

The general theory is that Joe College has the idea that the mere possession of a sheepskin with his name on it is an automatic passers to a cushy tob. with his name on it is an automatic passport to a cushy job
and a lifetime of guaranteed security, if not downright ease.

Perhaps college graduates today are a bit too brash as they
leave the campus for the more
competitive world of industry.

Perhaps they do tend to gravitate toward the giant corporations because they feel safer
there in the shelter of bigness
than fighting for dominancy in than fighting for dominancy i smaller and riskler firms. But it is easier to give good advice than it is to give good

example. What middle-aged man, looking back at his own experience, can knock a young college man with a specialized skill for signing up with a big corporation—
if that corporation is offering
him anywhere from up to \$600
or more a month, to start?

The encouraging thing about
young college graduates now is
that they come out into a world. hat they come out into a world which, by and large, has a place for them and wants them. If they are good in their fields, they can usually not only find a ob they can have their pick of

This gives youth self-confidence, and there is nothing youth needs more. How much more hopeful and youth of a generation ago!.

Then the college student clung desperately to his alma mammy, and on graduation day he had to be thrown kicking and screaming into life. For the world then, beyond the ivory tower was an economic jungle where nobody seemed to want him and there was nothing for

A great depression gripped the land, and the fearful young fel-low found no industrial talent scouts standing in line to bid for his services. Marriage was virtually impossible because he could find no job to support himself, let alone a wife and children. Still vivid in my own memory is a fraternity bull session at the University of Missouri in the spring of 1932. Some of the graduating crop of that year were discussing how much of a guar-anteed monthly income they'd ettle for if they could sign up for it then and be sure of getting it the rest of their life. Some held out for \$250 month. Most were willing to set-tle for \$200. That's' how panicky they were—and how hungry for security, any form of economic security. We had to scrounge around

and take whatever came along. n my own case, with two co lege degrees, the best I could lo was to pass out handbills for my father that summer adverising bargains in his grocery store. It took me three years after graduation to get a job that paid \$100 a month; it was 11 years before I worked up to \$400 a month, the figure many college men start at now.

Maybe Joe College, class of '64, is a bit brash and cocky about his prowess and his prospects. More power to him!

Certainly he is more independent, less cowardly, and more demanding of a better world than his frightened counterpart of only a generation ago. As the hope of tomorrow, he is better hope than we ever were in our fear-ruled day.

### More Hindeight Than Hope

in the aftermath of Goldwater's cruial victory in California, a large segment of the Republican leadership agonises and accuses, but nothing comes forward to suggest that an organized move to halt Goldwater's march toward he presidential nomination will devel-

Indeed nothing is left for the moderate Republican to grasp beyond the hope that a platform can be welded which will not reflect the most extreme Goldwater views. It is to this point, presumably, that the Republican governors address themselves where they are gathered in Cleveland.

From the point of view of those who regard a Goldwater candidacy as a danperous thing, it seems that heroes and villains emerge almost hourly from the sonference and press talk. Gov. Rockefeller comments acidly to

he effect that anti-Goldwater sentiment could better have rallied behind him when he was conducting the fight alone than to seek futile expression too

leading a last-ditch battle against the Arisona conservative, then mysteriousby backs away to Rockefeller's further sonsternation and to Gov. Romney's as

performance comes the report of still another apparent vacillation—that of former President Eisenhower. Eisenhower presumably gave Scranton some hope of endorsement in a stop-Goldwater move, then withdrew, perhaps because professional strategists felt it was too

Now from Gov. Romney, comes word that at the urging of Former Vice President Nixon and others, he is considering the possibility of seeking the nomination to give the Republican party a "clear choice" between modern Repub-Meanism and Goldwater.

But Goldwater, at this point certainly, has the delegate votes. The other part of the Republican party has more hindmight than hope.

### Big Struggles

Moscow and Peking are fencing on such far-flung fronts as Hong Kong and Czechoslovakia in further illustration of the petty stuff of which titanic struggles are made.

Hong Kong, of course, gives Khrushshev a delightful device to twit Mao with whenever the Chinese get under his skin. He can always remind Peking about the "imperialist" outpost on its very doorstep. Recently two Pravda correspondents

were dispatched to the British Crown Colony to see what mischief they could find to lay to the People's Republic. They found damning evidence that the Chinese are "cooperating" with British authorities in a move to get anti-Soviet literature into and through Hong Kong. The Pravda men say the tracts some on Chinese merchant ships and customs officials turn the other way, ignoring an official ban on propaganda, both communist and anti-communist.

Such an affront to revolutionary unity, bad as it is, might be excused even in the rigid communist ethic as an instance of human frailty.

But the correspondents also found, they dutifully report, that Chinese Communists are capitalistically investing in such private businesses as restaurants and banks, thus helping the British and Americans to exploit the working class-Meanwhile in Czechoslovakia, Moscow

is having some trouble in the ranks, and the Chinese are not passing up the opportunity to twist the knife a bit.

The Slovaks, who have a separate party identification to begin with-The Slovak Communist Party-have grown opatient with what they feel is domination from Prague and as a consequence have been granted a measure of athority to legislate questions "which different handling in Slovakia.

Thus the Czech communist leadership has given the Slovaks in some small degree a tacit recognition of some kind of nationalism. And the Chinese have not passed up the opportunity to criticise he move on ideological grounds. Peking has asked that votes be cast

for "unswerving Marxist-Leninists." which means pro-Peking candidates, the coming Czech election. It seems impossible to believe that

our own little disagreements with our allies and semi-allies appear so picayune when they are set forth, but one cannot help but wonder.

### Caveat Unwrapper

Will the ingenuity of the unpackaging ublic remain equal to the genius of the ckaging experts, or will the layman fall farther and farther behind in the sophisticated art of wrapping until he is finally unable to free any merchandise from its prison?

