

War I still had something of a

Weather and work held people in thrall far more than they
do now; leisure was more for
the dead than the living.

When old-timers reminiscs. Most homes were heated by pot-beilied stoves or balky coal furnaces, the ashes from which had to be lugged out with mo-notonous regularity. People worked a 80- to 60-When a rug had to be cleaned it was hung on a line in the backyard and dust was spanked out with a beater. You didn't ride on power mowers; you cut the grass with

If you were wealthy enough to afford a car, you had to hand erank it to get the motor start-ed. The roads were so had you were lucky if you went 100 miles without a flat tire; if you did get a flat tire, you had to fix it yourself. Pensions were unheard of in most industries.

There were no electric washing machines. Wives had to souse the family's grimy duds in tubs, and launder them by hand or with a scrubbing brush on a ridged washboard.

Without was long and cold. Winters were long and cold; summers long and hot. The kitchen held no gleaming refrigerator. The pan under the icebox had to emptied daily. Wood-burning stoves were used in rural areas, and some-body in the household had to chop the wood.

After a hard day spent at other chores, mothers had to darn, often by lamplight, the menfolks' socks.

In addition to all their other woes, women had to lace themwoes, women had to lace themselves into corsets so tightly
they couldn't swallow a grape
without feeling uncomfortable.

It took almost as many days
to travel across the continent
by train as it now does hours

The first typical and almost inevitable monstration of what kind of "long hot ummer" this nation is about to have for tself has already arrived down in Missippl, the state young idealists and ivists from the North have chosen invade this summer in an effort to note wider exercise of their civil hts by the Negro population there. At the moment, three of these crusadrs from the North have disappeared. e automobile they were driving has een found, however, burned.

Whether the native resistance to their grusading stopped there, with what was ntended to be a scare, or proceeded to more serious violence, has not been determined at this writing.

But almost instantly it has had to become the responsibility and function of the whole federal government at Washngton to move into this situation, to ind the facts, to protect the lives if possible, to shut off the violence if possible,, o try to establish some guarantee that all the other crusading that is supposed to be on the way in Mississippi this summer can be conducted safely.

But that is, of course, just it. This kind of crusading cannot be conducted safely. It has probably been selected not only because it seems needed, but also because it does promise to involve danger and sacrifice. There is, undoubtedly, a crusading theory that the long hot summer is going to need its quota of slood, disappearing into that Southern

Maybe so. And certainly we cannot withhold admiration and sympathy for the young people who are, this summer, choosing this way of trying to serve their convictions and their civilization.

Yet there is, always, one nagging conmideration. It is that the element of invasion, the element of outside interference, probably doubles the passion and the recklessness of the native resistance Many of these crusaders who go South to do their good works undoubtedly live near or pass by conditions which could if faced honestly, prove even more challenging to their courage and even more difficult for their reforming zeal and

Going South to Mississippi is the easy way to ask for trouble, and the sure way to get it, and it is certain to be the kind of trouble no amount of force or patroling can possibly prevent. Perhaps that is what we need and what we have to have. But perhaps there could also be, in this long hot summer of ours, a more sonscientious effort to do the right thing a little less conspicuously, a little less far from home. We don't know, but we

### Why Lodge Returns

The "personal' reasons Henry Cabot Lodge may have for resigning his post in South Vietnam are almost certain to turn out to be all political. And some of the political reasons are

not likely to be clear cause for rejoicing. It can be assumed that one result of the end of Lodge's service in South Vietnam will be to extend greater freedom and license to the Republican campaigners of 1964

What the party which is outside likes to do during a presidential campaign year was illustrated in 1960 by the late John F. Kennedy's conduct on the issue of Cuba. The party out of power likes to howl that the party in power isn't being tough enough and bold enough.

The Republicans of 1964 are dying to egin saying this about the Kennedy-Johnson administration policies in South Vietnam, and now, for better or for worse, they have their freedom to begin the routine kind of attack.

It can hardly be for anything but the worse. There is enough trouble for us in outheast Asia now without any more rebranding at home; the Johnson addistration is close enough to rash action and rash commitment without having the Republicans needling it from the

Nevertheless; that would seem to be ine of Ambassador Lodge's "personal" reasons—to give his party and its cam-saigners, including a brother who is a candidate for the Senais in Connecticut, their freedom to taunt the Johnson a ministration with not being tough enough in Southeast Asia. Another of Ambassador Lodge's "per-

sonal" reasons may prove to be of more value to his party and his country. He has obviously determined to take whatever public sentiment moved toward him during the recent Republican presidential primaries and try to cash it n for some touch of influence on the deliberations of the Republican National Convention at San Francisco.

