The Doctor Says

PAINT TESTS REVEAL CLUES IN TRACING DOWN IRRITANT

By Wayne G. Brandstedt, M.D., Newspaper Enterprise Assn.
Q—Every time I wore a dark blue suit I bought last year, my legs broke out with a severely itching rash. I wrote to the manufacturer and he said that the material (wool and dacron) was handled daily by many employees and worn by thousands of customers without causing any reaction. Do you think my trouble was due to the material or the dye? Is there any way I can be immunized against the cause?

A—You should have your doctor make a patch test with small samples of wool of different colors and samples of dacron as well. This should narrow the cause down to one of the materials or to a dye. If the dye is at fault, ask the manufacturer to give you a complete list of its components. Then, if possible, you should have patch tests made with pieces of white cleansing tissue which each ingredient has been added. When you have discovered the specific cause it may be possible for your doctor to desensitize you—a tedious process at best—or you may be able to avoid further contact with the irritant.
