McNamara's Millions

"Let me assure you that our strategie orces are and will remain in the 1960's and the seventies, sufficient to insure the estruction of both the Soviet Union and Communist China, under the worst imaginable circumstances accompanying the outbreak of war. There should be no doubt of this in the mind of any American. There is none in the minds of our enemies." That was Defense Secretary Robert

s. McNamara, performing his official duty, and his political duty, before the Democratic Platform Committee in Washington yesterday. It is his official job to be responsible for some such state of military might as he was describing in the paragraph we are quotng. It was his political responsibility to talk this way because there is one American, by the name of Goldwater, who quite naturally, considering his own political position, questions the perfection of our nuclear strength and the completeness of our preparedness for de-

Later in his testimony, . Defense Secretary McNamara ventured a small description of what he might possibly have meant by the phrase "worst imaginable sircumstance accompanying the outbreak of war."

"A full-scale nuclear exchange between the United States and the Soviet Union, lasting less than one hour, would kill almost 100 million Americans—the equivalent of over 300 World War II's. There would be little comfort in know ing that over 100 million Russians would also be killed."

We should all be grateful to the Secretary of Defense for that small touch of humanity—the touching admission that there might not be too much joy in the death of 100,000,000 Russians if their death happened to be matched by that of 100,000,000 Americans.

Nor should we condemn him too much because that sort of back-door entry for the gentler and more humane considerations is the only touch of its kind he could manage in his testimony. He is doing exactly what we, the taxpayers, hire him to do. He is talking precisely the way our policy in the world requires him to talk. He is reflecting. with complete accuracy, the summits of civilization we human beings have at-

tained in the year 1964. Our momentary instinct to cringe and draw away should not be to draw away from the Secretary of Defense, but from ourselves. Or, if we do not eringe over such matters, but rather swell and rejoice at such good news, let us not hide our satisfaction under mere compliment to the Secretary of Defense, over the job he is doing for us. Let us beat our chests and give out with our own Texas yell. Viva! Ole!

America, The Junkyard There are a few statistics available on America's junk car situation, if anybody wants figures for what the traveling eye

There are now between 30,000,000 and 40,000.000 abandoned automobiles glorifying the American landscape, We are now adding to this census of

funk at the rate of 5,000,000 old cars an-With the automobile industry producing 7,800,000 new units this year, the rate of abandonment of old cars is likely to go higher still in the future.

Such basic statistics are something to be considered along with changes which have been taking place in the disposal There was a time when it paid junkyards to accumulate these old cars, strip them, and then mash them together in a

bundle which could be sold to the nation's steel mills for the production of new Improvements in processes in the steel industry, plus its dislike for the metallic

impurities which couldn't be cut out of

the junk bundle, have lessened demand and price for this crumpled junk. As a consequence, fewer Americans with old cars are finding it possible to sell them when they are through with them, fewer junkyards are interested in processing them, and some people are now just beginning to abandon old cars on city streets, anywhere, forcing the cities themselves and their taxpayers to the expense of carting them off and dising of them somewhere and some-

In New York City, which would be the natural leader in such a statistic, old cars are now being abandoned, on the

treets, at the rate of 250 a week. There we have the picture. Millions of cars being abandoned every years, fewer and fewer of them worth any salvage process, more and more of them spread n disgrace across the countryside. As the junk increases, the country's dislike for the display of it increases. Now for the kind of remedies being

One kind of remedy, which would forbid such public abandonment of old cars, intensifies the problem without solving

Another kind of remedy-which would involve the operation of salvage and disposal plants by government-would be costly and difficult to get from the tax-

old junks out and throwing them into the deep sea-might be practical in some ocean areas, but still involves a final and complete waste of materials this old earth has mined out of itself. None of these suggested attacks on

the problem seems very satisfactory. There remains one possible approach to the problem which nobody has yet discussed, yet which seems to us worth at least the time it might take our automotive engineers to figure out some reason or reasons it couldn't possibly be done. Why not try to design and build a kind of automobile which would be composed

of only two kinds of materials-one

clearly and easily disposable and the other clearly and easily capable of becoming valuable salvage? We have, it may occur to the reader now that we have begun to enter such a discussion, succeeded in designing for everything else conceivable. We design for beauty. We design for speed. We design for power. We design for prestige. We design for longevity. We design, also,

for deliberate obsolescence. So why not design, as well, for salvage? Why not be thinking, when the car is being designed in the first place, how it is going to be disposed of at the end of

When one considers what wonders the automobile industry has performed to date, one cannot resist believing that it could come up with some remarkable answers to the problem of car disposal-If it once decided this was a problem important enough for its engineers to take

The junk statistics cited at the beginning of this discussion give their own indication of how important the problem is becoming. What is involved is the world's greatest waste and discard of its own resource; the particular kind of waste involved also constitute the greatest blight and eyesore and nuisance up-

It is, we submit, a problem worth a few years study by some of Detroit's brightest young men.

At the Hershey meeting, Senator Goldwater demonstrated he now understands this distinction by singling out "char acter assassins" and any group "that seeks to impose its views through terror or threat of violence." The distinction was not made clear by those who first raised the issue, and it can be fairly Senator was not quick to

When we see what extremism is, we can also see it is not the pressing danger it's often painted as being. The other v the chairman of the left-wing Americans for Democratic Action rated rightwing extremism as somewhat less a danger than being eaten by piranha fish. We concur; it's a nasty but hardly omnipresent problem. And it is, most of all, a painful challenge for responsible con-

Senator Goldwater remarks that the John Birch Society, which unquestionably has sometimes indulged in extremist methods, contains many "decentpeople." It is precisely for this reason he Senator and other responsible conservatives have a primary responsibility convincing such decent people that their cause does not excuse the methods

used under their organization's name. Within the memory of most of us, exremism on the left was the more prevaent problem. There were subversives in overnment and in many labor unions. After a decade or so of hesitation, Amerliberals met this challenge credit bly well. They have fairly well isolated Communists and such from the labor movement and the liberal intellectual movement. This certainly has helped diminish domestic communism. Intellectually and temperamentally,

American conservatives should be even more fitted to cleanse their own ranks those who endorse extremist meth-The very meaning of conservatism in the classical sense has been opposition to hasty methods. In a word, the meaning of conservatism has been moderation How typical was Edmund Burke, grandfather of all conservatives when he argued for conciliation with 13 rebellious colonies even though "I know many have ben taught to think that moderation in a case like this is a kind

A few citizens fail to understand the need for moderation, and many fail to understand the real meaning of extrem ism. Because of this, the extremism issue is all out of perspective. In his state-ment last week, Senator Goldwater has at last taken the initiative in putting the issue in perspective, and undercutting its utility as a political brickbat.

If he and his lieutenants continue to stress their sincere opposition to methods such as character assassination and violence, they stand a good chance of deflating not only the exaggeration of the extremism issue, but also the little




