LA JOLLA, Calif. (AP)—Rising on a hill overlooking the Pacific is a multistoried fortress soon to be filled with man's sweetest weapon against his oldest foe: Disease.

Commander of this fortifying battlement is Jonas Salk—already the conqueror of one scourge, polio. Now he is engaged in a three-front war against all the miseries of body and mind.

As his generals, he has summoned eight of the world's outstanding research scientists and given them free hand to map their own battle plans for a social and revolutionary assault to break down the mysterious power of viruses; for these processes, he believes, he holds the keys to mental and physical health.

To gain a better understanding of the processes of the mind, Salk has purchased a laboratory called the Salk Institute for Biological Studies, formerly the March of Dimes, which has provided an eventual \$30 million, on a 20-acre site donated by the City of San Diego, adjacent to the new San Diego campus of the University of California.

This would be the way it seems to many of us.

Any kind of punishing this young secretary for defending her own life seems like an outrage.

But the other side of the case is simply stated, and it carries the day. If we really think, without much trouble, how really, would we ever differentiate between those who carried switch-blades for self defense and those who carried them with criminal intent? How are we going to take weapons away from some people and not from others? Do we want to have it be legal for everybody to carry any kind of weapon anywhere and everywhere? And do we want to go back to being a nation of vigilantes, or do we want to stick with the idea that the police are primarily responsible for maintaining law and order?

As with too many of the problems in our time, there are two kinds of answer, one which is glib and seems sentimentally right and the other which is harder to think out, and not pleasant to contemplate, and perhaps not even any solution, either.

But it is usually the unpleasant, unsatisfactory answer, the answer which doesn't even promise a solution, which is the answer the civilized, responsible society has to make, no matter how simple, how glacial, how scolding, how boldly sure of a quick and final solution, the other kind of answer may seem.

With what promise to be the probable nomination coming up at San Francisco, the choice between these two kinds of answers seems likely to prove the big story of our year. **"Social Order" Month**

It must be something of a comfort to American parents, and American authorities, to be able to read that over in South Korea, juvenile misbehavior has been increasing in dismal fashion in the last few years.

Twice as many juveniles passed through the South Korean delinquency courts in the past year as did two years ago. The juveniles are becoming bolder and more contemptuous of the law.

In a special effort to combat this trend, the police of South Korea have resorted to an American device. They have named the month of July a "month for establishing social order" month.

During July, each policeman is expected to catch at least three juvenile thieves. And if he exceeds that quota, he will be rewarded with a special bonus of 80 cents per juvenile thief.

The record for July will be watched with interest, to see whether the South Korean police catch more juveniles, to see whether "social order" does make some kind of comeback.

But in South Korea, as elsewhere, even the best efforts of the police in catching juveniles don't seem to make any permanent kind of dent in the problem. The juveniles caught go to reform school, and come out, and begin all over again, a little tougher each time. Eventually they graduate to jail and prison terms.

All this has a somewhat familiar ring, but it is all over in South Korea, many thousands of miles away, in another civilization entirely. But, as we said, it is a little comforting to realize that they would even begin to do this.

**Parliament and The UN**

Anyone who recalls the hazards that finally destroyed the old League of Nations must note with amazement the too proud and too busy to notice the faults, it is becoming an ever more acute and dangerous situation.

It is perhaps as well that this development should have been marked in the last decade when the Conservatives have traditionally represented the view of those who were willing to support Britain's acceptance of international commitments if Britain is the dominant member of the combination. This is not the case in the UN, and yet the Government is increasingly ready to let the UN take a lead.

