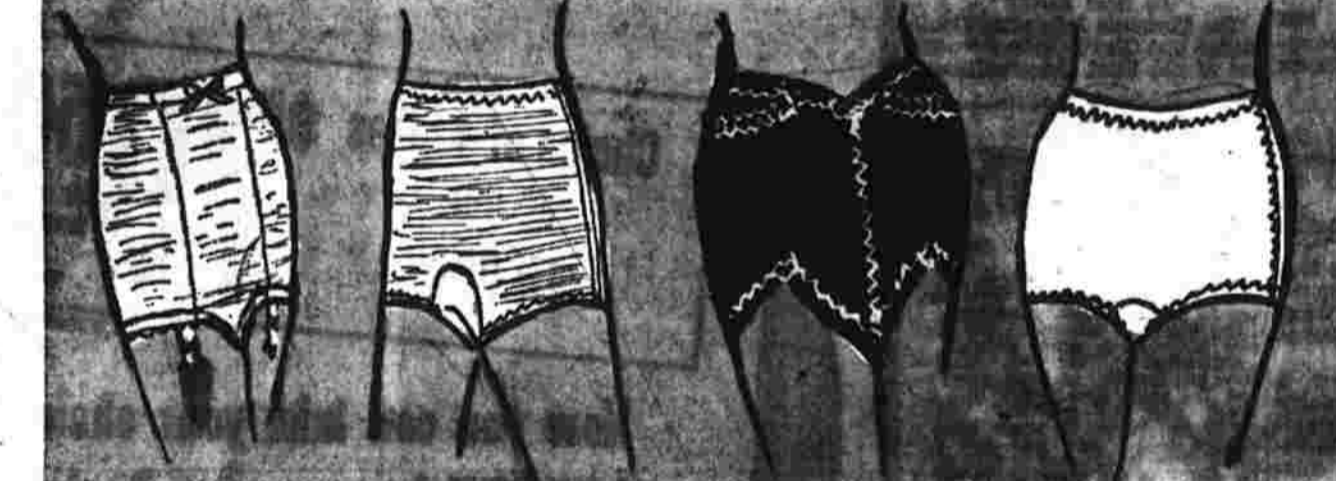

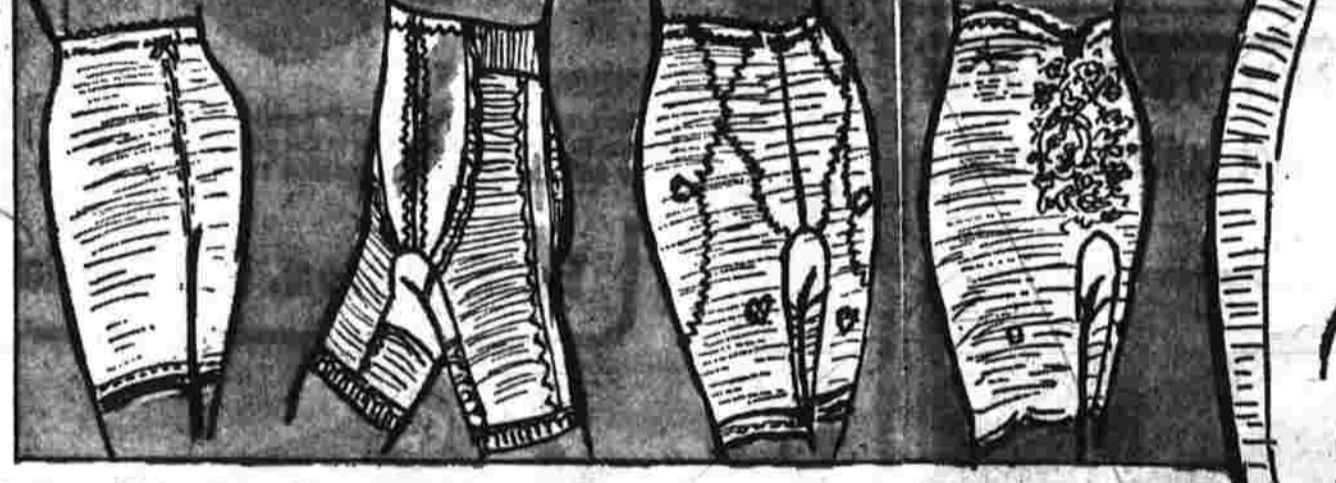

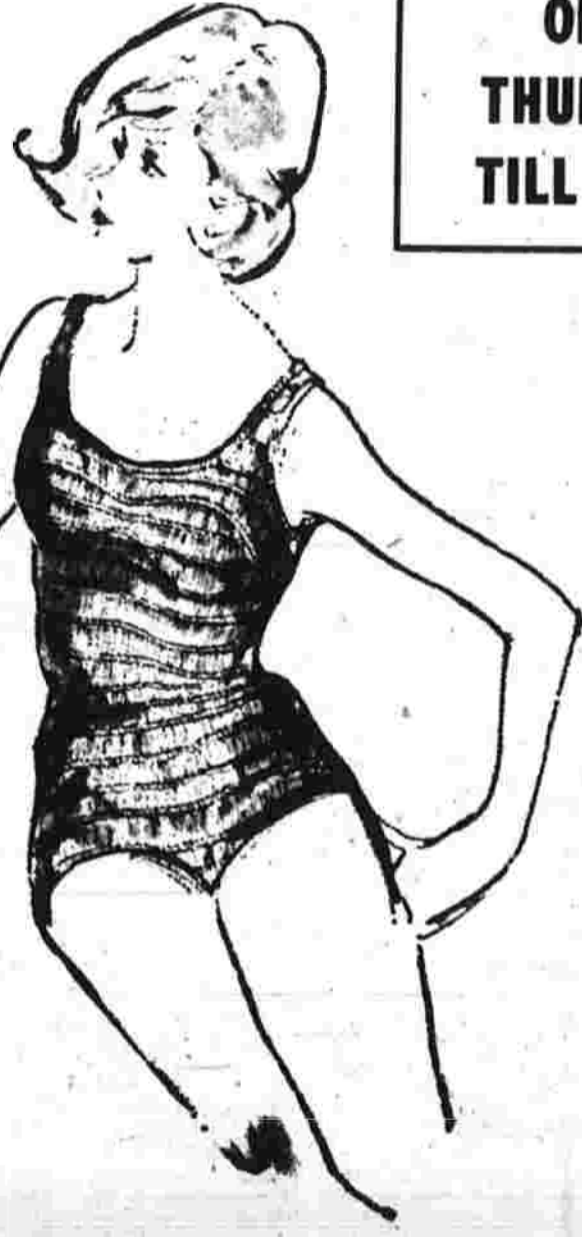

### Rec Audit Referred To General Manager

After a conscientious three-hour review, the board of directors agreed last night to turn the special audit of the town recreation department—initiated last year after the town's annual audit revealed bookkeeping irregularities in the department—over to General Manager Richard Martin for implementation.

The review, which could have become a political football, under the indirect leadership of Democratic Director Robert Stone became a reasoned inquiry into the meaning of the audit.

Stone, who said he was only trying to straighten out the audit in his own mind, sought explanations from auditor Robert Macri of a vaguely worded report, then asked Recreation Superintendent James Herdic to straighten out the audit with his knowledge of recreation department practices.

Herdic in reply acknowledged some of the criticisms, reported some efforts to revise department bookkeeping procedures as a result of the audit investigation, and admitted his inability to explain some of the irregularities.

Republican Director Francis DellaPera asked Macri to clarify whether the irregularities noted were indicative of dishonesty on the part of department officials. Macri replied that the auditors' objections were based on the poor bookkeeping procedures, and did not necessarily imply any dishonesty.

The only practice clearly denounced at the meeting was recorded by a purchase order for recreation equipment costing a total of more than \$1,000. The town charter requires all purchases of \$1,000 or more be let out for competitive bidding, yet, according to the audit, the recreation department placed consecutive orders the same day for similar goods for more than \$1,000—by splitting the order into two parts each at less than \$1,000.

Macri said the split order was "in our estimation an attempt to circumvent the \$1,000 bid minimum."

Town Counsel Atty. Irving Aronson added, "I would say it was a direct violation of the charter."

Democratic Director Theodore Powell, noting that some of the nine recommendations included in the special audit have already been followed, put the responsibility for correcting the irregularities on General Manager Martin's hands.

