





As a member of the House from Illiois, Everett McKinley Dirksen began as nething of a Chicago Tribune conservtive who mellowed, as he seemed about retire from political office, toward uddle of the road Republicanism.

When, instead of retiring from politics, e took himself a promotion from House Senate, the mellowness of his tail end service in the House disappeared, and the w Dirksen who appeared as candidate or the United States Senate was a proprepresentative of the Chicago Tribune

In the 1952 Republican National Conntion, it was Dirksen who, as a floor ader for the forces of the late Robert A. Taft, delivered the celebrated taunt to om Dewey, in which he reminded the Yew York leader that the party had folowed him once and followed him twice, but was not about to follow him this time into the camp of Dwight D. Eisenlower. But it was Eisenhower who besame the choice of the convention, and who got elected, and who had the task of dealing with Senator William Knowand of California as his party's floor eader in the Senate, Knowland being nuch more formidable as a rock-bound onservative and much less of a chameleon than Dirksen.

We suppose the low point of Dirksen's public esteem came at the beginning of the present session of Congress, when more that it wanted him mouthing his mellifiuous platitudes on television, and when the programs he and his house sounterpart, Congressman Halleck, still groduced seemed likely to help the Demcrats more than the Republicans.

Then, gradually, Dirksen emerged as the one key man in all the Senate on the civil rights bill. The chameleon gradually began taking on the coloration of tatesman; he became the man who would decide and did decide to break the filibuster and procure passage of the

When the bill did pass, he had obtaind for his party at least equal credit for

That is to assemble a roomful of people who know the very least about a subject, and let them have at it. The less they know, the more brilliant they sound. The less they understand, the more passionate their argument. The farther they are from any conclusion or agreement, the more convincing the logic they devise for one an-

For good conversation, then, take group in the I.Q. range of 88, give them a subject with which they have as little previous acquaintance as possible, imitate the standards of Mensa only in the supply of gin and scotch available, and you will find that everybody has a whale of an evening.
