Walter Or Chavid?

Gradually-the experience during the primaries should have alerted us, and the approach to the first of the national conventions confirms it-the true nature of the great contest of 1964 is besoming absorbingly clear to us Ameri-

For a time, there was an illusion that this was the year of the great battle between Rockefeller and Goldwater, then between Goldwater and Lodge, then between Goldwater and Scranton.

There was a further impression that, once this series of battles had been determined, and had produced its winner, the drama would move on, presumably in the shape of a contest between Goldwater and Johnson.

The Chinese War Potential

Hanson W. Baldwin, a military experi whose opinions are still respected by all who followed him through the actual course of World War II, has analyzed the military strength of the Chinese Communists for his readers in the New York Times.

And we are quite willing to take, as expert, and quite accurate in theory at least, Baldwin's appraisal of the Chinese Communist potential.

In everything except raw manpower for use in mass assaults or extended guerrilla warfare, Baldwin rates the Chinese Communists rather low. They don't have very sophisticated weapons even for their infantry; their air force is small and backward and apparently illtrained; their navy is, of course, something of a joke; they have only limited quantities of radar; they still haven't got atomic bomb; they couldn't protect their own vast territories very well against outside air attack. They don't even have the size army we would imagine, Baldwin crediting them with only some 2,500,000 men in uniform. And this army has to be split up among various frontiers where they need to keep watch, as against Russia in the north, or as against Chiang Kal-shek in Formosa to their east, so that they apparently have no very large army free for deployment on any new campaign beyond their own national borders.

This is rather satisfying and reassuring, and we hope everybody will leave It at that and not proceed to put it all to any kind of test. In the test, some of these expert con

Chinese Communists first began opera-tions against Chiang Kal-shek on the Chinese mainland they were short on guns and planes, too, but proceeded to take all they needed for victory from the stores we had given Chiang Kal-

It can be remembered that, when they came across the Yalu into North Kores, these same Chinese Communists had perfected some kind of bloodcurdling battle which somehow seemed to help them against the better trained and better equipped troops we had in the field against them.

And we know that, at this very moment, in the jungles of South Vietnam, native guerrilla fighters operating without air power or radar or artillery are somehow managing to do uncomfortably well against armies which have everything modern.

Bo let's take our unquestioned superiority over the Chinese Communists in military rating and be so pleased and content with it we feel no special urgency to test it out in the field. As Critic Baldwin outlines the situation if would be something to make the Chinese Communists cautious. If so, let us try to keep at least a little shead of them in caution, too.

-----Party Hero

It is that old joke on the American Communists-that if the F.B.I. ever withdrew its men from membership in the Communist Party, the party would lose its largest single source of members and dues-which is illustrated again by the exasperated action of the Communist Party of New York State in expelling one of its own highest ranking members.

The man the Communists accuse of having been traitor to their cause, in that he was really serving as a police agent while he pretended to be a fervent follower of the party line, is identified as one William Albertson. Until he was denounced the other day, he had a career of party prominence in Detroit, Pittsburgh and New York.

If the Communist Party's present accusations are true, a look at Albertson's party record becomes a rather amazing demonstration of how thoroughly and convincingly both he and his secret U.S. government employers must have played their roles.

Albertson was expelled from the University of Pittsburgh in 1929 for organizing a meeting in behalf of the famous Tom Mooney. In 1932 he was Communist candidate for the state senate from Manhattan. In 1951, he was one of a group of Communist leaders arrested for conspiring to teach and advocate the overthrow of the government by force and violence.

Two years later he was convicted of these charges in Pittsburgh and sentenced to five years in prison. However, in one possible tell-tale move, the government, in 1957, dropped the case against him after the credibility of one of the key witnesses came into question.

In 1958 he was elected New York state secretary of the Communist Party. In 1963 Attorney General Kennedy cited him several times in a report on control of subversive activities. This report noted that he had had his passport revoked, in 1962, by the State Department

Goldwater And Dirksen

Lunacy in the Land of Lincoln. U.S. Sen. Everett McKinley Dirksen is one of the best known characters in Congress. Dirksen's more histrionic atributes are charming in an anachronistic way, and now and then he rises to fine statesmanship in the service of his state and nation.

Such was Dirksen's well-applauded role in Senate passage of the historie civil rights bill. His service was tremendous, enlightened, heartening. And when he scored fellow GOP Sen.
