serious sickness. There are, in this morning's news, a whole series of developments which point toward a diagnosis, for American sivilization today, of sick, sick, sick. Let us begin by taking the disclosure, from Washington, that the White House, on Thursday, is going to pay unprecedented ceremonial honors to Secretary

General Thant of the United Nations. The scheduling of a full scale formal dinner for him, it is explained, is intended to symbolize and dramatize the Johnon administration's determination to enhance the prestige of the world organi-

Such a development, taken by itself, might be a wonderful thing. But let us now look at some of the

First, at home. This Johnson administration formal wining and dining of the top UN administrative officer is designed, of course, to put a political play on the fact that Senator Goldwater has sometimes talked of getting out of the United Nations and that he accomplished the unusual feat of making a nomination acceptance speech at San Francisco without including even one reference to

the world organization. Second, abroad. Secretary General Thant has just returned from Moscow, where Premier Khrushchev cold-shouldered his efforts to get Russia to pay up on its share of UN police operations in the Congo. So, by wining and dining ministration shows how much more loyal to the United Nations it is than Russia

So one dinner aims at both Senator Goldwater and at Russia, chiding them both for their disloyalty to the United

This might be viewed as smart politics at home and abroad, and even hailed as a welcome demonstration of right sentiments, if it could stand alone.

But the same day's news which reveals this dinner diplomacy respect for the United Nations, an alliance of nations pledged to keep the peace, also reports the order of the President of the United States to our naval units which are patrolling the coast of North Vietnam, an order to shoot to kill, and to strengthen our capacity to shoot to kill in that region.

We are going to wine and dine the top UN official Thursday. But he had better not bring up the subject of the war we are fighting in Southeast Asia.

For that is a war we do not discuss with the world organization which is supposed to be preventing war, and which we do allow to try to prevent some other wars, as in Cyprus or the Congo. This is a war we have marked out for our very own, and where we propose to save civilization purely by our own resolution and our own toughness, and not by admitting the possible jurisdiction of any international organi-

Now the question arises if we ignore the United Nations in the case of the war we have chosen to make our own particular national interest, how are we really much better than Senator Goldwater, who wouldn't mind ignoring the United Nations entirely,or how are we really very much better than Russia, which doesn't pay its dues for United Nations actions it doesn't approve of? A nation, and a civilization, which have to ask themselves such questions, and can't get any better answer than ve can get, that is a nation and civilization which has to be labeled sick, sick,

Should it be conceivable, at this point, that there should be some voice somethere which, without running the risk of being called Communist, should dare invoke principles of international law and order and try to have them applied a situation in which the world's most powerful nation is practicing brinkmanhip with all civilization?

For one potential answer, we turn to his morning's editorial in the New York imes, which opens with the following

"To give point to these orders, an additional destroyer is to join the patrol, and the surface ships are to have air cover. The Maddox and its supporting planes apparently punished the torpedo boats that assailed the destroyer; for the future, the Communists in the Gulf of Tonkin stand warned that piratical ventures against U.S. ships on their lawful missions will be met with even greater force and decisiveness than the Maddia manifested so admirably."

The Exclusive Touch

kind of exclusiveness, the Terrace Club has carried its principles over into its menu. The New York Times reports the average luncheon or dinner check to be \$12 per person, exclusive of liquor. Here, then, would seem to be the ideal institution, offering ideal sur-

roundings, for Americans who still like the nicer things of life. It is with genuine regret and sorrow,

then, with a truly anguished disappointment over the failure of so noble a venture, that we read what is happening to the Terrace Club. First, according to the New York Times, the very same people who could afford \$1,250 just for the privilege of eating there are complaining that a \$12 luncheon is too steep. Second, according to the New York Times, nobody, not even the people who complain about the prices, eats there anyway. And that, we guess, is the way it gets to be. Get something good, and nobody supports it.
