Columbia Land Near Porter School Selling at \$1,000 an Acre

A price of \$1,000 per acre has been posted by Mrs. Louise Smith who owns land in back of Horace Porter School.

At the time of the school study, recently completed by Dr. Charles Seaborn, chief of the Bureau of School Buildings, it was recommended that an additional eight to 10 acres be acquired to enlarge the present site of seven acres.

Mrs. Smith has also requested that a suitable chain-link fence be installed adjoining her property. It has been estimated that the cost of clearing the land, mostly wooded, would be about \$400 per acre.

The school building committee has been told that it will cost approximately \$500,000 for an addition of seven classrooms, a library, four instruction rooms (special), multi-purpose room, two kindergarten rooms, offices and teachers' section and restrooms to the present facilities.

The present building committee will have a capacity of 270 and the kindergarten can accommodate 100 children.

No decision has been made pending further study of the problem. The next meeting of the committee is June 4.

Rockville-Vernon Samuel Allen Named Building Inspector

Samuel P. Allen of 35 Grove St. was unanimously selected building inspector at a meeting of the city council last night. Allen is presently clerk of the works for the Rockville Housing Authority's elderly housing project. He placed second out of a field of 11 applicants who survived a written examination held by state authorities. Allen's selection was proposed by Alderman Joseph Knick, chairman of the committee. Allen will resign his present post and assume office June 1. Mayor Leo E. Ryan Jr. administered the oath of office effective the first of the month.
