The Return Of Tahoma

The once-enforced exile of one Moise Tahoma, the one-time president of the Congo Province, of the Congo, is now ending. His prospective presence back in the Congo is being welcomed by the very politicians of the Congo government.

So it may be that, with the Central government needing him, and with Tahoma himself in a mood at last to play a part in uniting the country, he once tried to divide, the new African nation may get that clearer chance at freedom and stability which a kinder fate, or some more conscientious preparation of the country for its freedom, might have provided in 1960.

The Evolving Sparrow

All bird watchers should have been pleased to learn, from recent research, that the common house sparrow, which first got here in 1852 and which had, 50 years later, reached the West Coast, is undergoing an evolution even speedier, in its way, than this migration.

It is changing size and color at a surprising rate of speed, as these things are measured. Normally, the evolution of a new species takes place over a period of thousands of years, but in the case of the sparrow, it is taking place in a matter of months.

The normal, and mistaken, assumption, seems to be that if Senator Goldwater gets the nomination he will then try to become the candidate of sweetness and light, of ideological neutrality and respectability, of reassuring policy moderation. That is not likely to prove so. He has set the way he has come as far as that is concerned. He has risen among us as the apostle of the dark side of our national and human nature; he rouses and stimulates the passions among us; he conducts our puzzled deliberations with the shrewdness of the scorpion.

