

## Communist Schism Throws Shadow on May Day Festivities

The Communist world held its annual May Day rites today with massive outpourings of people in Moscow and Peking and the usual tough talk about the inevitability of communism. But the great schism between the Soviet Union and Red China cast its shadow over the gala celebrations. The Soviets refused to attend the Peking rally and withdrew an invitation to a Chinese labor delegation to view the annual parade in Moscow's Red Square. East Germany, Bulgaria, Hungary and Czechoslovakia joined the Soviets in their boycott of the Peking festivities. Many non-Communist countries also held May Day celebrations to honor their labor force. But there were few such activities in the United States, where labor's big holiday occurs in September. The Soviet Union unveiled a new anti-aircraft twin rocket during a parade through Red Square in which tens of thousands of soldiers and workers marched. Western observers said the 20-foot rocket appeared to be for field use against planes at medium or low altitudes. Standing by Premier Khrushchev atop Lenin's tomb, Soviet Defense Minister Marshal Rodionov Y. Malinovsky warned that the Soviets are strong enough to smash any attacking imperialist state. Algeria's President Ahmed Ben Bella and an array of government officials and visitors were on the reviewing stand. Red China's Premier Chou En-lai told a reception for 1,300 foreign visitors on the eve of the big rally in Peking's main square that his country would win its quarrel with the Soviet Union and other Communist critics. Boasting of China's new strength, Chou also lashed out against the United States. Chou urged the peoples of Asia and Latin America to rally together and said: "The united front against U.S. imperialism is steadily expanding and we shall unite ever more closely and continue for the victory of our common cause." The giant square was decorated with huge portraits of Mao Tse-tung, Marx, Engels, Lenin and Stalin. Communist Chinese gunners halted their on-off artillery bombardment of the offshore Nationalist Chinese islands. The East German Communists marked May Day with a massive military parade in East Berlin. About 300,000 West Berliners attended a trade union rally on their side of the wall. They heard speeches by Chancellor Ludwig Erhard and West Berlin Mayor Willy Brandt. The theme of the Western rally was freedom, peace and German unity. The only marchers were unarmed trade unionists who converged on the square in five long columns. Absent this year from the East German celebration were the threats against West Berlin that have been a feature of past May Days. Speaking before the parade, Alfred Neumann, a member of the politburo, said his regime would do all possible to reduce tension with West Germany. The Soviet Union's independent Communist ally, Yugoslavia, displayed rockets for the first time in its Belgrade parade be-



## Renewal Model on Display Tomorrow

Edward Rybenyk, the executive director of the Manchester Redevelopment Agency (MRA), looks over a scale model of the North End urban renewal area as it could appear after redevelopment. The model, along with architectural drawings, site and school plans, will be featured at an exposition titled "Tomorrow in North Manchester." It will be held tomorrow from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Whitton Library Auditorium on N. Main St. The model shows scale construction of a proposed apartment cluster of about 30 units, a landscaped shopping center, off-street parking, a Colonial-style professional or Post Office Building, and the new wing planned by the Board of Education for the Robertson School, also in the renewal area. Existing structures around the area are modeled to scale as well, to show their relationship with the project area. The entire layout, more than four feet square, was prepared for the MRA by Norman S. Brakman, Model Makers Inc., of New York City, for about \$3,500. The cost of the construction of the model is part of the overall project cost, now being paid by the Federal government, but eventually to be shared with the town, assuming the project is approved. Total project cost is expected to top \$2.2 million; the town's immediate cash share comes to about \$120,000, with additional credit being allowed for other money spent by the town in the renewal area. Besides the apartment and commercial areas, the renewal plans call for sites for light in-

## UN Toughens in Cyprus After Meek First Moves

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The U.N. command has moved toward a policy of peace with muscle in Cyprus. The sterner attitude emerged after U.N. prestige tottered amid a worldwide cry: "Why can't they stop the fighting?" U.N. troops took firm action in the field after U.N. officials from Secretary-General U Thant downspoke with a new note of toughness. At stake is the image of peacemaker the U.N. acquired on delicate missions in Palestine, Egypt and the Congo (Korea was another matter). On March 27, British and Canadian, plus some Irish, Finnish and Swedish troops, were entrusted by the U.N. Security Council with the task of restoring order on the Mediterranean island while diplomats sought a way to get the Greek and Turkish Cypriots to live in harmony. Why, until the last few days, did the U.N. force play a meek role while Greek and Turkish Cypriots continued to kill each other? One main reason was that countries which sent soldiers didn't want them needlessly exposed to fire. The situation deteriorated to the point where a mob of Turkish Cypriots stoned the car of the U.N. commander, Indian Lt. Gen. Prem Singh Gyani, last Sunday. And for four days, with no tangible restraint from the U.N., Greek Cypriots waged an obviously well prepared assault on St. Hilarion castle, main Turkish Cypriot bastion in northern Cyprus. With the St. Hilarion offensive, the U.N. role was plunged into crisis. Opposition Leader John Diefenbaker cried out to "Thant. So did the United States and Turkey. Diplomats familiar with the background list a number of factors that contributed to the poor early showing in Cyprus. First of all, the assignments are different. The current Middle East force went to the Sinai Desert and the Egyptian-administered Gaza strip after the 1956 Israeli and British-French invasions of Egypt as a police force to keep the Egyptians and Israelis in their own defined territories. The Congo U.N. force was set up as an army and authorized to use force if necessary. On Cyprus, U.N. forces operated during the first month un-