Ambassador Lodge was, in 1952, the organizational leader of the forces which brought Dwight D. Eisenhower and the party's nomination together. Ambassador Lodge was, in 1960, his party's choice for the nomination for vice president. In both instances, he was a champion for a modern, moderate kind of Republican party.

Now the old, recurrent party struggle is on once again. Ambassador Lodge finds it personally impossible for him to stay out of it. He now feels it personally necessary for him to get into the struggle and use what chance he has of helping to determine the outcome. And in this instance, then, the "personal" and the political aspects of his resignation would at least be consistent with his past fine record of service to his party and hir nation.


### Death: Head-On A head-on collision on the Connecticu Turnpike last week added six to the growing number of deaths caused by

automobiles crossing the median. Why drivers jump the dividing strip into the opposite lanes is unknown. Not enough of them survive to explain. It is possible to survive a sideswipe, a ramming of a stationary object or a bump from the rear. A head-on crash doubles the speed at the moment of impact. Death is almost certain.

This type of accident can be almost eliminated on the Turnpike. The erection of median barriers would be costly but they would save lives. It is hardly in the public interest to channel the highway funds into new projects when money spent on already built turnpikes would greatly reduce a condition that has turned out to be a death trap.

Representative Melvin Fennell of Fairfield has called on Governor Dempsey to install median barriers the length of the turnpike, immediately. The deaths in Greenwich, before the heavy traffic aummer season has begun, point to the urgency of the appeal. 





Astronomers Not Familiar In This World LOS ANGELES (AP) - You

have probably never met one. They're nocturnal, mostly, and dwell on mountain tops in silvery domes that open only at But they do come down int the cities occasionally, to greet their wives, kiss their kids and oick up fresh supplies. You could, conceivably, burn If you do and his clothes lool

a little rumpled, it's probably because he's been on him al night, neglected while he gazed at sights in time and space tha only his kind can see.

If you talk to him and his words have little meaning to you it's because he thinks in a poly-glot jargon of technical terms invented to convey ideas beyond the ken of ordinary mortals.

If he seems like he's from an other world — it's because that is what he deals with most of the time: Other words. But treasure the meeting you've just met a new kind of national hero. He's an astronomer.

The blazing dawn of the space age has thrown a sudden light of public recognition on this sav-ant of the night.

Once he wore black robes and peaked cap, and ordinary folk thought he could tell the future When it became a nations goal to rocket humans into the hostile environment of the moon and planets, only the astron-mer could plot the trajectories and guess what the explorers would encounter on their arrival. Before the space age opened with the launching of man-made satellites in 1957, the biggest single sum of money astronomers had ever been given to spend was \$6 million in private funds —the cost of the 200-inch telescope on Palomar Mountain in Southern California. Since 1957, some \$50 million in rovernment money has been granted by the National Science Foundation to Kitt Peak Nation al Observatory at Tucson, Ariz. and the National Radio Astrone

Observatory at Green Bank Even greater expenditures are planned for a new astronomical center being developed by five European nations and this country on the peaks of northern Chile. A few years ago discovery that the atmosphere of Mars was even thinner than supposed would have rated attention only in scientific journals. Today it wins headlings in newspapers all wins headlines in newspapers a over the world — because planned must be spent learning how to soft-land instruments and men safely on that most earth-like of planets.

When the huge telescope on Palomar Mountain 100 miles south of Los Angeles was opened to public view in 1948, nonpro-fessional visitors were rare. Last year more than 15,000 had

Last year more than 15,000 had a glimpse through the giant glass eye of light from objects traillions of miles away.

In 1957, the nation's universities counted 168 graduates in astronomy, by last year the number had risen to 524 and hundreds more were rejected for lack of facilities.

The star-gazer's formal training lasts as long as a physician's. Twenty years or more of study pass before he wins his doctorate. of study pass before he wins his doctorate.

The astronomer today must be a master of mathematics and physics.

He must also know geology and ehemistry, so he can understand the make-up of other plansets; blology and botany; electronics and engineering; the new science of nuclear energy, because the sun and other stars are hydrogen bombs in endless explosion; four to six foreign languages; and public affairs, because today he spends a great deal of public money and consequently is involved in politics.