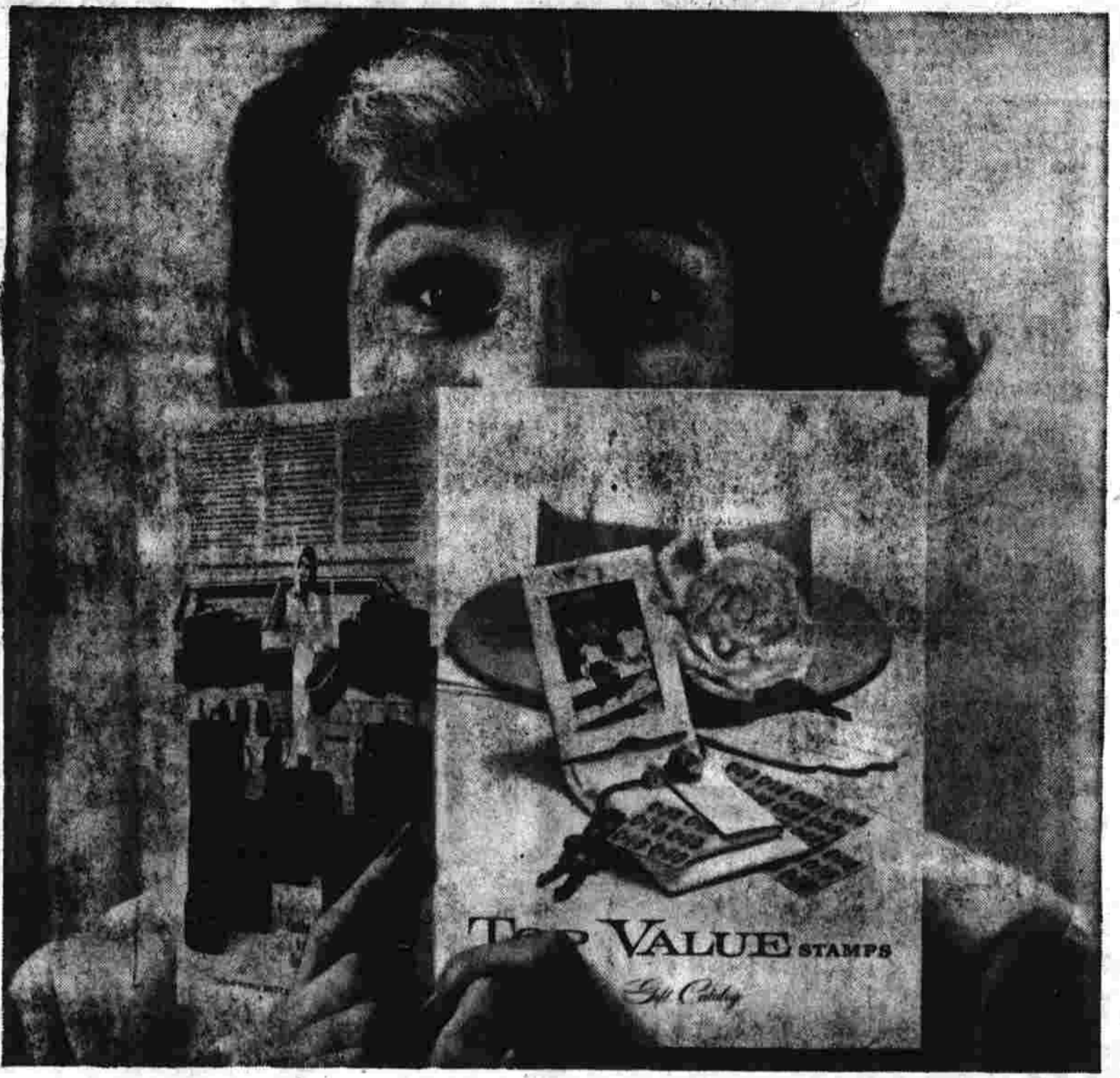

Central City Seeks Return Of Gambling

CENTRAL CITY, Colo. (AP)—Central City residents want legalized gambling in this renowned old mining camp—and they're determined that neither state nor Denver society is going to stop them.

At issue is the validity of a section of the Central City charter granted 100 years ago by Colorado's Territorial Legislature. It says that Central City may "license, restrain, regulate, prohibit and suppress tipping houses, gambling houses, bawdy houses and other disorderly houses."

But several state statutes prohibit gambling and prostitution, and the state has its own liquor laws. Whether gambling ever does return here depends on the outcome of a suit soon to be brought in court.

If Central City wins, it might even gain the right to have its own liquor laws. But gambling is the issue in the case, and it's supported by most of the community's 200 residents.

Gambling is opposed by the Central City Opera Association—the principal industry in the community—that draws about 700,000 tourists each year to the city 8,000 feet high in the Rockies 30 miles west of Denver.

The association has about 700 members—some 200 are principal contributors, and many are wealthy, influential members of Denver society. Some central city residents claim the association is trying to force the town into submission. The association says it may just end its membership in a lawsuit.

While nearly all Central City residents agree that the opera association has brought their community back to life, from a quarter-century depression, they aren't all happy about having a new industry town.

Bill Bennett, the mayor, says that very little opera association money goes to the city. He says all association property is owned by the University of Denver and is tax free. The association, says its president, Frank Richardson, has spent about \$5 million restoring old buildings to what is believed they were like in the '70s and '80s when the community was a booming gold mining center and one of the biggest cities in the state.

Central City has its seasonal problems. The police department must be increased to five during the summer. About one-third of the city's \$20,000 annual budget goes for police. Parking is another problem—there aren't enough lots to handle all the tourists. The city needs a new sewer system and water works and a head issue would be necessary to finance them.

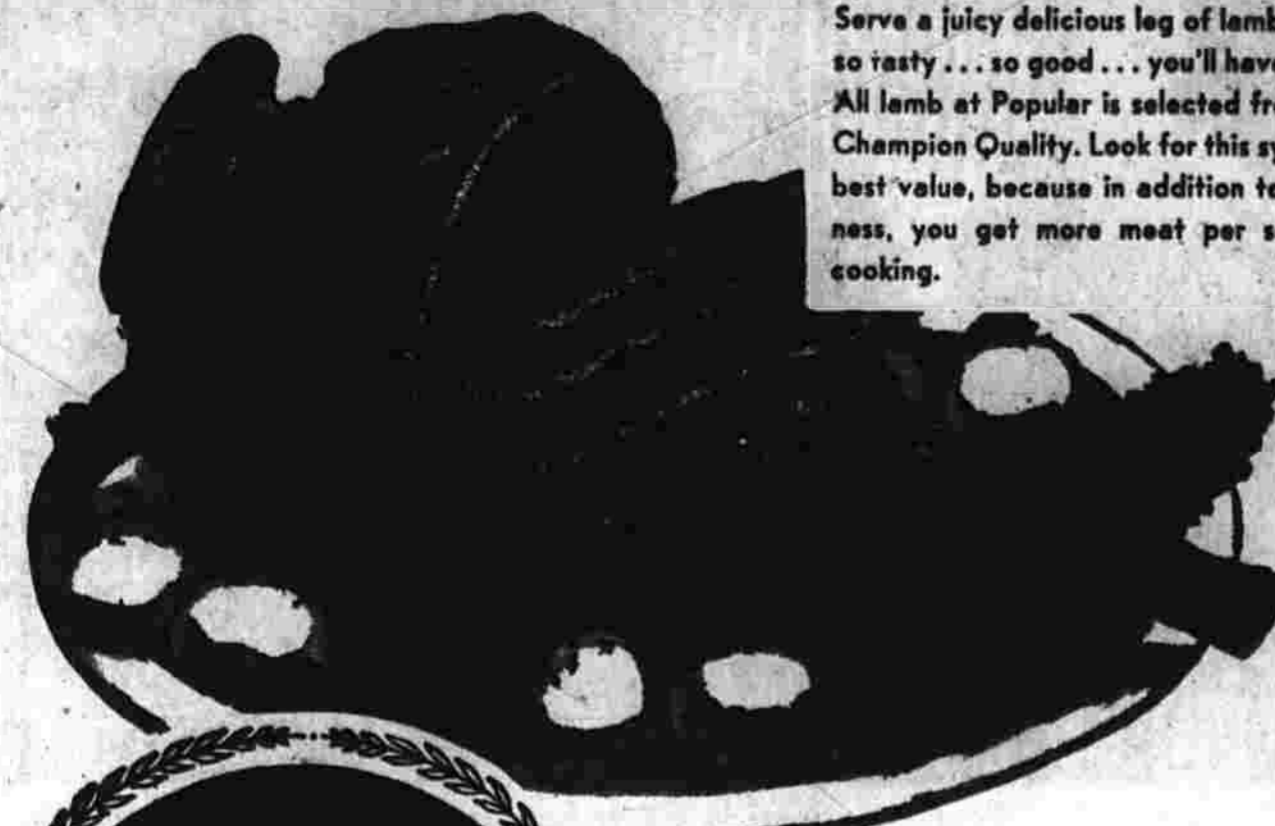
Central City residents are proud of a new fire truck and a new ambulance—financed by donations. A new firehouse is being built by local residents. Richardson says the association has about 25 private residences—used to house opera artists during the summer—and six main buildings, including named "Teller House Hotel." Some of the residences are on the main rolls, he says. "We'd like to get them all, but the condition of the county just doesn't justify it."

