



Town Planning Further Use Of Data Process Service

Encouraged by its experience with data processing for compilation of a motor vehicle tax list, the town is planning to extend use of computer service to making up other tax abstracts and to billing for water and sewer charges.

Thus far, under contract with Data Processing Corp. of Hartford, Town Assessor P. Joseph Murphy has received a list of the names and addresses of all motor vehicle owners showing the assessed values of their vehicles.

The list is 517 pages long and there are almost 20,000 entries in it. Before data processing, the list would have been compiled and typed from cards provided by the State Motor Vehicle Department.

This is the way it was worked under the new system:

1. Data Processing Corp., a private systems firm, picked up from the State Motor Vehicle Department magnetic tapes of the works will have to be done in the Municipation of the names and addresses of all motor vehicle and their vehicles.

For Murphy, one big value of data processing has been that it cut out (for the MV list at least) the arduous process of proceduring an abstract by type-writer, a job which always had to get started early in the assessor's sequence of duties. 

The real reason the possibility of a new canal is being explored is not that we have had trouble with Panama. But it is easier, of course, not to go in with the flag at all than it is to hoist it down once it has been raised some place. And it is easier to offer another nation something voluntarily than to yield the same thing somebody who demands it and threatens you if you don't. Let us at least be grateful for the fact that the world does seem to grow intelligent and civilized, even if by great risks and pains. We now apparently know how a great canal joining countries, continents, and oceans should be built.

The Law Is For Stassen Too

There is always some trouble and doubt, even in a democracy, as to whether the law applies on either extreme of the scale of importance and power. Stassen for a place on the

> Republican primary ballot. Mr. Stassen, the individual for whom all this vast and towering prestige of the law has now interfered, is surely just about the very least of all the political figures now on the national scene.

Surely, it seems to make little practical difference to the Republican party, or to any of the other candidates in the field, if Stassen makes or fails to make his legal entry into the California con-

Surely, if there is any figure on the political scene who could easily be treated with contempt and brushed aside as of no consequence, it is this same Stassen, who began being something of a freak way back in 1956, and who, in 1964, has been getting so few votes in the contests he has managed to enter that it would have been better for his prestige not to have received any at all. Yet the law is now going to play its part to see that even this forlorn hoper

isn't unfairly or too hastily deprived of what may be his legal right to run in one more contest. This is the law, at least for once,
