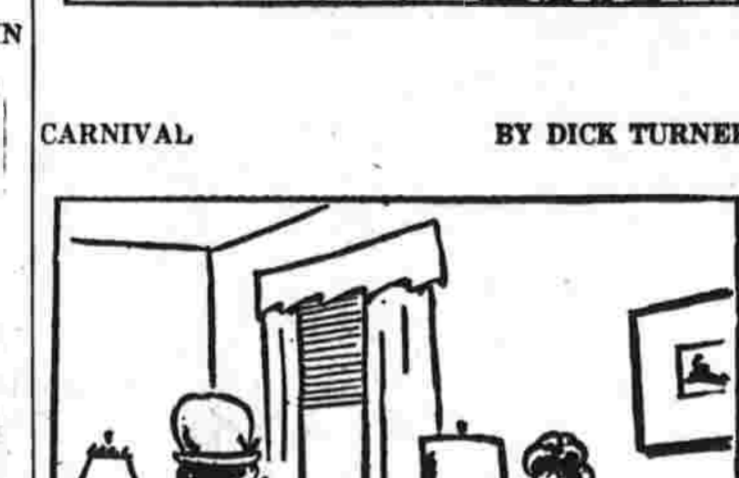
