"Just Right"-"Not Far Enough" A week now has gone by, and there still no overt retaliation from North Vietnam or from Communist China to the action of United States planes fighting on direct orders of President John-

This lack of overt response seems to indicate that the President's act and policy are becoming recognized as a sucpess, or at least open to a free and relaxed kind of evaluation. Two kinds of such evaluation are now

appearing. One holds that the President's action was a masterpiece, just right. The other holds that it did not begin, after all, to be enough. The first view-that what the President did was just right-is expressed in easily quotable form by Drew Middleton, veteran news analyst writing in the New

York Times from Paris. The President's Vietnam action gave him a reputation in Europe as a statesman, Middleton "Until this week," wrote Middleton "Europeans had been rather chary in their attitude toward the President. . . . "The change in attitude . . . is a be-

lief on their part that Mr. Johnson acted in a critical hour as they believe a President of the United States should act. He was firm, they say, but he was calm. "there remain those who believe that the Fleet, thousands of miles from its bases, cannot be considered an innocent bystander. But . . . by using the enormous power of the Seventh Fleet only once, albeit effectively, Mr. Johnson apparenthas convinced his allies of his adminis-

fration's responsibility. "The conviction that the President unerstands the basic rule of power politics -that power, however overwhelming, should never be pushed to the ultimate point—is something Europe has been looking for since last November. They saw this, and rejoiced, in President Kennedy's handling of the Cuba crisis. Now, they say, they discern in Mr. Johnson a similar willingness to temper strength with restraint."

The second kind of evaluation of the President's performance, that it was not enough, came from Senator Barry Goldwater yesterday in his speech before the National Assembly of Counties at Wash-

Senator Goldwater said that he and his party do support "the President's firm action in response" to the North Vietnamese torpedo boat attacks.

"But," he continued, "I must point out that it was just that-a response-an incident not a program or a new policy; a tactical reaction, not a new winning

"We must, instead, prosecute the war in Vietnam with the object of ending it along with the threats to peace that it "Taking strong action simply to re-

turn to the status quo is not worthy of our sacrifices, our ideals, or our vision of a world of peace, freedom and jus-

"Now this doesn't mean the use of nilitary power alone. We have vast resources of economic, political and psyhological power which have not even men tapped in our Vietnamese strategy. "These, I suggest, can be peaceful

It happens to be our opinion that either the admiring complacency of our Suropean allies nor the discontent of Senator Goldwater is very firmly based. We have actually moved forward into deeper commitment in all Southeast Asia. There will be no return to the status quo, as Senator Goldwater seems to fear. What Tennessee did the other day was to select Congressman Ross Bass, who voted for the civil rights bill, as its Democratic nominee for the Senate, over Governor Frank Clement, who announced, in his campaigning, that he would have voted against the civil

rights bill as it stood. This is supposed to be the year when the civil rights issue is turning the South upside down politically. This would make it the year, then, when even a Tennessee which had in other years supported a Kefauver might obey some kind of backlash on the racial issue. Instead, Congressman Bass led Gov-

ernor Clement by some 100,000 votes. Conceivably, winning the Democratic nomination is not, this year, any automatic guarantee of election. It may be that the racial issue explosion which was supposed to guarantee victory to Governor Clement will now transfer its benefits to the Republican ticket. 