"I don't think it is our responsibility to institute the changes," he said. "The focus in the head of the recreation department; the changes must be made with the knowledge of the general manager, who is responsible for all of the town departments."

In reply to a question from Mayor Francis Mahoney, Macri said he estimated the auditor's recommendation could be put into effect by the beginning of the coming fiscal year, although he said he would also back some changes in the details of the recommendations.

DellaPera also questioned the auditors last night about the scope of the audit. He said the study was authorized last December—Macri estimated that it would take about three months to complete—no terms for payment were agreed upon.

Macri said last night that he could not estimate the cost of the audit study. Richard Barry, the senior partner of the auditing firm Barry, Macri & Co., added that "We don't know what the state tax commissioner will order us to do" as a result of the audit.

The audit was undertaken in December partially to satisfy the state tax commissioner's office, which oversees municipal audits. At the time, the state had not issued final approval of the regular town audit until a detailed audit was completed. The Herald, a spokesman for the tax commissioner's office this morning said that the special audit had been received and accepted, and will be referred to the commissioner's office today or Friday.

The commissioner will decide whether the audit itself indicates signs of "fraud or embezzlement"; should irregularities be found, the matter would be turned over to the Hartford County state's attorney for investigation.

If the audit is judged not to indicate wrongdoing, the town's standing with the tax commissioner's office can be cleared if the town can assure the state that corrective action is being taken, the spokesman said.

In answer to Stone's questions, many of the criticisms the audit levels at the recreation department turned out to be related.

For example, in separate sections the report criticized:

- The fact that the recreation department maintains its own soda vending machines, without turning over 12½ percent to the General Fund.
- The fact that the department maintains a petty cash fund with more than \$1,000 at various times, which is spent outside the usual disbursement channels.
- The fact that the recreation department paid directly for cost of banquets for the recreation department athletic league participants without going through the town.

WORCESTER, MASS. (AP)—John Wendelken of Hoboken, N. J., has been elected captain of the 1964 Holy Cross varsity baseball team. The versatile athlete also is co-captain of the basketball squad. Wendelken was honored by his teammates after the Crusaders beat Boston College, 3-1, Saturday and completed a two-game sweep over their arch rival.

Simpson ordered authorities to allow peaceful and orderly demonstrations "at any hour during the night." There had been no restrictions imposed on daylight activities.

Simpson held that the ban on demonstrations would be unlawful freedom of assembly and speech, freedom of redress of grievances.

The judge, in a blistering opinion and order, later directed authorities to reduce bail for 23 demonstrators and to abandon any unusual or cruel confinement.

3. Inconsistent handling of purchases made for the recreation department. Herdic said the purchasing procedures have been reorganized.

4. A lack of backup material to support payroll payments to recreation department employees. Herdic said the department use of time sheets is to be tightened.

5. Poor security for vending machine receipts. Herdic said the department is in the process of correcting the situation.

6. Some recreation personnel are not being paid through normal pay channels, and are not screened before employment as are other town personnel. Herdic said no action has been taken to correct the situation. General Manager Martin added that the system will be changed when the new fiscal year begins.

7. Cash reporting and cash handling facilities are not separate. Herdic said no action has yet been taken, but Martin added a revision in the cash handling procedures will be referred to the collector of revenues for approval.

8. Concessions at town recreation facilities are not awarded on bids. The concessions at two town pools will be awarded on a bid basis this year for the first time.

Perhaps they do tend to gravitate toward the giant corporations because they feel safer there in the shelter of their wings than fighting for dominance in smaller and riskier firms.

But it is easier to give good advice than it is to give good example.

What middle-aged man, looking back at his own experience, can knock a young college man with a specialized skill for signing up with a big corporation? If that corporation is offering him anywhere from up to \$600 a month, more a month, and a fringe of benefits, the young man is not likely to be deterred.

The encouraging thing about young college graduates now is that they are good in their fields, they can usually not only find a job—they can have their pick of several jobs.

This gives youth self-confidence, and there is nothing youth needs more.

How much more hopeful and assured they must feel than the youth of a generation ago.

Then the college student clung desperately to his alma mater, and on graduation day he had to be thrown kicking and screaming into life. For the world then, beyond the ivory tower was an economic jungle, where nobody seemed to help him and there was nothing for his services.