One of the blessings of the old-fashoned bulk purchase, crude and sometimes unsanitary though it may have been, was that there was no struggle no sweat, figuratively or literally to extricate the stuff you bought once you

Nowadays, however, the challenge for the buyer begins with the unraveling, unzipping, unfolding, push-pulling, tearing along dotted line, and pressing light-

As he approaches the task of liberating from its encasement a product new to him, the consumer must first off determine whether he is confronted with the kind of container which at some crucial point in the process bursts open and spews the contents helter-skelter, or the kind which holds on until the last shred of wrapping barbarically tors

It is as important for him to know how not to open as it is to know how to open. It is usually after he rips off the blue gizmo that he sees the instruction not to rip off the blue gizmo which conveniently reseals the package for storage. What then?

One of the most frustrating of the packaging techniques is the one which entraps a small piece of hardware under a plastic bubble fused to a display card

The device was got up, no doubt, to thwart shoplifters who can't filch mounted gadgets so easily as they can unmounted ones thrown in a bin. But, in the final analysis, it is the shopped who

The plastic bubble usually refuses to respond to anything less lethal than a scalpel. The bold and strong try simply to rent the whole asunder. The result is usually that everything gives but the bubble which holds its prey, maddeningly visible but still inaccessible.

Then, of course, there are times when the plastic does come free, peeling off with it most of the printed matter on the isplay card which the consumer must read in order to use what he bought. He then takes some of the mucilage—if he an unpackage it and tries to paste the irections back to legibility.

What a pleasure it is to walk into n old-fashioned hardware and say to the clerk, "I'd like a dozen inch-and-apuarter, number eight, flat-head wood screws, please."

He takes them out of a box, counts them as they awkwardly bounce around is palms, and puts them into a little incomplicated paper bag.

Aldridge was using files belonging to he state, from which he took informaon which was of value to an independ nt appraiser who was doing state work. this, the appraiser paid Aldridge ee. All this, according to the Highway Department, is allowable; the files are open to the public, the work is done in "spare time," and there is no conflict

This in our opinion is not enough. For state employees to take on outside obs for people with whom they must ieal, however indirectly in their official capacity is wrong. The special, knowedge which these employees have gained n their jobs, and their special facility with the files should not be available to outsiders for a price or to themselver for profit. The line is too fine and the tential conflict too constant. And what les are open in the normal "spare time hours of state employees anyway

Especially in the Highway Department, where funds and contracts are he largest and possibilities for corruption the most obvious, no such ambivalence should be allowed. These are servants of the people and they are paid a reasonable salary. They should not augment their incomes this way. -MERIDEN REGORD

Congo Faces Strife When **UN Departs** 

By ROBIN MANNOCK LEOPOLDVILLE, the Congo (AP)-Lights burn late at U.N. headquarters in Leopoldville. Senior officers of the world organization's Congo army wear panization's Congo army wear harassed and even guilty looks. The Congo apparently is heading for dark and violent days, but they are getting out. By June 30, the Congo's fourth independence day, the last of 3,405 U.N. soldiers from 12 nations will have gone home, their job finished.

Finished?

In Kivu, on the Congo's eastern border, Communist-backed pygmy-like Bafulero warriors routed five companies of Congolese soldiers and threatened Bukavu, the provincial capital.

To a large extent, the Congo's present woes are unfinished business. Four years of crisis-ridder independence have been to short solve deep-rooted tribal, political and economic questions. Add to this the bewilderment of the ordinary Congolese trying desperately to belong to the 20th century. All the wisdom of his tribal forebears means nothing

when he confronts the complex ities of modern society. Add to this a leadership cris that was inevitable the day this vast, rich nation was handed by its Belgian colonial rulers to 14 million people of whom less than a score had university degrees and even fewer any rea xperience of accepting responsibility.

Almost all observers are agreed that Adoula and some of his close collaborators have grown in political stature in battling for survival. But their measures to keep

the country affoat have been Congolese. 



## Doctor Says

Peptic ulcers are more com-on in infants and children than was formerly believed because it is much harder to recognize in children than in adults. A child, unfortunately, cannot always describe his symptoms accurately. Also, peptic ulcer symptoms always vary with age. Often there are no symptoms until a complication such as perforation of the ulcer through the wall of the stomach, intestine or through a large blood vessel occurs. If a blood vessel is perforated there may be a massive hemorrhage through

massive hemorrhage through the bowels or vomiting of blood.

the bowels or vomiting of blood.

Several factors contribute to the cause of peptic plears in children. They are seen more often in children with parents who have had ulcers. They appear to be commoner in those whose blood group is O. Boys are afflicted about six times as frequently as girls.

As with adults, ulcers may follow extensive burns, treatment with the cortisone group of drugs, malnutrition or a serious debilitating disease. These children are usually more highstrung than their playmates and they often harbor hostile feelings that they may not show. They have a stronger than average need for praise and affection.

Although X-ray examination ould be used in the diagnosis, e results are often less definite in a child than in an adult. However, once diagnosis is made, treatment is often easier than with an adult. One child was cured when his father arranged to spend more time with him. Whatever the factors are that make the child tense, they should be found and corrected. When medical or surgical measures are required they are the game as for an adult with an ulcer.

Q—For the last four months our 2 - year - old son makes sucking noises and seems to be sucking his tongue. We have tried ignoring him, scolding him and diverting his attention but nothing helps. Other habits he has outgrown.

Will be outgrow this?

A—Like thumb - sucking and other habits, this one will be outgrown if you don't call his attention to it. Scolding is more apt to aggravate the habit than to stop it. Diverting his attenion is fine if you are relaxed about it and if he does not connect your frantic efforts to distract him with his habit. Ignoring it is the best policy.