The association wants to make the city a restoration of a pioneer Western mining community. "What Williamsburg, Va., is to Colonial history, this should be to the pioneer mining history of the West," says Richardson. "It was highly respected," says Parsons, "there was no shantytown."

"We feel that if the gambling became the main thing up there we'd eventually have to move the opera festival—it's just not compatible with gambling," Richardson says. In any case, just about anybody who's anybody in Denver society will be back at Central City this summer to see "Madame Butterfly" and the world premiere of "The Lady from Colorado."

And, after the show they'll congregate in the bar of the historic old Teller House Hotel, or in one of the dozens of other, gay "hot taverns" to listen to melodious and drink to their hearts.

It would mean building roads, canals, villages and mosques as well as pumping and irrigating the soil. Eventually about 31,000 families or nearly one per cent of Egypt's burgeoning population would be settled on the reclaimed area.

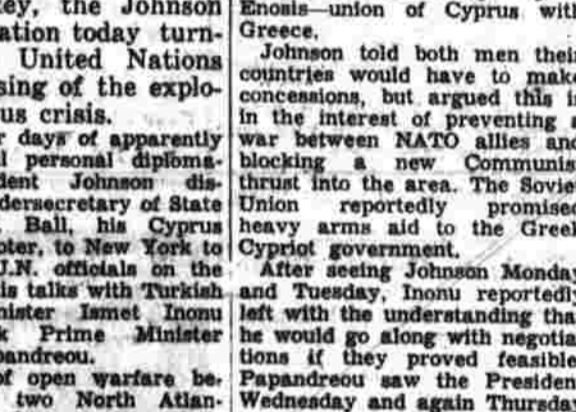

Dulles Urges FBI Curb Dixie Terror

WASHINGTON (AP)—Allen W. Dulles said today he had recommended to President Johnson stepped-up FBI activity to "control and prosecute terrorist activities" in Mississippi.

But Dulles, just back from Mississippi as Johnson's special envoy, said Mississippi state and local authorities "have the main burden for suppressing these terrorist activities."

Dulles said that during a conference of nearly two hours with Johnson, he called Mississippi Gov. Paul B. Johnson Jr. Dulles said Gov. Johnson, when advised of the recommendations, "seemed to take them favorably," but added that he would leave it to the governor to express his own views.

Dulles, former head of the Central Intelligence Agency, said he recommended a variety of local and state, and appropriate federal, action to protect Negroes and white civil rights workers from terrorism.

Dulles said in a reply to a question, "I think it is very important that we have a representative of all groups." Asked if he thinks the three national intelligence agencies are doing a good job, Dulles replied, "I hope they are. I will leave it to you to speculate on that. Information on the Federal Bureau of Investigation."