Marriage was virtually impossible because he could find no job to support himself, let alone a wife and children.

Bill vivid in my own memory is a fraternity ball session at the University of Missouri in the spring of 1922. Some of the graduating crop of that year were discussing how much of a guaranteed monthly income they'd settle for if they could sign up for it then and be sure of getting it the rest of their life.

Some held out for \$200 a month. Most were willing to settle for \$200. That's how panicky they were—and how hungry they were for any form of economic security.

We had to scrounge around and take whatever came along. In my own case, with two college degrees, the best I could do was to pass out handbills for my father that summer advertising bargains in his grocery store.

It took me three years after graduation to get a job that paid \$100 a month. It was 11 years before I worked up to \$400 a month, the figure many college men start at now.

Maybe Joe College, class of '64, is a bit braver and more independent, less cowardly, and more demanding of a better world than his frightened counterpart of only a generation ago. As the hope of tomorrow, he is better off than we ever were in our fear-ridden day.

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### The Doctor Says

WILSON FLAQUE CHILDREN AS WELL AS BUSINESSMEN

Ucers, once considered the monopoly of beleaguered businessmen, are plaguing children. Pediatric ulcers are more common in infants and children than was formerly believed because it is much harder to recognize in children than in adults. A child, unfortunately, cannot always describe his symptoms accurately. Also, pediatric ulcers symptoms always vary with age.

Often there are no symptoms until a complication such as perforation of the ulcer through the wall of the stomach, intestine or through a large blood vessel occurs. If a blood vessel is perforated there will be a massive hemorrhage through the bowels or vomiting of blood. Several factors contribute to the cause of peptic ulcers in children. They are seen more often in children with parents who have had ulcers. They appear to be commoner in those whose blood group is O. Boys are afflicted about six times as frequently as girls.

As with adults, ulcers may follow extensive burns, treatment with the corticosteroid drugs, malnutrition or a serious debilitating disease. Children are usually more high-strung than their playmates and they often harbor hostile feelings that they may not show. They have a stronger tendency to need for praise and affection.

Although X-ray examination should be used in the diagnosis, the results are often less definite in a child than in an adult. However, once diagnosis is made, treatment is the same as that with an adult. One child was cured when his father arranged to spend more time with him. Whatever the factors are that make the child tense, they should be found and corrected. When medical or surgical measures are required they are the same as for an adult with an ulcer.

### Polly's Pointers

**DEAR POLLY**—Many of the pointers have become habits with our family. Here's one for you: Put a headband around your neck BEFORE rolling up your hair on the large roller. When set, pull the headband up around the bottom rollers at the neck, ears and forehead. Keeps the rollers from drooping. This is especially good if you have wavy hair. —MRS. F. A. T.

**DEAR POLLY**—Threads from old nylon stockings are useful for mending things. Pull out some of the threads in a discarded one and wind on a Johnson spool. Select several shades and use the thread that matches best to mend other usable hose that might have small tears. This thread is also excellent for mending nylon, dacron and all kinds of knitwear. Try it on wool. The threads blend beautifully. —MRS. E. T. GILLES

**DEAR POLLY**—This is NOT a joke. Those of you who want to "distress" furniture can do as professional cabinet makers and bang the piece with tire chains. Like silverware drawers with hammers to abrade the moisture from "quicker" drying. —MRS. E. T. GILLES

**DEAR POLLY**—We always seem to have a clothes hanger shortage. Often the hooks would break off of metal hangers which was very annoying until I came up with the idea of slipping the hanger over the hook of another hanger, thus providing space for the hanging of two garments such as a skirt and blouse that would be worn at the same time. One hook would fit on both hangers. I worked as a secretary for years and found it most annoying to pull out the desk drawer every time I needed a paper clip. Our clips came small boxes of 100 each so I removed the lid from a new box, rolled elastic gummed tape around my fingers, put the tape on the bottom of the box and pressed it on the table beside my typewriter. Each time I need a clip it was at my fingertips. The tape held the box in place. —MRS. L. E. E.

**DEAR POLLY**—If you would like to wear your pants or other bands under a dress or sweater collar and find the slings too short, tuck a sweater guard and clip to both ends of the band. —M. D.
