Francisco And Juana Some notion of the kind of tortured confusion and deeply felt division the issues of our time can produce inside people and inside nations and inside temispheres and inside societies has just been provided by two voices speak-

ng from Latin America. One of these voices was that of President Francisco J. Orlich of Costa Rica, one of the more enlightened and progressive little countries of our hemi-President Orlich, speaking at the Na-

tional Press Club in Washington, said something that seems sadly true to many, many students of the problems and behavior of people and nations in O The democracy of the Western Hemi-

sphere, said President Orlich, is "paralyzed by its fear of Communism. "Our obsession with Communism," he continued, "has produced a kind of hemispheric paranola. Instead of being a dynamic, revolutionary force, democracy has been put on the defensive. To regain the initiative we must place a higher value on the principles of social jus-

alarm for the safety of democracy, we fail to practice and improve it and problems of our time, we ourselves can throwing away what we seek to defend, we ourselves can be neglecting the one truly decisive weapon we possess. Very well. Very good. Here is a point of view which holds great fundamental truth, and which isn't expressed often

enough, in the hemisphere, or even here in our own country. But before we put our views on such issues into a nice comfortable little compartment and turn the mental key on them, let us listen to one Juana Castro, a sister of the man who is the boss of Cuba, giving, in the safety of Mexico City, a tortured, emotion-laden statement on why she has defected from her brother's regime and sought asylum out-

side his Cubs. What is on Juana Castro's mind is the spectacle of what she hoped might be a revolution toward democracy and social dustice being turned into a betrayal to "Russian imperialism."

Obviously, to Juana Castro,, the formula for freedom in the Western Hemisphere does not consist entirely in having democracy refurbish its own ideals of social justice.

There seems, then, something of a conflict between the message of President Orlich and that of Juana Castro. But if we head back to President Orlich, and find him continuing some of his public thinking, we find that the same livision exists inside him too.

That, one could say, sounds almost ike hysteria, or part of some phobia. But that is the way it is, in our life, n our world, in our hemisphere, even in ur own nation, in this year of 1964. The answers one gets to our problems usualy add to the confusion. And the more bonest and sincere people are, the more confused and tortured they are likely to e in their attempted answers. In such ages, idiots and clowns have he best chance of taking over leader-

and given into the hands of people who have had less self government and training in self government than the average American kindergarten, to behave ike a sophisticated, responsible adult: to order its own internal affairs and race relationships better than the United States has been able to do; to achieve friendly and peaceful and constructive relationships with its neighbors, as some of the countries which are the oldest seats of human civilization have so far failed to do; to come forward and apply for membership in the United Nations and there to exercise a voting and policy wisdom which may help older and more experienced countries to keep peace in the world.

This is what we expect of such a new country, like this Malawi which suddenly appears in our headlines.

And the amazing thing of our times is not merely that we ask such an unlikely thing of such a new country, not merely that we ask that a nation be born and mature in the same historical instant. The miracle is that the answer we get is sometimes much better than we expect. One thing these new countries teach us older ones again and again. Freedom means enough to them so that they work to get it and work at it when they get it, and they will not often fail for lack of interest or for lack of try-
