

Under the program, federal grants or loans are made available to assist in constructing and equipping needed public and voluntary nonprofit hospitals and other facilities.

Since 1947, Congress ha appropriated annually from \$85 million to \$220 million for this purpose, Appropriations are distributed to the states and territories according to a statutory formula based on population and relative per capital income. 

Peking Bests Russians in Asia Moves

By WILLIAM L. RYAN AP Special Correspondent The Red Chinese have won an important round against the balked and frustrated Soviet Communists in a battle over who calls the shots among Communists of Asia and Africa. Moscow virtually has thrown in the towel after a long struggle to force its way into the Com-munist-backed Asian-African solidarity organization.

The outcome has important meaning for Asia. Peking has enjoyed considerable success in keeping the door to Asian com-munism closed to the Soviet Un-ion. This means the Russians have little influence, for example, on what takes place in a powderkeg situation such as Viet Nam. The Kremlin, with little

choice, had to bow out as grace-fully as possible. To insist upon being recognized as an Asian nation and then be voted down by a Red Chinese majority would have been painful.

The fight concerned who would participate in a conference planned by the organization for next March. The first such conference was held at Bandung. Indonesia, in 1955, and the Russians attended.

Moscow says the Chinese opposed the Russians on racial posed the Russians on racial grounds and even pictured the U.S.S.R. as if it were in the same category as "colonia powers with possessions in Asia and Africa." That stung badly. Trying to make the best of it, Moscow sent messages to Asian and African governments, say-ing "the Soviet Union cannot al-low the question of its invitation

Asian countries, and especially its use by anyone for sowing discord among them."

Moscow bowed out.

The message said Moscow didn't take the initiative in raising the question of its attendance in the first place. Perhaps it didn't, but the Kremlin obviously wanted an invitation, and complained the Red Chinese blocked it by "a dishonest game."

### Still Mortal

Anybody who was expecting, or perhaps even hoping, that the Democrats, when they got to their national convention business, would appear in such angelic robes of pure reason and spotless tactic that they would simplify the choices of voters this November have already, of course, been disappointed.

Perhaps the best that can be said for the Democrats, so far, is that their weaknesses and their shenanigans somehow seem more traditional and therefore more harmless than some of the elements which have been disturbing the atmosphere surrounding the Republieans, during and after their convention. The fear of some people, over the Republican trend of events, was that there was something new and extreme about them which might be ominous for

The Democrats, by contrast, seem well within normal traditions. The only extremism they have exhibited has been in the direction of boredom, and in the tasteless brand of diversions they offer their national audiences.

The Democratic platform has attained significance only because the Democrats, undoubtedly with something of the Ku Klux Klan in some of their own membership grasped the issue of denouncing extremist organizations firmly, while the Republicans, tender toward the John Birchers, refused to do so.

n other respects, in foreign affairs in questions of war and peace, the Democratic platform also attained significance mainly because, at San Francisco, the Republicans had adopted statements which seemed to have been dredged up out of some dark and long lost agestatements which have already been amended, on paper at least, at Hershey, by the very candidate who originally had them put in the platform.

As for the keynote speech, it was rather difficult, we would think, for anybody except the most automatic kind of Democrat to join in what seemed to be the routine appraisal of the commentators on the convention scene, which was that it was a sort of "hum-

It so happens that Senator John Pastore, of our neighboring state of Rhode Island, is an intelligent and valuable member of the United States Senate. It so happened that, on his way up the political ladder, he quite naturally delivered an unending series of political speeches, and somehow gained the abilky and the reputation for at least some degree of old-fashioned political show-

manship in his platform behavior. So, Monday night, there was the good Senator Pastore struggling his way through a series of supposedly melodramatic roofbusting sentences. Viewers who disagreed with the commentators, and who thought the fuses were a little slow and the powder a little damp, and the whole performance a rather disheartening response to some of the disheartening developments at San Francisco can be pardoned their opinion. Far from being one of the best keynote speeches on record, it was probably one of the

In its preliminary procedures, then, the Democratic National Convention has demonstrated what might have been expected—that the Democrats are quite human and quite political and have not suddenly been elevated, by what may seem any special opportunity or opening in the year 1964, to any inspired and novel state of perfection. One doubts that they will, even in their more important business tonight, the coronation of Lyndon, really transcend the human and the political.

### How To Succeed And Quit

We were about to write that it was a rare hemisphere political story-that of a national leader who could easily be reelected declining the honor-and then we realized that it is a rare political story anywhere, not just among our supposedly backward and dictator-prone "good neighbors."

The leader in question is the famous Luis Munoz Marin, governor of Puerto Rico for the past 16 years, and presumably a shoo-in for a fifth term if he should choose to run again.

In that 16 years, he has been the great isong moving spirit in the most fasci-

nating demonstration of democracy building itself this hemisphere has been privileged to watch in our troubled cenury. The delegates to his party's convention, the other day, refused to believe it when he finally said openly what has been rumored—that he did not intend to accept another nomination. No one seems to leave office voluntarily in Latin America—there we go again—or

going to succeed in doing it. His party has nominated another man for governor. It has complied with his own wishes and nominated him for a seat in the Puerto Rican Senate. He intends, he told the convention, to stop being the executive and to resume being the teacher. He wants to go about his country talking about how it has come as far as it has, how it should face toward the good future it now seems likely to be able to claim through the practice and in the name of democracy.