## Lady Astor, 84, Said Near Death

LONDON (AP) — Nancy Lady Astor, the Virginia beauty whose tongue became the terror of the British House of Commons, was reported near death today. She is 84. "My mother is sinking fast," said her son, the third Viscount Astor. Relatives were called to her bedside at Grimsthorpe Castle, the Lincolnshire home of her daughter, Lady Ancestor. Lady Astor was the first woman to enter the British Parliament — in 1919, as member for Plymouth. "I love politics and I love a fight," she once said. She had plenty of both. Women's rights were her. ## Murders Probed For Race Motive

NEW YORK (AP) — Police assigned to the fatal stabbing of two white women investigated the possibility today that some militant young Negroes are assaulting whites from a racial motive. They arrested two youths in the stabbing Wednesday of a white woman, proprietress of a Harlem clothing store and said one had admitted slaying a white woman social worker in Harlem on April 11. The proprietress was Magit Sugar, 45, a Hungarian refugee, and the social worker was Eileen A. Johnston, 28, formerly of Elgin, Ill. Police said the two youths also would be questioned in the Harlem slayings of two white men — David L. Watts, 39, a Bible reader who was the only white member of a Negro church congregation; and Jules Bulgach, 71, a fruit peddler. Both were stabbed to death. Watts on March 23 and Bulgach last Oct. 21. Police earlier had described the slayings as senseless. No robbery was involved. An unidentified detective was quoted by the New York Times today as saying police were investigating a number of recent Harlem killings and assaults that "seemed to be the work of racists." The two youths arrested on homicide charges brought to five the number picked up in the clothing store killings. All are Negroes. The detective said a police informant had definitely identified the first three youths arrested as members of the militant Black Muslim movement. He said this information combined with previous investigation of possible ties between militant groups and a number. (See Page Three)

## Rockville Youth Held In Sniper Shootings

A Rockville youth who police say terrorized a Vernon family of four for two nights by shooting into their home was arrested last night with a rifle and ammunition in the vicinity of the house. Charles H. Avery, 17, of 118 1/2 Grove St. was charged by Vernon police officials with firing a .22 caliber rifle into the home of the William Fagans of Overbrook Dr. last Monday and Wednesday. Police said Avery hid in a heavily wooded area in back of the house while he fired several shots through kitchen and bathroom windows. Chief Constable Edmund F. Dwyer and Constable Edwin F. Carlson stated that the Fagan home for two hours last night before the arrest was made at 9:15. Chief Dwyer said that when the youth was arrested he carried a .22 caliber rifle, owned by his father, and three rounds of high speed long ammunition. The chief said Avery, a Rockville High School student, readily admitted firing into the house. Police declined comment on the motive for the attacks. When arrested, the youth was carrying the rifle, disassembled, in a paper bag, police said. According to police, the youth traveled each time from Rockville to the rural housing development by bus. Police said the shots fired Monday smashed through storm and regular windows. The bullet fired into the bathroom went through the bathroom wall, and finally stopped in a hall wall. The shot fired into the kitchen stopped in a metal strip. Wednesday the shots went through the same windows. The bullet entering the kitchen window went through a Venetian blind and came to rest in the kitchen wall. Upon the advice of police, blankets were placed over the. (See Page Three)

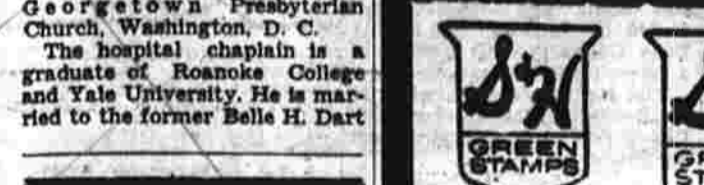
