After a long, hot summer estar of the sea. The north star day, nothing is more relaxing than sitting outdoors enjoying the feel of the cool night air and idly watching the stars. These particles, as they travel their path around the Earth, are cold and dark; but as they dash into Earth's atmosphere at a speed of about 30 miles per second, collision with the atoms of the air scrapes atoms from the meteoric patticles, that we see as a shooting star. The particle is generally consumed before reaching Earth. It is estimated that as much as five tons of meteoric dust is picked up by

The Hoffa Verdict A duly constituted federal jury, de-

liberating 17 hours, has brought in a verdict of guilty against James R. Hoffs, president of the Teamsters Union, on charges of fraud and conspiracy against the pension fund of his own union. The verdict meant that the jury believed the government prosecution's story, and the facts and testimony and

documents which backed it up. It was a story of how Hoffa and a trusted few of his associates used their power over the millions of dollars in the union's pension fund to fatten their own pockets. And they did it, the government charged, by making arrangements to loan money from the union fund to outsiders, in return for which the outsiders conveyed benefits back to Hoffa and his associates as individuals. This story the jury believed. It came In with its verdict of guilty.

Even before this trial began, the union itself had begun to come alert, and to but restrictions around its regular treasary so that it wouldn't be paying Hoffa's legal fees forever. But the assumption is that Hoffa will

appeal the Chicago verdict, as he previously appealed the Tennessee verdict finding him guilty of trying to bribe a jury there, and that, by process of the appeal, he will at the least stay out of prison for a long while yet.

Whether or not Hoffa finally goes to all is not directly the most important saus. The most important thing of all in the Hoffs case is to have his union iberate itself from bondage to him, and from the romantic idea that his services and leadership on its behalf have somehow compensated for and created license for criminal behavior. Not to "get" Hoffa, but to try to make sure that no future union either gets or takes a Hoffa to its leadership—that is the larger pub-

lic purpose involved. The thesis is simple: It ought to be ossible to be a vigorous, able union ader without being a crook. This simple thegis is being comonstrated, all the ime, in one stable and respectable union after another. There will also always be exceptions to the rule, but none quite so glaring, either on the part of the union ader himself or on the part of a union reluctant to face the truth, as that of mmy Hoffe and his Teamsters. The mistaken loyalty ought now to be

Nature Is Still A Problem To give away a minor trade secret when two pleces of reading coaleace,

that is likely to make an editorial. We were reading, just the other day, an account of one of the surprisingly brilliant civilizations which flowered in the jungle of Central America centuries before the Spaniards came, Suddenly, the civilization collapsed, not from any invasion, not from any stroke of enemy force, not even, apparently, from any sudden disease. And one theory advanced was that the civilization in question was visited by a few slight changes in its weather. These slight changes in its weather pattern upset the elaborate agriculture the people had evolved for producing its food under jungle conditions. Confronted with an experience it could neither explain nor correct, the civilization turned in frustration and anger against its established intellectual and religious leadership, and, without such leadership, became merely a dwindling thing at the mercy of the environment which had once given it life and

That, at least, was one theory, of how a change in the weather may have ended a civilization.

Then we read, in the New York Times the other day, an absorbing account of the problems which have been created in our own Great Lakes region by a general decline in rainfall since 1960. Lakes Michigan and Huron are down o the lowest levels ever recorded. The overall statistic for both lakes show they are down 2.3 feet from their aver-

There are several ways to expres what such a shrinkage means. To bring the lakes up to normal, for instance, would now require rains that would last for months instead of for weeks. This is possible. Only 12 years ago, the Great Lakes waters were abnormally

high, causing millions of dollars worth of damage because they were flooding over their banks. The big immediate thing the water shrinkage does is to alter the usefulness of Great Lakes ports, and force two costly remedies. One is to keep dredging ports and channels deeper, and money is now being spent every day on this proc-

ess in one place or another. The other remedy, even more costly than continuous dredging, is to lighten the cargoes of ships, so they will ride higher in the water and thus still be able to use old channels and docks. For one large cargo ship to load itself enough lighter to make itself float one foot higher can cost it something

like \$100,000 a year in cargo revenue. But-particularly when the experts say the situation is almost certain to get much worse before it gets any better-the chain of possible effects goes on Wild life is hurt. Millions and millions

of dollars worth of shore front recreational and residential values are placed The merits of the dispute, then, have in at least temporary decline and jeopardy. It costs communities and industrie more to pump out the water they need for public and industrial purposes. One can go on and on, discovering the ways in which a two and a half foot drop in the level of a Great Lake, caused by a three year deficiency in regional rainfall, is putting great sections of our industrial economy under emergency strain, and threatening to change a whole way of life, even, perhaps, suddenly make impossible the particular kind of civilization which has grown up around the Great Lakes

From such an account of what a decline in rainfall can do to a modern civilization, one can judge how much more catastrophic may have been the effects of something similar down in the Central American jungle a thousand years

Our particular civilization has powerful recourse. Perhaps we can even make it rain. We can dredge new channels and harbors, and build new docks. One of the projects suggested for helping to maintain the water level in spite ofdrought is to turn the Harrikenaw River. which now flows north into frozen Hudson's Bay, around and reverse its flow so that it empties into Lake Huron. That would only cost a billion to start, and could be completed in 30 or 40 years and if the lack of water to Hudson's Bay suddenly changed the climate there so that it never rained anywhere afterwards, we might even have an engineer-

ing answer to that. But, although our recourse may be greater, and our success much greater, we are reminded of one gently persistent fact which was very well expressed by one of the authorities trying to solve the present problem of the Great Lakes


