The People Could Decide

bout a constitutional amendment which would clearly leave to the states - the right the Supreme Court has just taken way. The states, if mich an amendment were adopted, would again be able to create and adopt and district their own egislative systems, including systems in which one house would be based on population and the other on units.

If such an amendment could be rushed to the states while the legislatures electd according to present state constitutions and districting systems are in ex-Istence, the presumption is that it could pe ratified rather quickly.

In other words, the legislatures which re the creations of the system the Supreme Court has outlawed would be likey to vote to perpetuate themselves and, m effect, repeal the Supreme Court rul-

This might work, but it is just as well It is not likely to. For it would merely strengthen the supposition which under-Hes the Supreme Court decision-a supposition that existing state legislative systems have given state minorities powers these minorities themselves will never surrender or adjust.

In actuality, we suppose, the Dirksen endment, or one like it, may be origi nated in time to go out to a mixture of legislatures, some of the old structures the Supreme Court has ruled must go, some of the new structures which may have been created in response and obedlence to the Supreme Court ruling. But theoretically the kind of test one

would like to see would be the submission of this choice of state form and disricting for legislatures to the voters of the various states, for their "one person one vote" decision in a series of state

That would tell us where the popular majorities, those the Court has seen disenfranchised by present legislative systems, really stand.

This would not make any difference to the reasoning of the Supreme Court itself. One of the legislative systems 'it has just upset, in fact, that in Colorado, was just adopted by the state by a majority of the voters of that state acting in a special referendum.

In Colorado, in other words, the mafority deliberately voted to extend to the minority certain strengths and privileges the Supreme Court itself has held to be unfair.

It is quite possible that the voters of Connecticut, if given a chance in a state referendum, would vote to retain the basic system of representation by towns in the state House of Representatives. It is quite possible that the supposedly much abused Connecticut majority might vote, deliberately, to continue to provide certain protections to population minorities, to sectional and geographical

And it might be that, if the majority for whose voting power the Supreme Court is properly solicitous were given its chance to decide it would decide, in state after state, to create some new compact between population and units. The Supreme Court itself knew where

the Achilles heel of its own decisioning was located. It was located, as its skittish logic on the point indicated, in the sontention that there was something vastly different between the relationship etween the federal government and the states and that between the states and their own political subdivisions.

The Supreme Court had to try to draw this distinction, or rule the federal Senate and the Electoral College and even a own existence to be unconstitutional. And it tried to draw the distinction by arguing that when the Connecticut compromise became the basis of the Federal onstitution, that was an emergency reort which enabled various sovereign states to make the compact among themselves for a federal system of govern-

The Court ignored the fact that the anecticut compromise was available for the use of the new federal governsent because it had been necessary

erder to create a system of self governnent which could be accepted by the representatives of the towns in Connecticut in state after state, constitutions were dopted, with two house legislatures, one house for population, the other for geographical or political subdivisions, because that was the only way the people of these states could agree among them-

selves to come into being as a state. And today, if the majorities in each tate could vote on the issue the Supreme Court has raised, there would still be the possibility that they would decide to live and let live, and not destroy, after all, the safeguards to minority and sectional interests which have been traditionally part of the American political structure.

That would be just nonsensical enough to put everything even again, so that people could begin living again.

It occurs to us that, instead of spend-

ty ought to be labeled for the dangerous

ing so much government time and money, and trying to spend so much industry and consumer money, on the business of warning against the dangers of smoking, we might accomplish just a much good, or even more, by trying to find out why cigarette smoking has become especially dangerous in recent years, how much the unlabeled automotive and industrial smog in our atmosphere may have contributed to such danger, and how much the residue of commercial, non-organic fertilizer in the American diet has contributed to the health dangers noticed.

Sometimes we think, perhaps not quite relevantly, that the most lethal vice and pestilence loose among the American people these days is fear. Some would almost rather die, once, by some other vice, than to suffer fear's thousand

A report in this newspaper said that the largest city in Vermont, Burlington. with a population of some 35.500 has the same representation in the state's town of Stratton with 38 inhabitants In Connecticut some 21 percent of the people elects a majority in the state House of Representatives. And the largest city of Hartford with a population of 161,200 has the same number of representatives as the town of Union with only 383 inhabitants. Since the rural vote has tended to be

Republican and conservative across the United States, and the city vote Dem ocratic and liberal, it is easy to understand the high political stakes in any move to correct these abuses.

It is also easy to understand why reforms have not been initiated and carried out locally. Minorities which hold control or periodic control of the state governmental system by dispre ate voting strength would have to vote themselves out of this control and ofter

When there was no redress in these modern, impatient times, the Supreme Court reversed its earlier position that this was not a proper subject for the federal courts, and two years ago opened the door to the decisions that came this past week. It strained the Equal Pro-tection clause of the Fourteenth Amendment beyond the limits that we consider safe. But it brought considerable reform starting two years ago, and there will be much more after the extraord nary legal confusion and political over turning that are now ahead This points a practical moral which

logically follows the objection to the court's decisions that we have siready expressed. It is this: If local government is to serve the purpose for which it was intended under the Constitution, it will have to reform itself adequately and coninuously. Else higher authority will find

JACKSON, Miss. (AP)—"Certainly I am a candidate for president of the United States," Alabama Gov. George Wallace says.

Wallace made the statement to some 9,000 wildly cheering persons Thursday night as he brought his movement for unpledged presidential electors to the giant Mississippi Coliseum here.

"I intend to give the Americany of this nation. People are looking to Southerners to save our country," he said.

Wallace's 42 minute speech was interrupted 48 times by applause as he attacked centralized government's taking over the civil rights of individuals and states, the U.S. Supreme Court and the pending civil rights bill.

"I intend to give the American people a clear choice," he said. "I welcome a fight between our philosophy and the liberal left wing dogma which now threatens to engulf every man, woman and child in the United States."