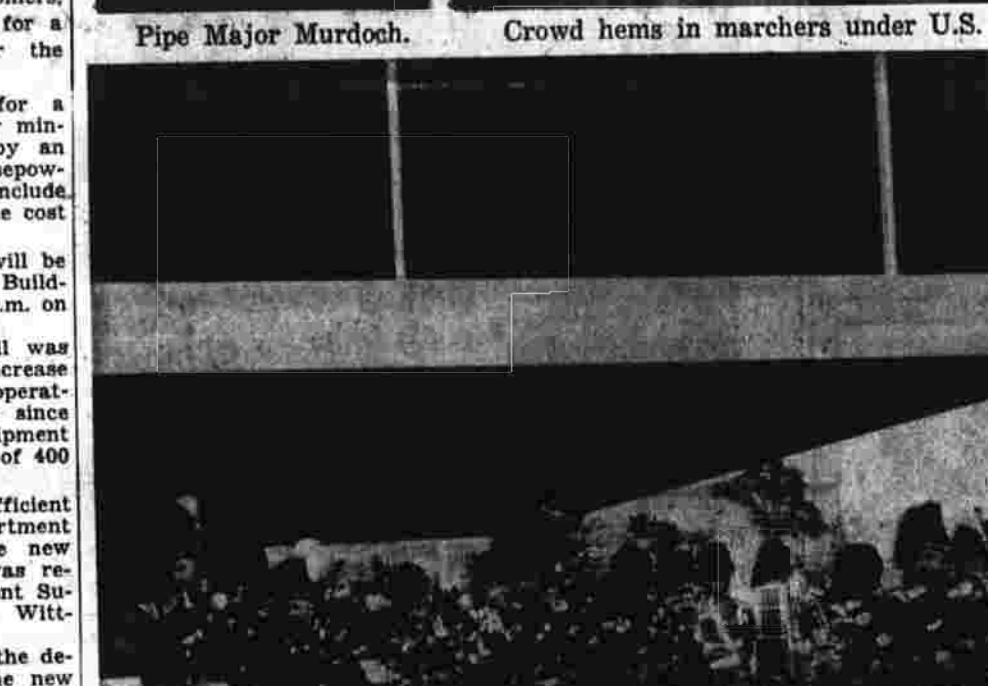

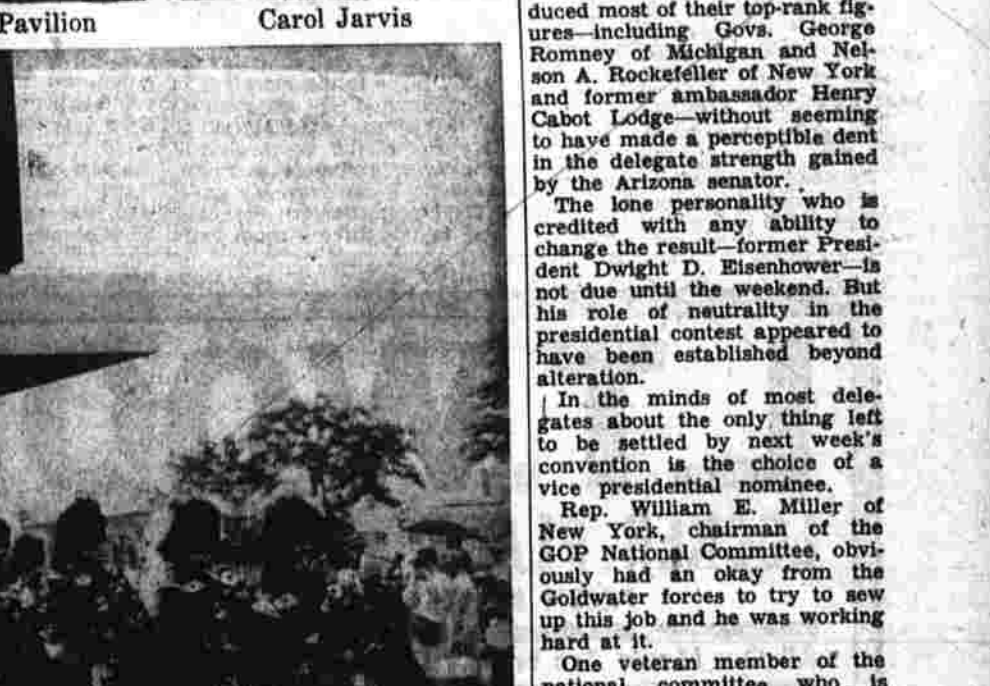
