

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Two Sentry satellites and a tiny Pygmy satellite rocketed into great eggshaped orbits today, in a complex triple launching that could lead to United States' development of a fool-proof system to detect illicit nuclear explosions in space.

One Leader, One Standard

n yesterday's developments at San Francisco, particularly in the candidate's acceptance speech, which will have to be the subject for continued analysis, interpretation, and restatement as the campaign goes along. Some of the language in that speech almost immediately became the occasion of new party dispute and controversy, and it will take time and perhaps further elucidation from the candidate himself to indicate what it

There was, however, in the last day of the convention, one big dominant overtone which was beyond semantic subtleties or political doubt.

The victorious Senator Goldwater pressed, yesterday, for a complete and unforgiving, uncompromising, and entirely nonsentimental consolidation and expansion of his victory within his own

To all the commentators and editorialists and weaker-kneed party figures who had been prating of reconciliation and party unity, Candidate Goldwater's answer was clear and scornful. He showed himself more inclined to read people out of the party permanently than to wel-

As the first concrete gift of his leadership, he asked from his party and offered to the American people the rather unusual spectacle of a candidate team which agreed with itself. Normally, the conservative presidential candidate likes to choose a liberal running mate, or vice versa, and mix that variety in with the normal variety in geographical and ethnic representation. Sen. Goldwater honored geography. Otherwise, one presumes, he might have chosen former Senator Knowland of California as his running mate. But, in Congressman and National Chairman William E. Miller, Candidate Goldwater came about as close to a soul mate as there was available. This was the first Goldwater stroke for consistency and "order," at the very top

of his campaign. It went along with his previous refusal to dilute, by one moderate comma, the party platform his staff had written for

In his acceptance speech, Candidate Goldwater extended the unified character of the ticket, and the far right consistency of the party platform, to his views about what kind of crusade he wanted to

If the bitter-losing moderates had any idea that the hand of reconciliation was about to be stretched out toward them, they were quickly disabused of it. The only real invitation from the platform was to join the candidate and his crusade on his terms, or get out, and the portion of the New York delegation which did walk out had obviously understood the signals.

There is to be one leader and one standard, and no softness or confusion of coexistence with any who do not yield themselves to this standard. That was the style the new party lead

ership set for itself in the closing acts of the convention it had won. The order and discipline it proposes for the nation is first to be imposed on the party itself.

Those Network Beetles

When Dwight Eisenhower got, from he Republican National Convention, his surprise reaction of enthusiastic approval for his denunciation of "sensationseeking columnists and commentators," the chances are that he and the convenion delegates were expressing a mutual annoyance from slightly different

It is likely that Eisenhower and the najority of the convention delegates shared some resentment of some newspa-per writers, Elsenhower because they had taunted him, in recent weeks, with not knowing enough to follow what should have been his own convictions in the political situation, and the convenon delegates because they had the idea that the whole American press, hitherto usually abused for its slavish adherence to the Republican party, had been espeially unfriendly and unfair to Senator dwater as a particular candidate But a good portion of the resents

of the convention delegates against "col-umnists and commentators," a resentment they expressed, the moment they heard the Eisenhower words, by shaking their fists at those antenna heimeted people from the networks who were circulating through the convention, may have been occasioned just by what they had been seeing, and putting up with, during the convention itself.

Once again, the network beetles violatd the rules of good taste and courtesy not by accident or by impulse or over sealousness, but by obvious plan of operation. Once again, their ridiculous effor to find some news in every moment, every event, every movement of an individual, resulted in a dead end which was not merely boring but insulting. It was insulting, as in the case of the persistent questioning of a candidate's family, for instance, as to how it felt from one moment to another, or in this or that prospect, not merely to the people who were being questioned, but to the people who were being invited to watch and Once again, some of the network

beetles exhibited more tendency to make or create news which wouldn't otherwise be happening than they did to report what was happening of its own accord. Occasionally, some of the heavier egos on the air invited the suspicion that, in view of their tremendous wisdom and conclusive grasp of situations, they, and
